Important - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating and keep for future reference.

These instructions contain important information which will help you get the best from your television and ensure safe and correct installation and operation.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

Before operating the TV, please read this instruction book thoroughly.

This instruction manual will guide you in the correct operation of your TV.

Keep this instruction manual in a safe place for future reference.

Note especially the chapter on SAFETY PRECAUTIONS.

When selling or giving away the TV, please also supply this instruction manual.

Mains supply

This television is designed to operate from a 220-240 Volts 50Hz AC mains supply. Other power sources may damage it. Check that the rating (On the back of the unit) states 220-240V AC before you plug it in for the first time.

Symbols



Dangerous voltage constituting a risk of electric shock is present inside this equipment.



There are important operating and maintenance instructions in the literature accompanying this equipment.



This mark is applied to show the equipment conforms to European safety and electro-magnetic compatibility standards.

SOME DOS AND DON'TS ON THE SAFE USE OF EQUIPMENT

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken if you are to obtain the best results and safety is to be assured.

- DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.
- DO ensure that all electrical connections (including the mains plug, extension leads and inter-connections between the pieces of equipment) are properly made and in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Switch off and withdraw the mains plug before making or changing connections.
- DO consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your equipment.
- DO be careful with glass panels or doors on equipment.
- **DO** route the mains lead so that it is not likely to be walked on, crushed, chafed, or subjected to excessive wear and tear or heat.

- DON'T remove any fixed cover as this may expose dangerous voltages.
- DON'T obstruct the ventilation openings of the equipment with items such as newspapers, tablecloths, curtains, etc. Overheating will cause damage and shorten the life of the equipment.
- **DON'T** allow electrical equipment to be exposed to dripping or splashing, or objects filled with liquids, such as vases, to be placed on the equipment.
- **DON'T** place hot objects or naked flame sources such as lighted candles or nightlights on, or close to equipment. High temperatures can melt plastic and lead to fires.

- DON'T use makeshift stands and NEVER fix legs with wood screws to ensure complete safety always fit the manufacturer's approved stand or legs with the fixings provided according to the instructions.
- **DON'T** use equipment such as personal stereos or radios so that you are distracted from the requirements of traffic safety. It is illegal to watch television whilst driving.
- **DON'T** listen to headphones at high volume, as such use can permanently damage your hearing.
- **DON'T** leave equipment switched on when it is unattended unless it is specifically stated that it is designed for unattended operation or has a stand-by mode. Switch off using the switch on the equipment and make sure that your family know how to do this. Special arrangements may need to be made for infirm or handicapped people.
- **DON'T** continue to operate the equipment if you are in any doubt about it working normally, or if it is damaged in any way switch off, withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

ABOVE ALL

- --- NEVER let anyone especially children push anything into holes, slots or any other opening in the case this could result in a fatal electrical shock;
- --- NEVER guess or take chances with electrical equipment of any kind
- --- it is better to be safe than sorry!

Power cord and plug

Do not place the set, a piece of furniture, etc. on the power cord (mains lead) or pinch the cord. Handle the power cord by the plug. Do not unplug the appliance by pulling from the power cord and never touch the power cord with wet hands as this could cause a short circuit or electric shock. Never make a knot in the cord or tie it with other cords. The power cords should be placed in such a way that they are not likely to be stepped on. A damaged power cord can cause fire or give you an electric shock. When it is damaged and needs to be replaced, it should be done by qualified personnel.

The mains plug must not be cut off, as it may contain a special radio interference filter, the removal of which could lead to impaired performance. If you wish to extend the lead, obtain an appropriate safety approved extension lead or consult your dealer.

Observe the manufacturers instructions when connecting extension leads to the set. Check the fuse rating on the new plug; this should be fitted with a 5 Amp fuse which conforms to either ASTA or BSI (BS1362) approvals, these are easily identifiable by either the ⊕ or ♥ symbols. If you are in any doubt about the installation of an extension lead, please consult a competent electrician.

Moisture and water

Do not use this device in a humid and damp place (avoid the bathroom, the sink in the kitchen, and near the washing machine). Do not expose this device to rain or water, as this may be dangerous and do not place objects filled with liquids, such as flower vases, on top. Avoid from dripping or splashing.



