DVD Recording: The Essentials

DVD recorders not only offer the basic recording and playback functions as the traditional VCRs (video casette recorders) do, but also make convenient content-sharing possible. Now you could play a finalized disc on other compatible DVD players as well as on PCs. The following sections introduce the basics of DVD recording, which may help you make the most of your recorder.

▶ What to Choose

Unlike the traditional VCR, DVD recorder comes with a wider variety of recordable media to choose from. Depending on different technologies employed, recordable DVD discs are divided into two major categories: the 'minus (-)' and 'plus (+)' formats. Within these two groups, discs are further classified by their 'rewritability'. Recordable (+R or -R) discs can be used for recording only once, which means that you will not be able to write anything into a section already used. Rewritable (+RW or -RW) discs, on the other hand, allow users to erase recordings and then to add new ones to the same section repeatedly.

► How to Record

Using DVDs to record is similar to what you do with videotapes, except that you may need to prepare your blank disc in a certain format. This formatting process varies depending on your recorder and the disc you use. To record, insert a suitable disc to the recorder, and select a recording mode if necessary. When preparation is done, press • RECORD on the unit or the remote control to start recording.

► How to Play

When the recording is finished, press ▶ PLAY to view the recorded programs or titles. A disc menu may appear: use ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ to select your desired program or title. If you would like to play the recordings on other DVD players or PCs, you need to finalize the disc first, unless you have used a DVD+RW disc.



Using Remote Control

Preparing the Remote Control

Open the battery compartment and insert the batteries. Make sure the polarities (+ and -) match the markings inside the remote control.



• Using rechargeable batteries is not recommended.

Remote Control Signal

The remote has an operating range of approximately 7 M, and works best when pointed directly at the unit horizontally at angle up to 30° from the sensor window of the DVD recorder.



Easier Application with Remote Control

Function buttons, such as **GUIDER** or **TIMER**, are designed to offer you a quick access to intended applications. Press these buttons to go directly to their individual menus and complete your desired tasks. If you would like to quit an application, simply press the designated button again.

Connecting up Your DVD Recorder

Before you start...

- I Do not plug the AC power cord into the outlet \cdot until all other connections are made.
- 2. OUT jack of the DVD recorder directly to the video input of your TV. Connecting VIDEO OUT jack of this recorder to a TV via a VCR may cause a viewing problem when playing a copy-protected disc. The same viewing problem may also occur when connecting the recorder to a TV/Video combo system.



Step 1: Connecting Antenna/Satellite Cables


- 1. Use an antenna cable to connect the RF IN jack on the DVD recorder to the antenna outlet on the wall.
- 2. Use an antenna cable to connect the RF OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the RF IN jack on the television. (Please note that this serves as a pass-through only.)



Step 2: Connecting the Video Cable


Option 1 Using SCART Cable

Use a SCART cable to connect the SCART OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the SCART IN jack on the television.



Option 2 Using Component Cable

Use a component video (with green, blue and red ends) cable to connect the COMPONENT OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the COMPONENT IN jack on the television.





• If your television supports 'Progressive Scan' mode, you may adjust the 'Video Output' setting accordingly for better results. Please go to **Setup** System Video Output, and select 'Progressive'. You can activate the Setup menu directly by pressing **SETUP** button on your remote control.

Step 3: Connecting the Audio Cable


Option 1 Connecting to a TV using SCART Cable

Use a SCART cable to connect the SCART OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the SCART IN jack on the television.



Option 2 Connecting to a Stereo Audio Amplifier or Receiver


Use the audio (red and white) ends of a composite cable to connect the AUDIO OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the AUDIO IN jack on a stereo amplifier or a receiver.



Option 3 Connecting to a Digital Audio Device


3.1 Using an Optical Cable

Use an optical cable to connect the DIGITAL OUT (OPTICAL) jack on the DVD recorder to the digital optical input on a stereo amplifier or a receiver.



3.2 Using a Coaxial Cable


Use a coaxial cable to connect the DIGITAL OUT (COAXIAL) jack on the DVD recorder to the coaxial digital input on a stereo amplifier or a receiver.



Step 4: Connecting the Decoder (If Required)

For PAY-TV/CANAL+ subscribers, you will need to connect an additional decoder to your TV and DVD recorder.

- Use an antenna cable to connect the RF IN jack on the DVD recorder to the antenna outlet on the wall.
- Use an antenna cable to connect the RF OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the RF IN jack on the television.
- 3. Use a SCART cable to connect the SCART IN jack on the DVD recorder to the SCART OUT jack on the CANAL+ decoder.
- 4. Use a SCART cable to connect the SCART OUT jack on the DVD recorder to the SCART IN jack on the television.


