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## 1.2 Introducing the TV

You can watch PAL/SECAM broadcast or cable television channels, and easily connect a VCR, STB or DVD player to the standard CVBS, S-Video and SCART input ports (location of these ports depends on model). You can also use the TV as a monitor for your PC by connecting it through the D-sub port.

Convenient control buttons located on the TV and a handy remote control let you change channels, adjust the volume, and change display settings through an easy-to-use on-screen display menu system. The built-in stereo speakers provide full rich sound and a convenient audio output port lets you connect to an external audio system or earphones.

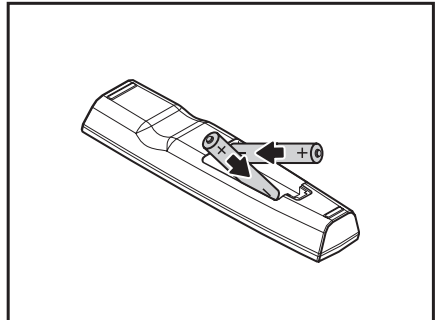
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## 1.2.6 Inserting the Remote Control Batteries

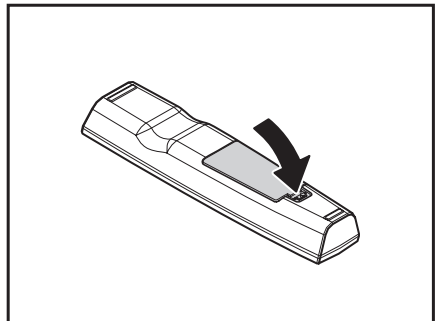
- 1 Open the battery compartment cover at the back of the remote control.



- 2 Insert the batteries paying attention to the polarity markings inside the battery compartment.



- 3 Replace the battery compartment cover.

# CAUTION



- If the remote control is not used for a long period, remove the batteries and store them properly.
- Handle damaged or leaking batteries carefully, and wash hands with soap if they come in contact with leaked chemical fluids.
- If your remote control has two batteries, do not mix new and old batteries or the life of the new batteries will be shortened. Chemical fluids may leak from the old batteries.

### 2.1 Basic Connections

The following sections provide users with some basic instructions to use the TV. Please read them carefully before you start utilizing the functions.

#### 2.1.1 Connecting the Power Cord and Turning On

- 1 Connect the power cord to AC IN input jack on the rear panel of the TV.
- 2 Insert the plug at the other end of the power cord into a power outlet.
- 3 Move the Main Power Switch to the ON position to supply power to the TV.

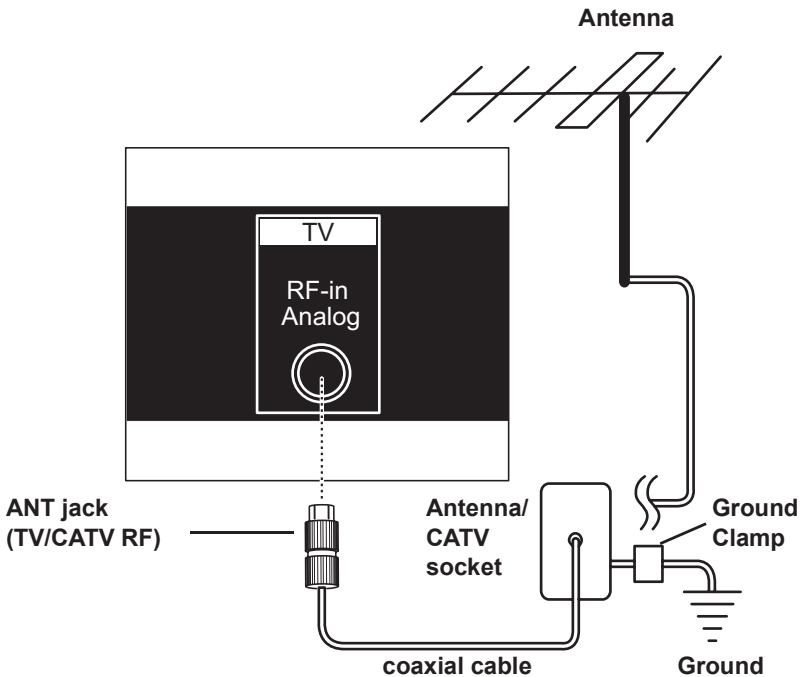
**Note:**

**If the TV is not going to be used for a long period, turn off the main power switch.**

## 2.1.2 Connecting an Antenna or Cable TV

- 1 Connect one end of the VHF/UHF (Antenna) or CATV cable to ANT Jack (RF-in Analog) on the back of the TV.
- 2 Connect the other end of the VHF/UHF (Antenna) or CATV cable to the antenna socket or CATV socket.