If any solid object or liquid falls into the cabinet, unplug the TV and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

Ventilation

Place the television on a hard flat surface away from direct sunlight and heat sources. If it is in a cabinet, allow at least a 10cm gap all around. Don't obstruct the ventilation slots, including those underneath, with soft furnishings. Overheating will shorten the life of the television and increase the risk of fire.

Cleaning

Disconnect the mains supply and use only a lightly dampened soft cloth. Do not use chemical solvents or strong detergents as these may damage the cabinet or screen.

Never allow water droplets to remain on the screen as moisture can cause permanent discolouration. Greasy marks must only be removed with a commercial cleaner specifically recommended for LED screens.



Heat sources and flames

The set should not be placed near to open flames and sources of intense heat such as an electric heater. Ensure that no open flame sources, such as lighted candles, are placed on top of the TV. Batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.



Lightning

Before a storm or lightning, or when going on holiday, disconnect the power and aerial lead from the wall sockets.



Replacement parts

When replacement parts are required, make sure that the service technician has used replacement parts, which are specified by the manufacturer or have the same specifications as the original one. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electrical shock or other hazards.

Servicing

Please refer all servicing to qualified personnel. Do not remove the cover yourself as this may result in an electric shock.

Waste Disposal

Instructions for waste disposal:

Packaging and packaging aids are recyclable and should principally be recycled. Packaging materials, such as foil bag, must be kept away from children.

Batteries, including those which are heavy metal-free, should not be disposed of with household waste.

Please dispose of used battery in an environment friendly manner. Find out about the legal regulations which apply in your area.

Don't try to recharge batteries. Danger of explosion.

Replace batteries only with the same or equivalent type.

Information for Users in European Union Countries

The above mark is in compliance with the Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Directive 2002/96/EC (WEEE). The mark indicates the requirement NOT to dispose the equipment including any spent or discarded batteries as unsorted municipal waste, but use the return and collection systems available. If the batteries or accumulators included with this equipment display the chemical symbol Hg, Cd, or Pb, then it means that the battery has a heavy metal content of more than 0.0005% Mercury, or more than 0.002% Cadmium or more than, 0.004% Lead.

Disconnecting the device

The mains plug is used to disconnect TV set from the mains and therefore it must remain readily operable.

Headphone volume

Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss.



Remote control batteries

To remove or replace the two size AAA (LR03) batteries, remove the cover underneath the remote. Observe the correct the polarity shown in the following 'Quick start guide' and on the batteries.

Remove the batteries when the remote is not to be used for a long time. Batteries left in equipment may cause damage through deterioration and corrosive leakage, invalidating the guarantee. To protect the environment, please use your local recycling facilities for battery disposal.

CAUTION:

Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.

WARNINGS

The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and that no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.

No naked flame sources, such as lighted candles, should be placed on the apparatus.

This appliance is intended for domestic household use only and should not be used for any other purpose or in any other application, such as for none domestic use or in a commercial environment.

To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the floor/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.

Eye Fatigue

When using this product as a computer monitor, health and safety experts recommend short frequent breaks rather than occasional, longer breaks, for example a 5-10 minute break after an hour of continuous screen work is likely to be better than a 15 minute break every 2 hours.

Do not use the monitor against a bright background or where sunlight or other bright light source will shine directly on the screen.

Installation

To prevent injury, this device must be securely attached to the wall in accordance with the installation instructions when mounted to the wall (if the option is available).






Quick Start Guide

Detachable stand installation method

- **1.** The TV is laid on a soft flat surface to avoid scratches, so that the back cover will be on top.
- **2.** Fix the stand to the support column, as below picture indicates.




3. Use the five supplied screws to fasten the stand to the support column, as below picture indicates.



Detachable stand uninstallation method

- **1.** TV is laid on a soft flat surface to avoid scratches, so that backcover will be on topside.
- 2. Loosen the screws on the stand.



- 3. Detach the stand from the TV.
- **4.** Stand is detached.


Quick Start Guide – continued

Insert the batteries

• Insert two AAA size batteries in the remote control, ensuring that the polarity is correct, as shown.

Connect the set

- Connect the aerial plug to the RF socket on the back of the set.
- Connect the mains cable to the mains socket after you have completed all the connections. At this stage, the TV switches to standby mode. The red LED indicator will illuminate on the front panel of the TV.
- To switch on, press the Φ / I button on the top of the set, or aim the remote control at the receiver on the front of the set, and press the red Φ button. The indicator on the front of the set will turn blue.



