General Safety Precautions

Power

- Plug the power cord into the correct power outlet. An unstable connection may cause fire.
- Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or use a loose wall outlet. This may cause electrical shock or fire.
- Do never touch the power cord with wet hands. This may cause electrical shock.

Inserting Batteries into the Remote Control

You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when:

+ You just purchased TV

+ Remote control does not work

- Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol (♥) downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- 2 Insert two AAA size 1.5V batteries ensuring that the plus(+) and minus(-) signs of the batteries are correctly aligned.
- 3 Close the cover.

Note: Do not mix different battery types such as alkaline with manganese.

Connecting to an Aerial or a Cable TV

To view the television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the broadcasting provider.

CI Module looks like a PC Card (called PCMCIA) for laptops. There are different kinds of CI Modules, suitable for different coding systems.

- 2 Keep the CI module(with the Smartcard) vertically.

OTA (Over the Air)

OTA, an abbreviation of **Over-the-Air**, means that the software can be downloaded through your aerial. The manufacturer reserves the right to decide when and where to release software by this process. The software update via your aerial will only occur under the following circumstances.

1 The equipment should have appropriate loader software.

Caution: Please note that if you don't have normal loader software, the equipment may not be updated or work after software update.

- 2 The manufacturer decides to release software downloading via a designated aerial system.
- **3** The equipment must be **tuned** properly according to the guidelines within this manual.
- 4 Update software when the quality of receiving signal strength is high. If the weather is not so good that the quality of receiving signal strength is not recommendable, perform the software update later.

Caution:

- Please be careful to keep the power on and the power cord plugged in during software update. If the power is disconnected during software update, it may cause fatal damage to the TV.
- Please be careful not to pull out the signal line (co-axial Cable) during software update. Update may be interrupted and the TV may not work.

Notes:

- 1. The other functions of TV cannot work at all during software update.
- 2. It may take 5 ~10 minutes to update software.
- 3. Scheduling operation cannot work during software update.

This chapter describes the PVR (Personal Video Recorder) function that allows you to record a programme in the connected hard disk drive.

You can access to the Recording menu only in Digital TV input mode (if the hard disk drive is connected to the TV correctly).

Note: You can record the digital TV or radio programmes only. The analog channels and external AV inputs can't be recorded.

Time Shifted Recording (TSR)

You can perform TSR (Time Shifted Recording) and other functions similar to VCR functions using the playback control buttons while playing a programme.

The TV automatically saves the programme in the connected hard disk drive temporarily, so that users can pause, play, fast rewind, fast forward, replay, etc. even while watching the currently broadcasting TV programme.



Time Bar

If you press the **PLAY** button while watching TV, the time bar information will be displayed. Time bar displays the current operation status, the time gap between the broadcasting point and watching point and the amount of temporarily saved programme.



- 1 Operation status
- 2 Watching point time (hh:mm:ss)
- 3 The amount of saved programme
- 4 Watching point
- 5 Broadcasting (Live) point
- **6** Current time (hh:mm)

Pause

If you press the **PAUSE** button on the remote control, the current programme is paused. If you press the **PAUSE** button once again, the programme is resumed from that point.



Note: Pause makes the time gap or delay between the broadcasting (live) point and watching point. The time gap is equivalent to the period the programme was paused. Operations like slow motion and fast rewind also make the time gap. Press the **STOP** button to go to the live programme.







Fast Rewind to Previous Scene

Press the **FAST REWIND** button on the remote control to watch the scene passed by. Each time you press the **FAST REWIND** button, the rewind speed increases. (x 2, x 4, x 16, x 32, x 64)



If you press the **PLAY** button, the fast rewind operation stops and the programme is played at normal speed.

Note: You can fast rewind back to the start point. If you reach the start point while rewinding, the programme is automatically played at normal speed from that point.



Fast Forward to the Next Scene

Press the **FAST FORWARD** button on the remote control to fast forward the programme. Each time you press the **FAST FORWARD** button, the speed increases. (x 2, x 4, x 16, x 32, x 64)



If you press the **PLAY** button, the fast forward operation stops and the programme is played at normal speed.