### Note:

If you cannot receive channels after connecting to an antenna or cable TV line, try scanning for channels. See "Auto Search" on page 71.

## 2.2 Connecting External Devices

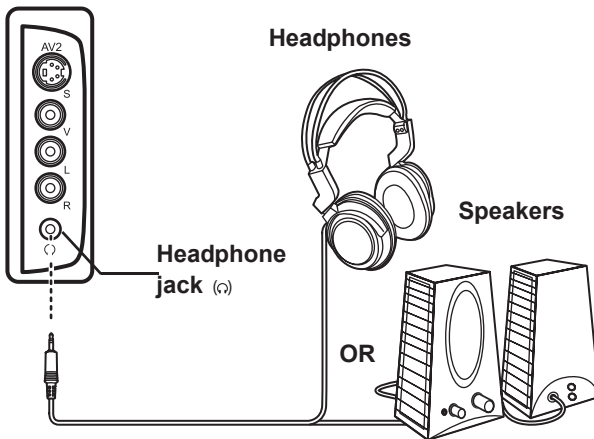
Connect external devices such as VCRs, STBs, or DVD players to the TV using the AV1, AV2, AV3, AV4 and AV5 ports on the back or side of the TV.

**Note:**

**AV5 is for AP market only.**

### 2.2.1 Connecting External Earphones

External earphones may be used to listen to the TV rather than using the built-in speakers. Connect external headphones to the earphone line out port as illustrated.

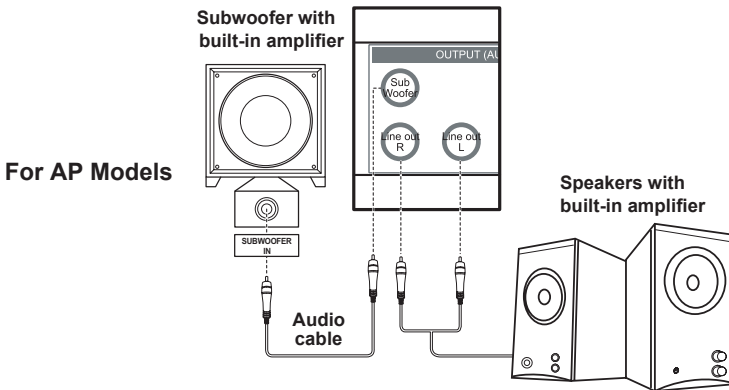
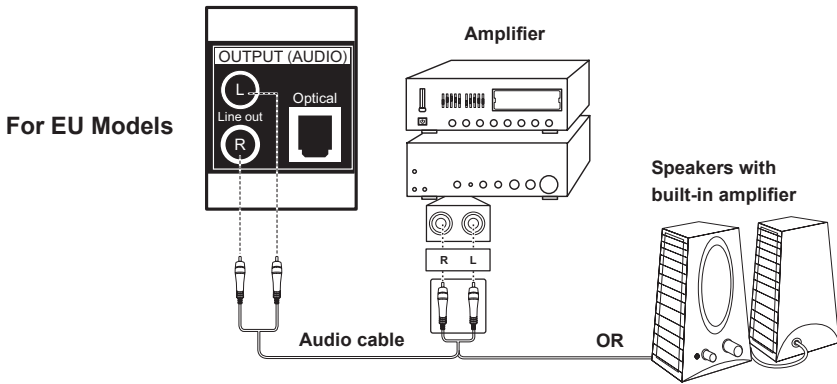
- External earphones are not included with the TV.
- The built-in TV speakers do not output sound when earphones are plugged in.

## 2.2.2 Connecting an Amplifier Using Analog Audio

Connect an external amplifier or speakers to the line out port to provide better sound quality. Refer to the following illustration.