Tune the TV

The first time you switch on the set, you should see the Installation screen:

- Use the ▲, ▼ ◀ and ▶ buttons on the remote control to select the correct Language, then press the OK button.
- Use the ▲, ▼ ◀ and ▶ buttons to select the correct Country, then press the OK button.

If you do not see the Installation Guide screen:

- Press the MENU button on the remote control. Use the ◀ and
 buttons to select the SETUP menu, then use the ▲ and ▼
 buttons to highlight the First Time Installation menu.
- · Press the **OK** button to enter.

When you see the Channel Tuning box:

- The TV will automatically search for any digital and analog TV and radio stations that are available in your area. This may take several minutes.
- After tuning has taken place, the Target Region Setting menu will be displayed (only when having received many programs on the same frequency, or the program is available in multiple areas).
 - Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons on the remote control to select
 Country Code then press the OK button.
 - Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons on the remote control to select
 Primary Region then press the OK button.
 - Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons on the remote control to select
 Secondary Region then press the OK button.
 - Use the


 and

 buttons on the remote control to select

 Tertiary Region then press the OK button.










• When tuning is completed a picture will be displayed on the screen.

If the stations are not in the order you would prefer, or if there are stations you do not want to watch, then see **Using the Channel Menu** later in this User Guide, to find out how to edit the programme list.


Watch digital TV

- Press the INPUT button on the remote control. Press the ▲ and ▼ buttons until DTV is highlighted, then press OK.
- Press the EPG button on the remote control. Use the ▲, ▼ ◀ and ▶ buttons to select a programme from the electronic programme guide, press OK to preview it, then EXIT to watch it.
 - or press the **CH+** and **CH** buttons on the remote control until you see the programme that you want to watch.



Watch analogue TV

- Press the INPUT button on the remote control. Press the ▲ and ▼ buttons until ATV is highlighted, then press OK.
- Press the numbered buttons 1, 2 etc on the remote control for the programme that you want to watch.
 - or press the **CH+** and **CH** buttons on the remote control until you see the programme that you want to watch.



• To view the subtitles on analogue TV – if any are available – select teletext page **888** (see **Using Teletext** *later in this User Guide*).

Play media

- Plug in **USB** device, before operating Media menu.
- Press the INPUT button on the remote control and select Media with the ▲ and ▼ buttons, then press OK to confirm.
 - OR press the **MEDIA** button on the remote control directly to enter the media menu.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ and OK buttons to enter any menus including PHOTO, MUSIC, MOVIE and TEXT (see Playing Media later in this User Guide).

Adjust the sound volume


• Press the **VOL+** and **VOL-** buttons to adjust the volume.

Turn the power off

- Switch the set to standby mode, by pressing the **POWER** button on the top of the set or the red **POWER** button on the remote control.
- If you will not be using the set for some time, unplug or turn off at the mains supply.


Use the Input Source menu to select which input signal to display:


- · Press the INPUT button.

 Insert a CAM loaded with a Smart card into the CI Slot, to view encrypted subscription channels. For more information about using the CI slot, see Using the Channel Menu.




If the batteries in the remote control fail, you can use the controls on the top of the set:



Φ/I Switch the set in and out of standby mode. The following buttons can also be used to operate the SOURCE Display the Input Source menu (see Setup menus (see Using Connecting up). the TV Setup Menus for more **MENU** Display the Setup menus (see Using the TV information): Setup Menus). CHmenu down CH-CH+ Step up and down through the programmes CH+ menu up until you see the programme you want to watch. VOLmenu left **VOL- VOL+** Adjust the sound volume. VOL+ menu right

Using the basic TV controls on the remote control

Aim the remote control at the indicator on the front of the set.
 The set may take a moment to respond - this is normal.



Using the Advanced TV Controls

To watch Analog TV:

- · Press the INPUT button.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select ATV.
- Press the **OK** button to confirm.

