IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

For your protection, please read these safety instructions completely before operating the appliance, and keep this manual for future reference.

Carefully observe all warnings, precautions and instructions on the appliance and in the operating instructions, and adhere to them.

INSTALLATION -

Water and Moisture - Do not use powerling operated appliances near water - for example. near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.

Ventilation - The slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for necessary ventilation.To ensure reliable operation of the appleance, and to protect it from overheating, these slots and openings must never be blocked or cov - Never cover the slots and openings with a cloth or other materials.

Accessories -Do not place the appliance on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The appliance may fall, causing serious injury toa child or an adult, and serious damage to the



Never block the slots and openings by placing the appliance on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface



- An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



Heat - Do not place the appliance near or over a radiator or heat register, or where it is exposed to direct sunlight



Never place the appliance in aconfined space, such as a bookcase, or built-in cabinet, unless proper ventilation is provided.




USE -

Power Source - This appliance should be operated only from the type of powersource indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure

of the type of electrical power supplied to your home, consult your dealer or local power company For those appliances designed to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

Overloading - Do not overload wall outlets, extension cords or convenience receptacles

beyond their capacity, since this can result in fire or electric shock.



To disconnect the cord, pull it out by grasping the plug. Never pull the plug out by the cord.









Power-Cord Protection - Route the power cord so that it is not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to the plugs, receptacles, and the point where the cord exits from the appliance.



Lightning - For added protection for this appliance during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the appliance due to lightning and powerline strees.

Cleaning - Unplug the appliance from the wall outlet before cleaning or polishing it. Do notuse liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a cloth lightly dampened with water for cleaning the exterior of the appliance.



Object and Liquid Entry - Never push objects of any kind into the appliance through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in a fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on the appliance.



SERVICE

Damage Requiring Service-Unplug the appliance from the walloutlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

personnel under the following conditions: - When the powercord or plug is damaged or frayed.



- If liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the appliance.



- If the appliance has been exposed to rain or



- The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance. - This indicates a need for service.



- If the appliance does not operate normally when following the operating instructions, adjust only those controls that are specified in the operating instructions. Improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the appliance to normal operation.



- If the appliance has been subject to excessive shock by being dropped, or the cabinet has been damaged.



Servicing - Do not attemptto service the appliance yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.




FRONT PANEL & UPSIDE & UNDERSIDE ILLUSTRATION

Upside




- 1) POWER

REMOTE CONTROL


- When use, direct the remote control to the infra-red sensor (within 45 degrees)




This player allows you to customise the performance to your personal preferences.

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REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION

POWER

Press POWER to turn on the player after power adapter is connected

P/N

Press STOP key first then and press P/N to select "PAL" or "NTSC" system

PROG

Press PROG to get programme menu when reading DVD & VCD, then program your wanted songs. (DVD programme needs TITLE and MENU.)

SEARCH

During VCD playback, press SEARCH, and the menu will display as follow:



Use $\ensuremath{\Upsilon}\xspace + \ensuremath{\Phi}\xspace$ to select TIME, TRACK. Use the number keys to input the desired time or track, then press ENTER to confirm.

During DVD playback, $\,$ press SEARCH, and the menu will display as follow:



Use $\ensuremath{\Upsilon}\xspace$ to select TIME, TITLE or CHAPTER. Use the number keys to input the desired time, title or chapter, then press ENTER to confirm.

Note: 1) TIME searches for an exact time in the track.
2) TRACK searches for a desired title or chapter
3) For some DVD discs, the search function isunavailable.

SUBTITLE

During DVD playback, Press SUBT repeatedly to select from up to 4 subtitle languages.

Note: This function is disc specific (language will vary).

ANGLE

During DVD playback, Press ANGLE to view scenes from different camera angles. Press ANGLE to repeatedly to change from one camera angle to another. Note: This function is disc specific.

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SETUP

For the details, please refer to features setup.

REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION

UP & DOWN & LEFT & RIGHT (▼, ▲, ◄, ►)

Use to highlight selections on a menu screen. When playing JPEG files, press to rotate the picture.

ENTER

Press this button to confirm selection on a menu screen.

TITLE

During DVD playback, pressTITLE to display the DVD title menu or play the first title. Note: this function is subject to the disc.

MUTE

During playback, press this button to turn off the sound output. press it again to resume the sound output

F. REV & F. FWD (◀,►)

The player can fast forward and backword playback at X2;X4;X8;X16 of normal speed. Press PLAY to resume normal playback.

OSD

Press to display disc information such as disc type, elapsed time.

AUDIO

Press to change between different chanels.

NUMBER KEYS

To input the time, title, chapter and track numbers, then press ENTER to confirm.

ZOOM

Press this button to zoom the picture. Also, you can press cursor buttons to shift the picture.

CLEAR

Press CLEAR to delete numbers you have entered. Press once to delete one digit, press and hold to delete all digits.

REMOTE CONTROL OPERATION

MARK

MARK: During DVD, VCD, playback press the Button the menu will display as follow

Use \uparrow \downarrow to select the different bookwark

Press ENTER to input the current time.

If it has been input yet, the player will play from this time.

REPEAT

Each press of the REPEAT button will change the repeat mode.
During VCD, CD ,MP3 playback, there arethree modes:repeat Single, repeat All and Off.
During DVD, playback, there are three modes: Repeat Charpter, Repeat Title and Off.
Note:During VCD playback, the PCB mode must be set to Off

STOP

Press STOP once during playback to stop and hold playback.
Press PLAY to resume playback from the point you have pressed STOP.
Press STOP twice to stop playback completely.

MENU/PBC

When playing DVD disc, press this button to display ROOT MENU; When playing VCD/SVCD, press this button to select PBC ON/OFF.

PLAY/PAUSE

Press PAUSE during playback to pause playback.
Press again to step forward one frame
Press PLAY to resume normal palyback.
NOTE: the step function is not available during CD playback

VOL+ & VOL-

Press VOL + to enlarge the volume. Press VOL - to reduce the volume.

PREV & NEXT (₩,₩)

Press to SKIP to previous/next track or chapter during playback.

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Trouble Shooting

REMOTE CONTROL IS INSENSITIVE OR DOES NOT WORK

Check the batteries of remote control and make sure that they are to be powerful and good conductivity

Direct the remote control to the IR sensor of the player.

Check whether there are some obstacles between the remote control and $\ensuremath{\mathsf{IR}}$ sensor.

ABNORMAL FUNCTION OPERATION

Turn offthe power, and then turn on again.

Color System: PAL/NTSC

DISC IS LOCKED IN THE TRAY

Signal Output

The disc can not be taken out of the tray when the player is reading, so you have to turn off the power and turn on again, and press OPEN/CLOSE key immediately to open the tray