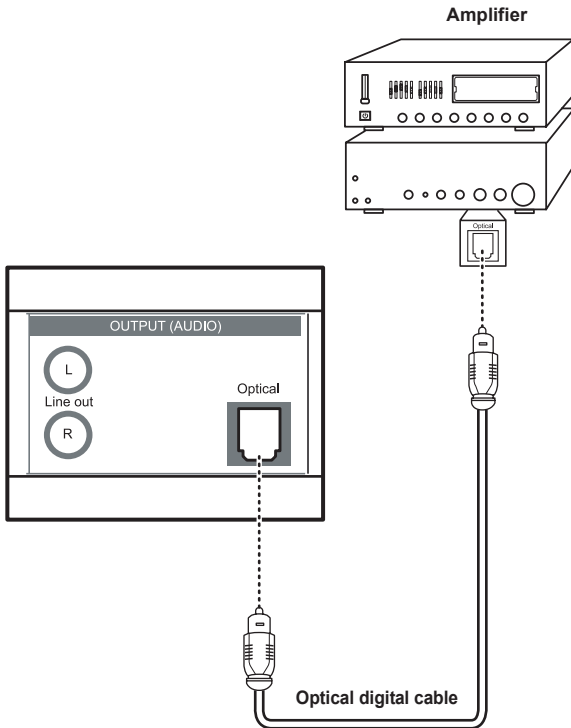

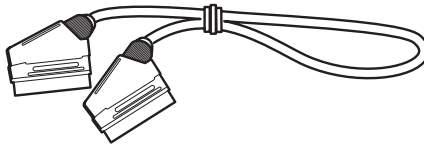

## 2.2.4 Connecting a Decoder/VCR/Recorder or DVD Player Using SCART (EU models only)

Use the SCART provided to connect a TV to a VCR, Recorder, DVD player or Decoder. Refer to the diagrams on the following page when reading the following instructions.

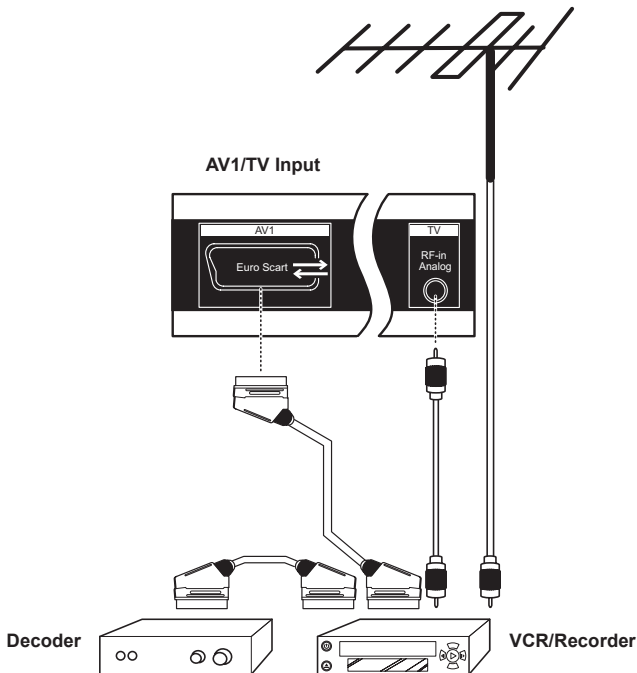

## 1. Connecting a VCR or Recorder:

- Connect the antenna cable to the TV input on the VCR/Recorder.
- Connect an output cable to the TV output on the VCR/Recorder and to the TV input at the back of the TV.
- Connect the SCART cable to the AV1 or AV3 input at the back of the TV and to the VCR/Recorder SCART connector. It is preferable with RGB output to AV1 as RGB provides better picture quality.
- Connect the decoder and recorder by SCART cable.



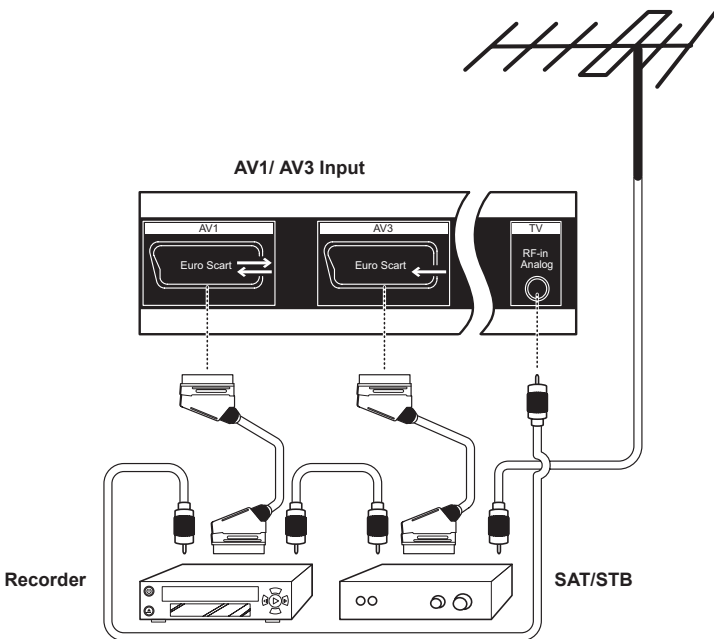
### Note:

The output function of AV3 is available only for selected models.

