

- Select Input Block to block desired input sources.
- · Set Auto Power Off to either On or Off.







### Dissembling the stand base


- 1 Disconnect all the cables and cords from the TV to prevent breakage.
- 2 Carefully place the TV face down on a soft and flat surface (blanket, foam, cloth, etc) to prevent any damage to the TV.
- 3 Remove the screws so that the stand base can be removed.
- 4 Gently remove the stand base.