 During recording, if you have problem watching programs imported via decoder, you can press TV/MODE to switch to the 'SCART Bypass' mode. However, you need to first activate the feature through Setup TV Tuner TV MODE.

Setting TV MODE/SCART Bypass (p.26)

 Depending on the cable manufacturers, the SCART cable you use may not be able to detect all signals transferred via this connection. If you have activated the 'SCART Bypass' mode through the Setup menu, and still have problem using the feature, please try to use a new SCART cable to connect the decoder to your DVD recorder.

Step 5: Connecting the Power Cord

Connect the power cord to the DVD recorder. After all the cable connections are completed, you can now plug the power cord of the recorder into the outlet, and start using the recorder.




• If you would like to change the time display format (e.g. 19:00 or 07:00 P.M.), please make the adjustment through **Setup System Clock Format**.

Setting Video Output


P About 'Progressive Scan'

'Progressive Scan' mode differs from the 'Interlaced Scan' mode in how a video image is updated. In 'Progressive Scan' mode, scan lines for an image are refreshed in every pass and by a sequential order. In the 'Interlaced Scan' mode, image is updated by alternating sets of odd and even scan lines.

Interlaced Scan Mode



If you accidentally set 'Progressive' as the video output mode when the DVD recorder is not connected to a progressive-scan-compatible TV, you may lose the video signal on your TV instantly. To recover the problem, switch off the DVD recorder, and then switch it on again. After the DVD recorder is switched on, which takes about 30 seconds, press ▶ (right direction button), 5, 0, 2, 0, on remote control, then press ENTER. The recorder will then be automatically switched off. The DVD recorder's TV output will be restored to default when you switch on the recorder next time.



 - ♦ This category allows you to select your preferred audio channel when watching TV programs through the DVD recorder; however, your preference is applicable only when the selected audio channel is offered. Meanwhile, please note that the setting will also determine which audio channel to be recorded for your designated TV programs. For bilingual programs, only one language version will be recorded. Always select 'SAP (Sub)', if you would like to record the second language channel.
- 7 If you would like to change the audio output mode for the MPEG files, press ▲ ▼ to select 'MPEG', then press ENTER.
 - ◆ Select 'PCM' when your amplifier does not have an integrated Dolby Digital decoder.
 - Select 'Bit Stream' when your amplifier has an integrated Dolby Digital decoder.

Aspect ratio setting affects how video images are presented. Select 4:3 (normal) or 16:9 (widescreen) mode which suits your television.




As channel numbers may vary depending on where you live, it is suggested that you build up a matching channel list when you first set up the DVD recorder. This step will help you to make use of the ShowView® system for future timer recording settings.

Note

Additional Information for units sold in the UK.

Units sold in the UK are suitable for operation from a 240V ac, 50Hz mains supply.

The range of multi-system receivers is built to work in most European countries. However, the mains plug and socket system for the UK differs from many European countries.

This appliance has been supplied with a fitted, non-removable, approved converter plug for use in the UK. This converter plug is fitted with a 5A rated fuse.

In case this appliance is supplied with a moulded 2-pin Euro plug only, which is unsuitable for UK operation, this must be cut off and immediately disposed of. An approved 13A, 3-pin UK plug should then be fitted by a qualified electrician.

Note:

The severed Euro plug must be destroyed to avoid a possible shock hazard should it be inserted into a socket elsewhere.

If a non-rewireable 3-pin plug or a rewireable 13A (BS1363) 3-pin plug is used, it must be fitted with a 5A ASTA or BSI approved BS1362 fuse. If any other type of plug is used it must be protected by a 5A fuse either in the plug, or at the distribution board. If this type of plug becomes defective, ensure that the fuse is removed before disposal, to eliminate potential shock hazard.

If it is necessary to change the fuse in the non-rewireable plug, the correct type and rating (5A ASTA or BSI approved BS1362) must be used and the fuse cover must be refitted. If the fuse cover is lost or damaged, the lead and plug must not be used until a replacement is obtained. Replacement fuse covers should be obtained from your dealer.

Important:

The wires in the mains lead are colour coded in accordance with the following code:

BLUE-NEUTRAL

BROWN - LIVE

As the colours of the wires in the mains lead of your appliance may not correspond with the coloured marking identifying terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

Connect the BLUE coloured wire to plug terminal marked with the letter "N" or coloured black.

Connect the BROWN coloured wire to the plug terminal marked with the letter "L" or coloured red.

In no circumstance must any of the wires be connected to the terminal marked with the letter "E", earth symbol "h", coloured green, or green & yellow.

576i indicates 576 scanning lines with interlace format, and 576p indicates 576 scanning lines with progressive format.