Note: You can use the fast forward operation only when there is a time gap between the current watching point and the broadcasting (live) point caused by some previous operations such as pause, slow motion or fast rewind. You can fast forward to the current broadcasting point. If the watching point reaches the broadcasting (live) point, the programme is automatically played at normal speed.



Recording

Press the **RECORD** button on the remote control to record the current programme immediately. While the time shift operation records the programme temporarily, this record operation records the programme permanently so you can playback the recorded programme at any time. For more information about recording, refer to *Chapter 11. Recording and Playback > Instant Recording*.

Adjusting the Recording End Time

Press the **RECORD** button while recording to adjust the recording end time. You can adjust the recording end time by -/+10 minutes using the \triangleleft /> button, and then press the **OK** button to change the recording end time and hide the message screen.

Additional Time Shift Operations

You can perform additional time shift operations using the following buttons on the remote control.

Direct Jump

Press the **PLAY** button while watching TV. If you press the $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ button, a moving arrow will appear in the progress bar. Move this arrow to a time point using the $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ button to play the programme from the specified time point.

You can also move to the specified time point directly by entering the time you want using the **NUMBER(0-9)** buttons while playing back a recorded programme.

Instant Replay

Press the **INSTANT REPLAY** button to go back 7 seconds. When the replay has been completed the programme will play from the current point.

Refer to Chapter 10. DTV Setup > Miscellaneous Settings.

Instant Skipping 30 seconds

Press the **INSTANT SKIP** button to skip 30 seconds ahead from the current watching point. You can use the skip operation only when there is a time gap between the current watching point and the broadcasting point while using the fast forward operation. If the time gap is less than 30 seconds, the programme is played from the current broadcasting point. Refer to *Chapter 10. DTV Setup > Miscellaneous Settings*.

Slow Motion

Press the **SLOW MOTION** button to play the current programme in slow motion. Each time you press the **SLOW MOTION** button, the speed decreases (x 1/2, x 1/4, x 1/8). Press the **PLAY** button to stop playing in slow motion and return to normal speed.

Repeat Mode

You can select a specific block within a recorded programme and play it back repeatedly. Press the **A-B** button to set the first repeating position. Select the second position using the $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ button. Then the programme plays back the selected block repeatedly. To stop the repeat mode, press the **A-B** button while repeating the selected block.

Press the **STOP** button to stop playing the saved programme and watch the current programme on air.







Bookmark

You can jump to a position directly using the bookmark in recorded programme playback. Use bookmark to search positions quickly and easily.

Adding a bookmark

Press the **ADD BOOKMARK** button at a certain position to set a bookmark while playing back a recorded programme.

Note: The bookmark function is only available for recorded programmes.

Deleting a bookmark

Press the **BOOKMARK LIST** button after adding a bookmark and select the bookmarked position using the \blacktriangle/\lor button. Press the **ADD BOOKMARK** button to delete a bookmark.

Note: Press the BOOKMARK LIST or EXIT button to exit the bookmark list screen.

· Going to a bookmark

Press the **BOOKMARK LIST** button. Select the bookmarked position using the \blacktriangle/\lor button and press the **OK** button. Then the programme plays from the bookmarked position.

Instant Recording





Using the connected hard disk drive, you can record a programme without an external media device such as a VCR.



Press the **RECORD** button on the remote control to record the current programme instantly. You can select the point you want to record using the **</>**> button. Press the **RECORD** button to start instant recording from that point.

You can change the recording end time while recording. Press the **RECORD** button and change the time using the $\triangleleft/\triangleright$ button.

If a reserved recording is about to start while recording already, you will be prompted to stop the currently recording channel.

Notes:

- **1.** Make sure that the hard disk drive is connected correctly before recording.
- During recording, the standby indicator on the front of your TV turns on RED.
 Ensure that there is enough free space before recording. If the free space on
- the connected hard disk drive is insufficient, recording will stop. Recording one hour of programme may require up to 2 or 3GB of hard disk space. The space for recording a 1 hour programme may differ depending on the programme.
- 4. You can record radio programmes also.

Recording Schedule

You can set a programme to record automatically.

- 1 Press the MENU button.
- 2 Select **Recording** using the \blacktriangle/∇ button and press the **OK** or \blacktriangleright button.
- 3 Select Schedule using the ▲/▼ button and press the OK or ► button to display the reserved recording list on the screen.