## 2. Connecting a SAT/STB:

- Connect the antenna cable to the SAT/STB.
- Connect the aerial cable from the SAT/STB TV out to the recorder TV in.
- Connect the aerial cable from the recorder TV out to the RF-in of the TV.
- Connect the SAT/STB to AV3 (or AV1) by SCART cable.
- Connect the recorder to AV1 (or AV3 for models with output function available) by SCART cable.



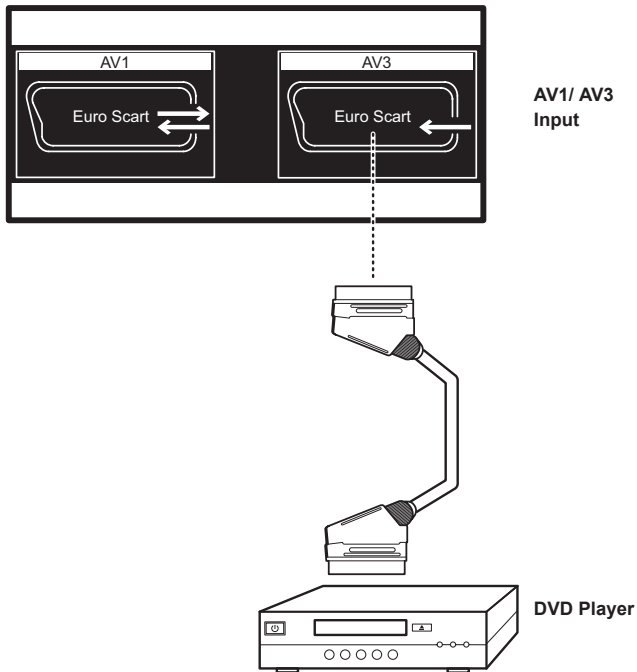
### Note:

For models with AV3 output function, it is recommended to swap the AV1/AV3 connection shown in the illustration.

### 3. Connecting a DVD Player:

- Connect the SCART cable to the AV1 or AV3 input at the back of the TV and to the SCART connector on the DVD player. It is preferable to connect peripherals with RGB output to AV1 as RGB provides a better picture quality.

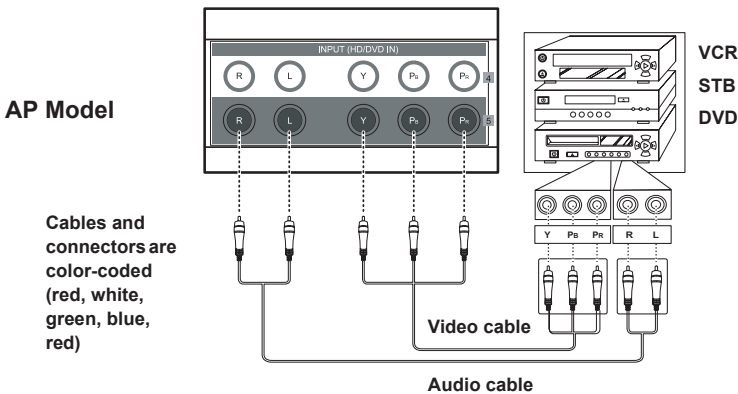
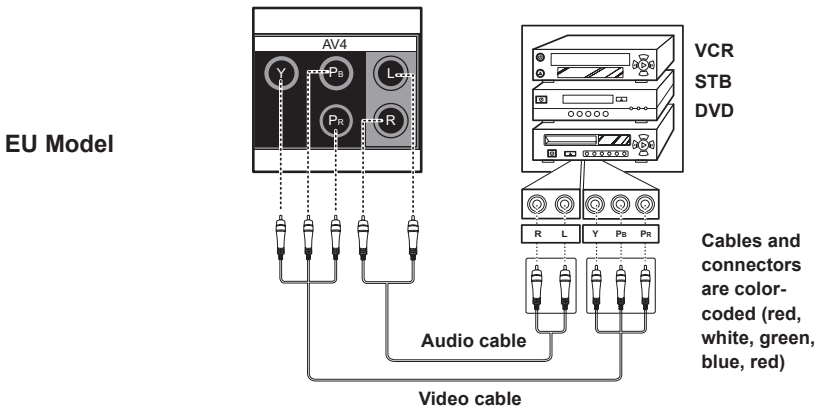

