

Viewing the Control Panel



1 TV/VIDEO

Displays a menu of all of the available input sources (TV - AV1 - AV2 - AV3 - S-Video - PC/DVI).

2 MENU

Opens the on-screen menu.

8 - 🚄 +

Moves the selector left or right on the OSD. Increases or decreases the level of audio volume and the values of the selected function.


Moves the selector up or down on the OSD. Increases or decreases the channel number.

Viewing the Connection Panel



Whenever you connect an audio or video system to your set, ensure that all elements are switched off.

Refer to the documentation supplied with your equipment for detailed connection instructions and associated safety precautions.

Viewing the Connection Panel

Connecting an Aerial or Cable Television Network (depending on the model)

To view television channels correctly, a signal must be received by the set from one of the following sources:

- An outdoor aerial
- A cable television network
- A satellite network

2 Connecting a Set-Top Box, VCR, or DVD

- Connect the VCR, or DVD SCART cable to the SCART connector of the VCR, or DVD.
- If you wish to connect both the Set-Top Box and VCR (or DVD), you should connect the Set-Top Box to the VCR (or DVD) and connect the VCR (or DVD) to your set.

3 Connecting a Computer

- Connect the 24 Pin DVI connector to the PC video connector.
- Connect the stereo audio cable to the "Audio (ST)" jack on the rear of your set and the other end to the "Audio Out" jack of the sound card on your computer.

Viewing the Connection Panel

1 Connecting a DVD Player or Set-Top Box to the TV with a DVI-D Cable

- Connect a DVI-D cable between the DVI-I INPUT connector on the TV and the DVI connector on the DVD player/Set-Top BOX.
- Connect a set of audio cables between the PC AUDIO INPUT jack on the TV and the AUDIO OUTPUT jacks on the DVD player/ Set-Top BOX.

If you are using a DVI-D cable to connect

- ◆ Be sure to connect the audio cable (sold separately) as shown above to get normal TV sound.
- ◆ See Appendix "Display Modes" for supported resolutions.
- The screen may have shifted to the right or to the left after connecting the cable. Don't adjust the screen position in a Digital Signal.
- ◆ Each external input Source device has a different back panel configuration.

5 Connecting External A/V Devices

- Connect RCA or S-VIDEO cables to an appropriate external A/V device such as a VCR, DVD, or Camcorder.
- Connect RCA audio cables to "AUDIO (L)" and "AUDIO (R)" on the rear of your set and the other ends to corresponding audio out connectors on the A/V device.
- Headphones may be connected to the headphone output () on the rear of your set.
 While the headphones are connected, the sound from the built-in speakers will be disabled.

6 Connecting Headphones

- Plug a set of headphones into the 3.5mm mini-jack socket on the rear of the set.

Kensington Slot

- This television has been designed to apply a burglarproof lock.


> Retractable Stand

Tilt the screen until you feel comfortable.

The maximum tilt angle is 7 degrees in the backward direction.

Please do not tilt the television beyond the specified range.

Using excessive force to tilt the television beyond the specified range may cause permanent damage to the mechanical part of the stand.



Viewing Pictures From External Sources




Once you have connected up your various audio and video systems, you can view the different sources by selecting the appropriate input.

- 1 Check that all the necessary connections have been made (refer to pages 6 and 7 for further details).
- PC button...
 Press the PC button to choose PC mode.
 - Video button...
 Press the Video button to choose Video mode.
 The input sources are displayed in the following order:
 AV1 AV2 AV3 S-Video.
 - ◆ TV button...
 Press the TV button to choose TV mode.

Inserting the Batteries in the Remote Control

You must insert or replace the batteries in the remote control when you:

- ◆ Purchase your set
- ◆ Find that the remote control is no longer operating correctly
- 1 Remove the cover on the rear of the remote control by pressing the symbol downwards and then pulling firmly to remove it.
- 2 Install two AAA size batteries.
 - + on the battery against + on the remote control
 - on the battery against on the remote control
- 3 Replace the cover by aligning it with the base of the remote control and pressing it back into place.
- Do not mix battery types, i.e. alkaline and manganese.







Switching On and Off






The mains lead is attached to the rear of your set.

- 1 Plug the mains lead into an appropriate socket.
 - Result: When the adaptor is plugged in, the LED turns red.
- 2 Press the **OPOWER** button to switch on.
- 3 To switch off, press the **OPOWER** button again.