ASPECT:

Select from the following aspect ratio settings:
4:3, 16:9, Zoom1,
Zoom2 -- Just Scan is only available in some sources (This will affect the size and shape of the picture)

DISPLAY:

Show information about the station you are watching (Analog TV), or about the station and programme you are watching (Digital TV)

INPUT:



PICTURE MODE:

Select from the following picture settings:

Dynamic, Standard,

Mild, Personal (for more information, see Using the Picture Menu)



NICAM:

Analog TV: Select from a list of audio modes (NICAM transmissions only)

Press the **EXIT** button to close down any of the onscreen menus







Auto Tuning

- Press **OK** to open the Auto Tuning submenu.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select the tune type as ATV+DTV, DTV or ATV, then press the ▼ button.
- Use the ◀, ▶, ▲ and ▼ buttons to select the correct Country.
- Press the OK button. The TV will automatically search for any digital and analog TV and radio stations that are available in your area. This may take several minutes.

ATV Manual Tuning

- Press **OK** to open the ATV Manual Tuning submenu.
- Use the ▼ and ▲ buttons to highlight Current CH, then use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select a starting point for the station search.
- Highlight Color System and use the

 and

 buttons to select from PAL/AUTO or SECAM.
- Highlight Sound System and use the

 and


 buttons to select from BG/DK or I.
- Highlight Fine-Tune and use the

 and

 buttons to fine tune the station.
- Highlight AFC and set the Automatic Frequency Control to On or Off.
- When you find a station (it will stop and save the station automatically), then go back to Current CH and repeat, or press MENU to return to the Channel menu.

DTV Manual Tuning

- Press OK to open the DTV Manual Tuning submenu.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select a channel, checking that the signal strength meter shows at least normal signal strength.
- Press OK to start a station search.
- When the search is complete, select another channel and repeat, or press MENU to return to the Channel menu.

Using the Channel Menu continued

Programme Edit

- Press **OK** to open the Programme Edit submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select a station.
- Press the Red button to Delete a station directly.
- Press the Green button to Rename a station (ATV source only).
 - Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select which character to change.
 - Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to adjust the character.
 - · Press OK button to accept the new name.
- Press the Yellow button to Move a station.
 - Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to move the station to a different position in the list.
 - Press OK button to confirm the new position.
- Press the FAV button to add a station to your Favourites list.

(see Using the Digital TV Controls.)

- A red heart will appear next to the station name.
- Press the FAV button again to remove the station from your Favourites list.
- Press the Blue button to Skip a station.

Skip forces the station to be skipped when using the CH+ and CH- buttons to select a station.

Press the Blue button again to undo the Skip.

Signal Information (DTV source only)

- Press **OK** to open the Signal Information submenu.
- This menu displays signal details, including Channel number, Frequency, Signal Quality and Strength.

Signal Information Channel 154 Frequency 205.50 Mhz Quality 99 Strength 22

Common Interface (CI) (DTV source only)

- Press OK The smart card information will be displayed if the smart card is inserted in the conditional access module (CAM) and this, in turn, inserted in the CI slot.
- If the smart card is not inserted, then insert the smart card in the CAM and the CAM in the CI slot. Make sure that the smart card and CAM are inserted according to the instructions.
- Do not use excessive force the card and CAM should slide into place easily. See [Cam Card Installation] section.
- Press **MENU** to return to the previous menu selection, or press **EXIT** to guit the menu.

Software Update(OAD) (DTV source only)

- Over-Air Download, it is used to upgrade TV's firmware through live broadcast.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ or OK buttons to turn Software Update on or off, the TV will look for a software update during the night, if it finds one it will download and install the update automatically.
- You must turn on the software update and leave the TV in standby overnight for this function to work.



CAM card user information


Note that the CI slot can only be used to insert a CAM card, the Top Up TV program will play
via the smart card in the CAM.

CAM card installation


- Please confirm that the TV power is switched off.
- Insert the Top Up TV smart card into the CAM as shown in the illustration at the foot of this page.
- Insert the CAM into the TV's CI slot.
- Make sure the CAM card has been inserted into the CI slot, properly, before switching on the TV.
- You can now check the CAM and smart card information by selecting the CI setting menu. If the information is displayed then the cards have been successfully installed.

If you have problems viewing Top Up channels

- The CAM may not be suitable for the smart card please contact the supplier of the Top Up card/CAM.
- You may not have paid for the channel, contact the supplier of the Top Up card.
- Either the smart card has not been inserted in the CAM correctly, or the CAM has not been inserted in the CI slot correctly please remove and try again.
- Either the CAM or smart card are faulty or damaged contact the supplier of the Top Up card/ CAM.
- Either the CI slot is damaged or is faulty contact the After Sales Service.