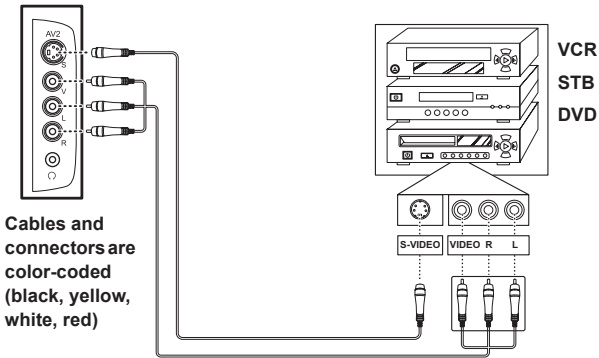

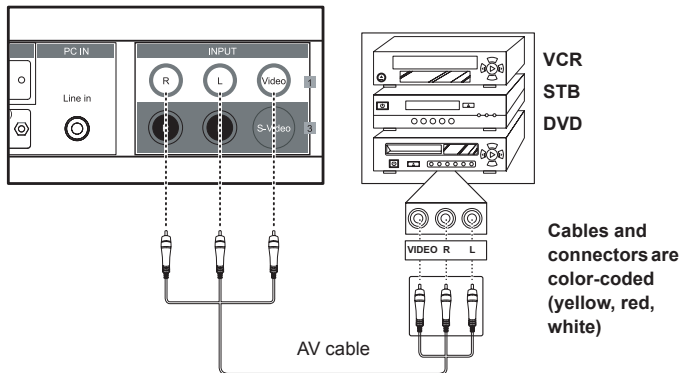

**AP Model**

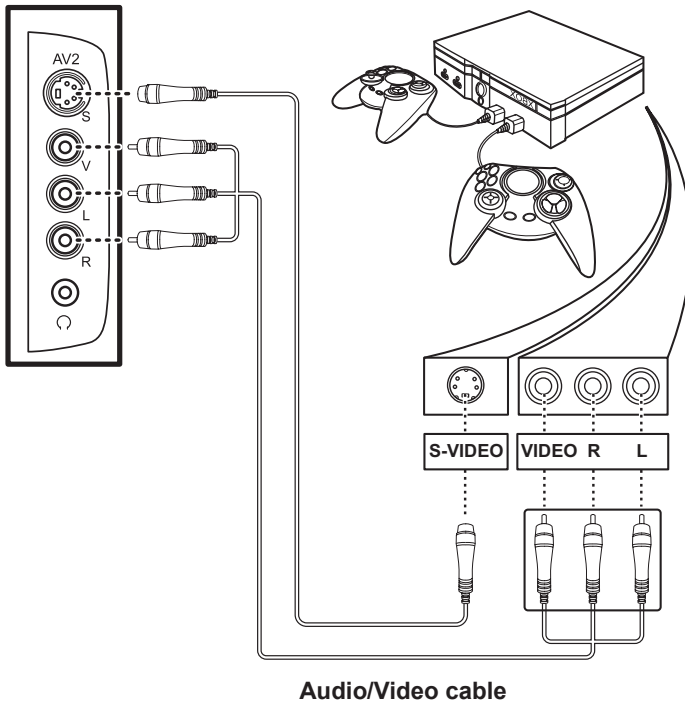




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## 2.2.7 Connecting a Video Game Console

The following illustration shows how to connect the TV to a video game console using the AV2 port. Actual connections may vary according to the make and model of your device.



