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



INTRODUCTION

Remote Control



- Remove the battery compartment cover.
- Load two AAA (UM-4 or R03) batteries into the battery compartment.
- Make sure that the batteries have been inserted in the correct polarities matching to the symbols +, - marked in the battery compartment. Close the battery compartment cover.
- When replacing batteries, replace both batteries.
 Do not mix new and used batteries operating together, otherwise, the operation lifetime will be much shorter than normal.
- Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a prolonged period of time.

The remote control transmits a directional infrared beam. Be sure to aim the remote control directly at the infrared sensor of the unit during operation.

If the sensor has been covered or there is a large object between the remote control and the sensor, the sensor will not respond.

The sensor may not able to receive the remote signal when it is exposed to direct sunlight or a strong artificial light (fluorescent or strobe light). In this case, change the direction of the light or reposition the unit to avoid direct lighting.



As not all programmes will transmit ADyou will need tocheck with your TV programmeguide that it isbeing transmitted. Pressing the AUDIObutton repeatedly will toggle ENGLISH (normalaudio) and ENGLISH AD (Audio description). WhenAD is selected andAD is being transmitted thenormal audio is replaced by a narrative of whatis being shown on the TV.


SYSTEM CONNECTION

Note: Scart and RF cables are supplied for basic connections to your TV. Other cables shown are not supplied and may be purchased from most HIFI/ TV Retail outlets.


Connecting to TV using Scart

Switching on for the First Time

Turn on your TVset and select the corresponding AV input (with the AV key, or simular, on the television remote control).

Turn on the mainpower supply to the STB, the indicator on the front of the unit will turn redand then blue. Instandby mode, the indicator light will be red. In working mode, the indicator lightwill be blue.





- If you use the STB for the first time or have deleted all channels in the STB, a "TV Setting" menudisplays.
- Press "LEFT" or "RIGHT"cursor button to chooseeither "16:9" or "4:3" according to the TVshape you have..
- Make sure that theTV aerial is connected to the unit then, press "OK" button to continue installation.
- Press "LEFT" or "RIGHT" cursor button to highlight "confirm".
- Press "OK" button tocontinue. "Scan Progress" menu will appear and list the channels asthey are found. Abar appears below the listing panel that indicates the progress of the channel search.
- When all channels havebeen found, the channelat the top of the list will show on the TV.

OPERATION

Changing Channels

There are four waysof channel selection -stepping through the channellist, selection by number, from the on-screen channel list, and using the EPG

(1) Stepping through the channellist:

Press the "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to browse up and browse down the available channels.

2) Selection by number:

Enter the complete channel number directly by remote control to select desired channel.

(3) Selection by on-screen channels list:

You can also selectthe desired channel directlyfrom on-screen channel list. This is displayed using the STB's mainmenu. Please See "CHANNEL LIST" in this manual for the operation detail.

Selection by setting a Reminder in the EPG (Electronic Programme Guide): You can also select the desired channel directly from EPG. This is displayed by pressing the "EPG" button on theremote control. The EPG provides abrief description of the programme on the currently selected channel and lists the current channels.





 Press "EXIT" button to quit the EPG and view the channel on full screen.

Setting a Reminder

From the EPG, you can change channels, check programme information, access one-week programme schedulewhich details the times and programmes for the nextseven days and seta reminder for 8 programmes to automatically view at

- ① Press the "EPG" button to enter the Channel Schedule.
- ② Press "UP " or "DOWN" cursor button to preview the current programme on the selected channel, and check the current programme information.
- ③ Press "LEFT" or "RIGHT" cursorbutton to navigate the program lists in next seven days.
- 4) Press "UP "or "DOWN" cursor button to highlight the desired programme.
- ⑤ Press "OK" button toadd the reminder, then will appear alongside the selected programme. When thereminder programme is aboutto start, a reminder window will appear.
- Press "EXIT" button to quit the channel schedule.

CHANNEL LIST







Channel List

The Channel List presents a list of all channels found during the channel search. From the Channel List you can watchand listen to the selected channels, delete them from the list, edit thename of the channel, set a password to access the channel.

- ① Press "MENU" button to enter the main menu of the STB.
- (2) Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor buttonto highlight



- ③ Press "OK" buttonto enter Channel Listmenu.
- (4) Press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to highlight a channel.
- ⑤ Press "OK" button to preview the selected channel.
- Press "EXIT" button to quit the channel listmenu and view the channel on full screen.

Delete a channel:

- ① Enter the channel listmenu, press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select a channel.
- ② Press the YELLOW buttonto delete the selected channel, The channel is permanently removed and canonly be restored by rescanning the channels..

Lock/Unlock a channel:

- ① Enter the channel listmenu, press "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select your desired channel.
- (2) Press the BLUE button, you are asked to enter pin code.
- ③ Enter a correct pincode using the numeric buttons, press "OK" button to confirm. (the default pin code is 888888)
- ④ Then a lock symbol displays alongside the selected channel, it shows that the channel has been locked.
- ⑤ Repeat(1)(2)(3) to remove the lock symbol.
- Press "EXIT" button to quit the channellist.



FAVOURITE LIST

Favourite List

This menu allows youto store a list of your favourite channels. So that you can access them more easily. There are five favourite lists to set, each family member can have their own favourite list.

Adding channels to Favouritelist:

- 1) Press the "MENU" button to enter the mainmenu of the STB.
- ② Press the "UP" or "DOWN" cursor button to select
- ③ Press the "OK" buttonto enter the favouritelist menu.④ Press the RED buttonto switch the desiredfavourite list.