Aspect Ratio

Aspect ratio refers to the length to height ratio of TV screens. The ratio of a standard TV is 4:3, while the ratio of a high-definition or wide TV is 16:9. The letter box allows you to enjoy a picture with a wider perspective.

Bit Stream

The digital form of multi-channel audio data (e.g., 5.1-channel) before it is decoded into its various channels

Chapter / Title

Chapter is the smallest division and title is the largest division on a DVD VIDEO. A chapter is a division of a title and similar to a track for Video CD or Audio CD.

Component Video

Video signals with three channels of separate information that makes up the picture. There are some types of component video, such as R/G/B and Y/Cb(Pb)/Cr(Pr).

Composite Video

A single video signal commonly used in most consumer video products that contains all luminance, color, and synchronization information.

DivX® VOD

DivX® VOD (video-on-demand) service is designed to protect copyrights of digital videos. Through an online registration process, DivX® VOD prevents unauthorized downloads or file sharing. For more information, please visit: http://www.divx.com/vod.

Dolby Digital®

A six-channel system consisting of left, center, right, left rear, right rear and LFE (Low-Frequency Effect channel, for use with a sub-woofer) channels. It requires a Dolby Digital® decoder, either in the player or in an external receiver to regenerate the sound. All processing is done in the digital domain. Not all Dolby Digital discs contain six (5.1) channels of information.

DTS® (Digital Theater Systems)

DTS® stands for Digital Theater Systems. DTS® is a Digital Surround audio encoding format configured with six (5.1) channels, similar to Dolby Digital®. It requires a DTS® decoder, either in the player or in an external receiver to regenerate the sound. All processing is done in the digital domain. Not all DTS discs contain six (5.1) channels of information.

DVD-R

DVD-R is a recordable disc that is the same size as a DVD-Video. Contents can be recorded only once to a DVD-R, and will have the same format as a DVD-Video.

DVD-RW

DVD-RW is a recordable and rewritable disc that is the same size as a DVD-Video. DVD-RW has two different modes: VR mode and Video mode. DVD created in video mode has the same format as a DVD-Video ,while discs created in VR (Video Recording) mode allow the contents to be programmed or edited

DVD+R

DVD+R is a recordable disc that is the same size as a DVD-Video. Contents can be recorded only once to a DVD+R, and will have the same format as a DVD-Video.

DVD+RW

DVD+RW is a recordable and rewritable disc. Recording can be erased and you can record on the same disc again for the maximum of 1,000 times. DVD+RW use a recording format that is comparable to a DVD-Video format.

Interlace Output

NTSC, the video signal standard, has 480 interlaced (I) scan lines, The Interlaced scanning system places lines of the second half of the picture in-between lines of the first half of the picture.

JPEG

A popular file format for still image compression and storage. JPEG stands for 'Joint Photographic Experts Group' There are two sub-types of the JPEG format as follows.

Baseline JPEG: used for digital cameras, the web, etc.

Lossless JPEG: an old type, rarely used now.

Linear PCM Audio

PCM stands for 'Pulse Code Modulation'. Linear PCM is the usual method for digitally encoding audio without compression, and is used for the audio tracks on DVD VIDEO discs, Audio CDs, etc.

MP3

MP3 (MPEG1 audio layer 3) is a compressed audio file format. Files are recognized by their file extension .mp3 or .MP3.

MPEG

MPEG stands for 'Motion Picture Experts Group'. This is an international standard for compression of moving images. On some DVDs, digital audio has been compressed and recorded in this format.

NTSC

(National Television System Committee)

The initials stand for National Television Standards Committee. This is the committee that established the standards for television systems in the United States. The NTSC standard broadcasts 525 or 480 lines of resolution per second, and 30 frames per second of refresh rate, 60 Hz field frequency. NTSC TV system is widely used in USA, Canada, Latin America and Taiwan etc.

PAL (Phase Alternation by Line)

PAL (Phase Alteration Line) is the color television broadcast standard throughout the Western Europe (except in France, where SECAM is the standard), Australia, China, Singapore and Malaysia etc. It has 625 lines of vertical resolution per second and 25 frames per second refresh rate, 50 Hz field frequency.

PBC

Playback Control. A special feature on a Video CD or Super VCD that enables interactive use.

S-Video

A video signal which improves picture quality over standard composite connections. Used on Super VHS, DVD, high end TV monitors, etc.

Track

SVCD, VCD, Audio CD discs use tracks to divide up the content of a disc.

WMA

WMA stands for 'Windows Media Audio', an audio codec standard proposed by Microsoft. Music/audio files which are compressed using this standard come with the file extension, .wma or .WMA.