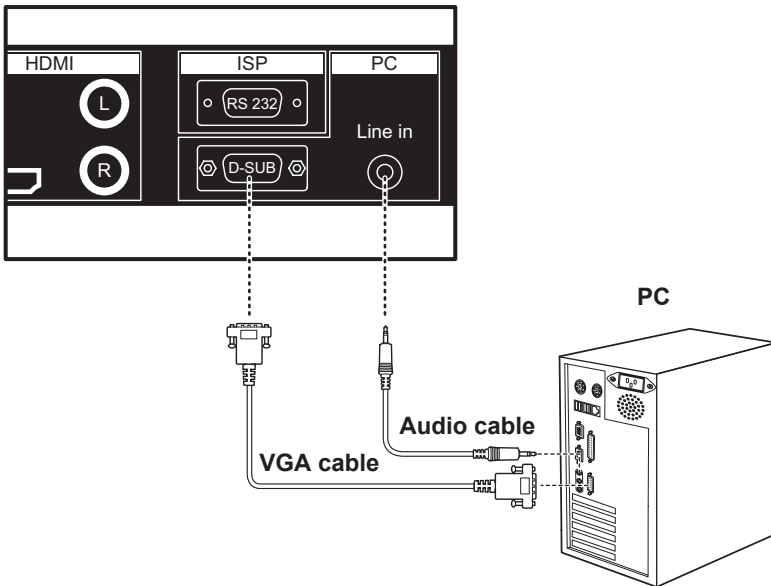

- When connecting the S-Video connector and AV connector at the same time, the priority is given to the S-Video connector.
- Location of the connectors varies according to the TV model. For more information, please refer to the manufacturer's user manual or the Quick Start Guide of your TV model.

## 2.2.8 Connecting a PC

Connect the TV to your PC to use it as the monitor using the D-Sub port as shown. Connect the D-Sub port of the TV to the D-Sub output of the PC. Connect the line out port of the PC to the line in port of your TV to listen to audio from the PC.

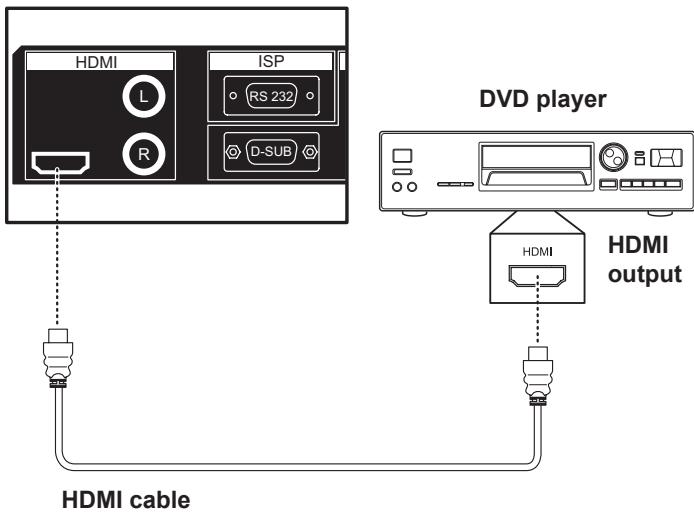
- Location of the connectors varies according to the TV model.
- For more information, please refer to the manufacturer's user manual or the Quick Start Guide of your TV model.

## 2.2.9 Connecting HDMI

HDMI (High Definition Multimedia Interface) with HDCP (High Definition Copy Protection) assures that the best video signal is always sent from source (HDTV signal, DVD player) to the TV.

Refer to the following illustration to connect an HDMI device to the TV.



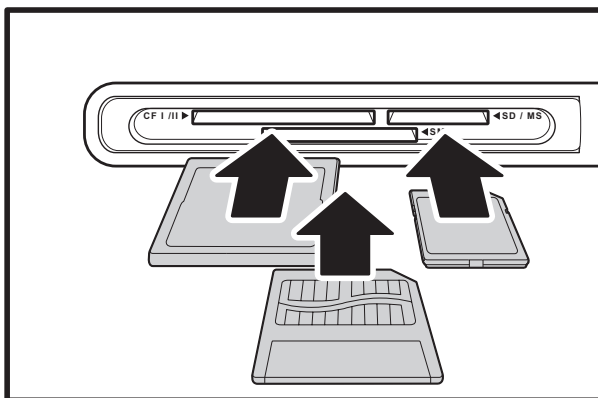
### Notes:

- When the HDMI cable is connected, connecting the audio cable is not necessary. However, it is necessary to do so if a HDMI-DVI-D cable is connected.

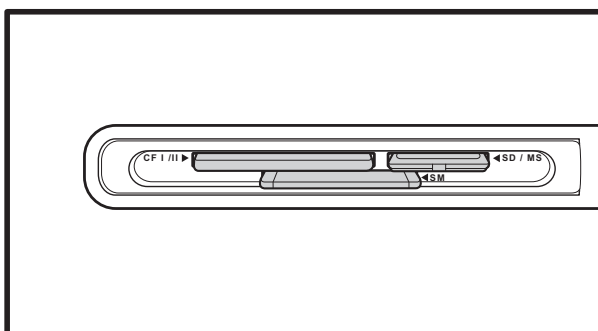

## 2.3 Inserting a Memory Card (For built-in E-Card only)

- 1 Insert the memory card(s) into the appropriate card reader slot(s) on the control panel of the TV as shown.