Note: You can schedule recording easily using the programme guide. Refer to *Chapter 5. Using the Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) > Reserving a Programme.*

Selecting/Unselecting Reserved Programmes

- 1 Select a programme and press the **GREEN** button. You can select multiple programmes.
- 2 To unselect the selected programmes, press the **GREEN** button again.

Deleting Reserved Programmes

Holds the display on a given page if the selected page is linked with several secondary pages that automatically follow. To resume, press it again.

When watching TV programmes, press this button to display the current time at the top right hand corner of the screen.

Numeric (0~9)

Press to enter the three-digit page number given in the content.

Coloured buttons (Red/Green/Yellow/Blue)

If the FASTEXT system is used by a broadcasting company, the different topics covered on a teletext page are colour-coded and can be selected by pressing the coloured buttons. Press one of them corresponding to your needs. The page is displayed with other coloured information that can be selected in the same way. To display the previous or next page, press the corresponding coloured button.

Troubleshooting

Before contacting your local service dealer, please make sure you refer to the following guide. If the TV does not work normally after completing the following trouble shooting, please contact your local TV distributor or service centre.

(1) No message is displayed on the front panel or the TV has no power.

- Check the main power cable and make sure it is plugged into a suitable power outlet.
- Check that the mains supply is switched on.
- Check that the power switch is on at the TV (where applicable)
- Connect the power cable to a different power outlet.
- (2) No picture
 - Make sure that the TV is power on and in operation mode (press STANDBY button).
 - Make sure that the AV cable is firmly connected to the TV. You may need to remove the cable from both ends and reconnect.
 - Make sure that the antenna line is properly connected to the TV.
 - Check the brightness level of the TV.
 - Check if the channel is currently on air. Contact the broadcaster to ensure that the channel is running.

(3) Poor picture & sound quality

- Install the antenna in an obstacle-free place.
- Make sure there is no mobile phone or microwave oven near the TV.
- Use 75 coaxial cable when connecting TV and antenna.
- When the 1080i video input signal is displayed on the TV screen through the Component or HDMI jack, the screen flicker may occur. (LGB-19DRT only)
- (4) No or poor sound
 - Check that your AV cable is connected correctly.
 - Check the volume levels of your TV.
 - Check if the TV is on mute.
 - Check audio type or soundtrack option.
- (5) Remote Control does not operate.
 - To control the TV, the top end of the remote control should point directly towards the receiving
 part of the TV.
 - Remove and reinsert the batteries in the remote control.
 - Replace the batteries in the remote control for a new set.
- (6) Cannot watch scrambled channel.
 - Check that you have the appropriate Smartcard or CAM. Reinsert the Smartcard or CAM and make sure it initializes correctly.
 - Check in the menu that the TV is detecting the Smartcard or CAM.
 - Check in the menu that you have a valid and working subscription to the channels you wish to view.
 - Ensure that the Smartcard or CAM is not damaged.
- (7) Cannot make reservations.
 - Check that no previous reservations are conflicting with the new reservation.
 - Check that the TV is switched on at the time of the reservation.
- (8) No password information is given.
 - The default password is always 0000.
- (9) Channel search does not work.
 - Check that your antenna is connected correctly.
- (10) Cannot update new software.
 - You can get an update. If the TV does not show a message requesting update, that means no software is available.
- (11) Cannot watch pay channels.
 - Check in the menu that you have a valid and working subscription to the channels you wish to view.
 - Contact your network operator for more information.
(12) Cannot record progammes.

- Make sure that the HDD is connected correctly.
- The hard disk is full. Delete unnecessary programmes and make space for new recording.
- Check if recording is overlapped with another channel. Stop the current recording or wait until the recording is finished.

(13) Cannot operate the TSR (Time Shifted Recording)

- Make sure that the HDD is connected correctly.
- The TSR may not be available during the recording. Wait until the recording is finished.
- Delete unnecessary programmes and make space for new recording.

(14) Cannot playback.

- Make sure that the HDD is connected correctly.
- The signal during the recording may be weak or the hard disk too full.

(15) Cannot change channel while recording.

- Certain channels may not be changed due to restriction of the tuner type.