1.Insert smart card into the CAM

Using the Picture Menu



Picture Mode

- Press **OK** to open the Picture Mode submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from Dynamic, Standard, Mild or Personal (Set this to your personal liking).

Depending on what you select here, some of the following settings will not be available.

Contrast, Brightness, Colour, Tint and Sharpness

- Press **OK** to open the relevant submenu.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to adjust the settings, if available.

Colour Temperature


- Press **OK** to open the Colour Temperature submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from Cold, Normal or Warm (Set this to your personal liking).


Noise Reduction

- Press **OK** to open the Noise Reduction submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from Off, Low, Middle or Default (Use the setting that looks best to you).

PC Setting (PC source only)

- If using a sound card, adjust the PC sound as required.
- Set the PC resolution to 1360 X 768 at 60 Hz on its original monitor. Make the connections between the TV monitor and your PC, switch on the monitor before booting the PC. See Diagram 1.





Auto Adjust

- Press **OK**, the Picture will move around the screen until it is centred.
- · A message informing you that Auto adjusting is taking place will appear.

H-Offset

• Press **OK**, a bar will appear at the bottom of the picture showing the position of the picture in the display area, use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to move the picture horizontally. Press **OK** when the picture is in the correct place.

V-Offset

• Press **OK**, a bar will appear at the bottom of the picture showing the position of the picture in the display area, use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to move the picture vertically. Press **OK** when the picture is in the correct place.

Size

 Press OK, a bar will appear at the bottom of the picture showing the realative size (Width) of the picture, use the

 and

 buttons to adjust then press OK when the picture size is correct.

Phase

Depending on the resolution and scan frequency that you input to the TV set, you may see
a hazy or noisy picture on the screen. In such a case you can use this item to get a clear
picture by trial and error method. Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to adjust and press OK when
happy with the setting.


Position Reset

Press **OK** to reset the picture position to the default position.

NOTE:

When you are in the H-Offset, V-Offset, Size or Phase menu's you can select one of the other menu's by using the ▲ and ▼ buttons to save exiting to the main PC menu and selecting one of the other menu's.

Using the Sound Menu



Sound Mode

- Press **OK** to open the Sound Mode submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from Standard, Music, Movie, Sports or Personal.

 Depending on what you select here, some of the following settings will not be available.

Treble, Bass, Balance

- Press **OK** to open the relevant submenu.
- Use the

 and

 buttons to adjust the settings, if available.

Auto Volume

- Use the

 and

 buttons or OK button to select from On or Off.
 - Turn this on to reduce the volume of loud passages to avoid annoying the neighbours late at night.

SPDIF Mode

Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons or OK button to select from Auto, Off or PCM.


OFF--No digital sound output.

SPDIF--When the digital coaxial output is connected to your digital audio amplifier, playback will be in Dolby stereo surround sound.

PCM--When the digital coaxial output is connected to your digital audio amplifier, playback will be in Dolby stereo 2 channel.

Audio Description (DTV source only)


- Press OK to open the AD Switch submenu.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select the audio description function to On or Off as well as adjust the volume of the AD.
- Additional commentary describing actions (Such as a face expression) that can't be seen by visually impaired persons.



HEADPHONE VOLUME WARNING

- Connect headphones with the volume set low and increase it if required. Prolonged listening through some headphones at high volume settings can result in hearing damage.
- Earphones or Headphones must comply with EN 50332-1 / EN50332-2 to ensure continued protection from excessive sound pressure levels.

Using the Time Menu



Clock (DTV source only)

 This shows the current date and time, which are automatically derived from the Digital TV signal.

Time Zone (DTV source only)

- Press **OK** to open the Time Zone submenu.
- Use the ◀, ▶, ▲ and ▼ buttons to select the correct time zone.

Sleep Timer

- Press OK to open the Sleep Timer submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from Off, 10, 20, 30, 60, 90, 120, 180 or 240mins.
 - The set will automatically switch off after the time you have selected has elapsed.


Auto Standby

- · Press **OK** to open the Auto Standby submenu.