- 2 Push the card(s) gently until they stop. Make sure the card(s) are inserted in the correct way.
- 3 When inserted, the memory card(s) will protrude as shown.



- 4 To remove a card, pull it from the card slot.

---

**Notes:**

- To prevent data loss, end tasks that retrieve data from the memory card before removing it from the card slot.
- Use only certified memory cards.
- Supports memory cards with a capacity of up to 1GB.
- Flash Card related functions and file names are only shown in English.
- Be careful when removing memory cards; removing them too quickly may result in damage to the card and possible data loss.

## 2.4 Using the TV


### 2.4.1 Using the Remote Control


For best results, use the remote control within a proper distance from the front of the TV. Do not exceed an angle of 30 degrees when pointing at the TV.

**Notes:**

- The operational distance may be shortened when the signal sensor is directly exposed to strong light.
- Aim the transmitter on the remote control at the signal sensor and ensure that there are no obstacles between them.

### 2.4.2 Turning the TV On and Off

1 Press  **Power** on the remote control or **POWER** on the control panel. The power LED indicator on the front of the TV changes from red to green, indicating that the power is on.

2 Press  **Power** or **POWER** again. The power LED changes from green to red, indicating that the TV is off.

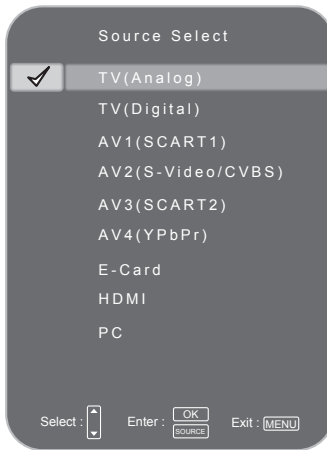
### 2.4.3 Selecting Channels

- Press **CH▲** / **P▲** on the remote control or **CH▲** on the control panel to increase the channel number by one. Press **CH▼** / **P▼** or **CH▼** to decrease the channel number by one.
- Enter the specific channel number by pressing the number buttons on the remote control. The channel number is displayed on the screen.

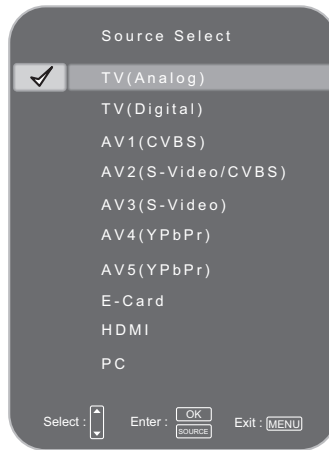

## 2.4.4 Switching Source Signals

Press **SOURCE** on the control panel or **Source** on the remote control to select the incoming source signal. A screen appears with all sources listed. (Some of the sources are available only for selected models.)

- 1 Press **▲ / ▼, CH▲ / CH▼** or **P▲ / P▼** on the remote control or **CH▲** or **CH▼** on the control panel to select the source you wish to use.
- 2 Press **OK** on the remote control or **SOURCE** on the control panel to confirm the setting.
- 3 Press **Menu** on the remote control or **MENU** on the control panel to exit.

## 2.4.5 Adjusting the Volume

- 1 Press **VOL+** to increase the volume.
- 2 Press **VOL-** to decrease the volume.
- 3 Press **Mute** to eliminate sound. A mute icon appears on the top left corner of the screen and sound is turned off.
- 4 Press **Mute** again or press the volume buttons to restore the original volume.




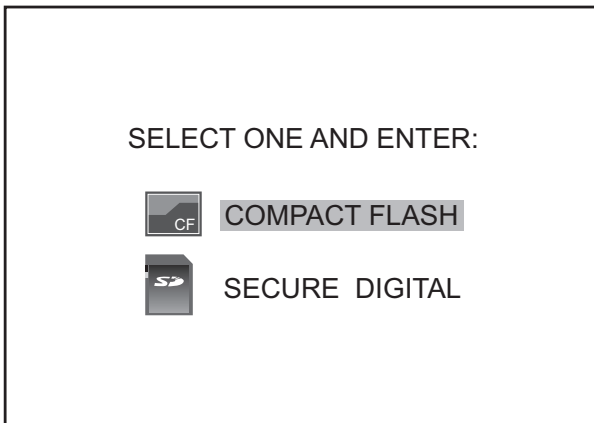

## 2.5 Using the E-Card Function (For built-in E-Card only)

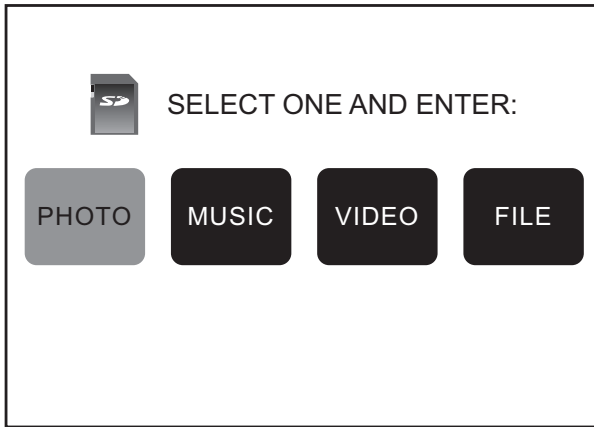
The E-Card function enables you to view photos, watch movies, and listen to MP3 files on the memory card inserted in the card slot. The device supports Compact Flash (CF), Micro drive (MD), Smart Media (SM), Secure Digital (SD), Multi Media Card (MMC), and Memory Stick (MS-Pro) cards. Use the E-Card mode to view the contents.

The following describes the E-Card function:

- 1 Insert a memory card into the appropriate card slot. Refer to “Inserting a Memory Card (For built-in E-Card only)” on page 43.
- 2 Press **Source** on the remote control to display all available sources. Use the **▲ / ▼** button on the remote control to switch source to E-Card.
- 3 If more than one memory card is inserted to the card slots, a screen displaying the inserted cards is displayed. Use the **▲ / ▼** button on the remote control to select the memory card and press **OK**  to view the contents.

- 4 The E-Card main screen appears. You can choose to view photos, listen to music, watch videos, or look at the contents of the memory card.

- 1 When the E-Card main screen appears, use the ◀ / ▶ button on the remote control to select PHOTO.

- 4 Press **OK**  to expand the selected thumbnail to full screen mode.

## ***Zooming and Panning***


The E-Card function enables you to zoom in on images and pan the view. Follow these instructions.

- 1** View an image in full screen mode as described in the previous section.
- 2** Press  on the remote control to zoom in on the image. (Magnification varies by input format).

When zooming in on an image, press the  /  /  /  button on the remote control to pan the image.

## ***Rotating Images***

Follow these instructions to rotate images when in Photo mode.

- 1** View an image in full screen mode as described in the previous section.
- 2** Press  on the remote control.
- 3** The image is rotated 90 degrees (90°) in a clockwise direction.




**Note:**

**You cannot rotate an image when the image is being zoomed.**

## Viewing a Slide Show

The E-Card function has a slide show feature that enables you to view all the images by order.

- 1** Press **Last**  
Slideshow on the remote control to start the slide show.  
The files are viewed sequentially, and files in your music library are also played in sequence.

**Broadcast TV:** Broadcasting video signals using high-frequency electromagnetic waves to distribute television channels to viewers (standard TV broadcast).

**CATV:** Community Antenna Television, the original name for cable TV. A television distribution system that uses coaxial cable instead of the traditional radio broadcasting (over-the-air) method to deliver television, FM radio, and other services to consumers.

**Color Temperature:** Adjusting the color temperature enables you to set the intensity of white light. Color temperature is measured in Kelvin (K). Higher color temperatures result in a blue tint. Lower temperatures result in a red tint.

**Hue:** Colors in a color system are measured by hue, saturation and luminance. Hue indicates the predominant color.

**LCD (Liquid Crystal Display):** A display technology that uses rod-shaped molecules (liquid crystals) that flow like liquid and bend light.

**Saturation:** Chromatic purity indicating the amount of white contained in a color. Fully saturated colors are pure colors; less saturated colors appear as pastel shades.

**Stereo:** The default audio signal belonging to a particular channel.

**S-Video:** Separate video, a video cabling standard used to transmit video by keeping brightness (Y) and color information (C) on separate channels. Most often used with camcorders.