Placing in Standby Mode





Your set can be placed in Standby mode in order to reduce the power consumption.

The Standby mode can be useful when you wish to interrupt viewing temporarily (during a meal, for example).

- 1 Press the **OPOWER** button.
- 2 To switch back on, simply press the **ὑPOWER** button again or a numeric button.
- Do not leave your set in Standby mode for long periods of time (when you are away on holiday, for example).

 Turn off by pressing the **OPOWER** button.

 It is best to unplug the set from the mains and aerial.



When the set is initially powered ON, you are automatically presented with a series of basic customer settings. The following settings are available.

If the set is in standby mode, press the (I) **POWER** button on the remote control.

The message **Plug & Play** is displayed.

It appears for a little while, and then the Language menu is automatically displayed.

2 Select the appropriate **Language** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

The available languages are listed. You can choose one of 18 Languages.

3 Press the **ENTER** • button to confirm your choice.

The message Antenna Input Check is displayed with

OK selected.

4 Press the **ENTER** button.

5 Select your **Country** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button. Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Selecting TV Mode or an Input Source





You can choose TV mode or change to an input source connected to the TV set. Use this button to choose an input source that you would like to watch.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Input**.

Result: The options available in the **Input** group are displayed.

3 Press the **ENTER** • button.

4 Press the **ENTER** • button.

Result: The TV/Video is selected.

5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to move to the input source that you wish to choose.

Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Result: The input source changes to the one you have chosen.

Editing an Input Source Name

Entering the names of the input source devices connected to the input ports on the TV set allows you to find and choose an input source that you would like to watch in a quick and convenient manner.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Input.

Result: The options available in the **Input** group are displayed.

3 Press the ENTER → button.

Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Edit Name. Press the ENTER → button.

Fress the ▲ or ▼ button to move to the input source that you wish to edit.

Press the **ENTER** • button.

Result: The following options are available:












Choosing Your Language









When you start using your set for the first time, you must select the language which will be used for displaying menus and indicators.

- Press the MENU button.
 - Result: The main menu is displayed.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Setup**.
 - Result: The options available in the **Setup** group are displayed.
- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Language. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.
- 5 Select a particular Language by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly.
- 6 When you are satisfied with your choice, press the EXIT button to return to normal viewing.

Storing Channels Automatically

You can scan for the frequency ranges available to you (and availability depends on your country). Automatically allocated programme numbers may not correspond to actual or desired programme numbers. However you can sort numbers manually and clear any channels you do not wish to watch.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Channel.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select ATM. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The Start is selected.

Press the ENTER button to search the channels. The sub menu is changed from Start to Stop with channel search started.

Result: The search will end automatically.

Channels are sorted and stored in an order which reflects their position in the frequency range, (with lowest first and highest last). The programme originally selected is then displayed.

- To return to the previous menu, press ◀ or ▶ button to select **Return** and then press **ENTER** → button.
- To stop the search before it has finished, press the **ENTER** & button to search the channels.
- 6 When the channels have been stored, you can:
 - ◆ Add or delete the channels (refer to page 22)
 - ◆ Sort them in the order required (refer to page 23)
 - Assign a name to the stored channels (refer to page 24)
 - ◆ Fine tune channel reception if necessary (refer to page 25)










Storing Channels Manually













You can store up to 100 channels, including those received via cable networks.

When storing channels manually, you can choose:

- ◆ Whether or not to store each of the channels found
- The programme number of each stored channel which you wish to identify
- 1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER → button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Manual Store. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The options available in the **Manual Store** group are displayed with the **Prog. No** selected.

5 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Colour System. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Select the **Colour System** required by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly and then press the **ENTER** → button.

Result: The colour standards are displayed in the following order: AUTO - PAL - SECAM - NT 4.43

6 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Sound System**.

Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Select the **Sound System** required by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly and then press the **ENTER** ⊕ button.

Result: The sound standards are displayed in the following order: BG - DK - I - L

- Press the number button to input Prog.No.

Storing Channels Manually

- 8 If you know the channel number to be stored,
 - ◆ Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Channel.
 Press the ENTER → button.
 - Select C (Air channel) or S (Cable channel) by pressing the
 ▲ or ▼ button and then press the ENTER → button.
 - ◆ Select the required number by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button and then press the **ENTER** ⊕ button.
 - If there is normal sound or no sound, re-select the sound system required.
- 9 If you do not know the channel numbers, press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Search**.

Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Start the **Search** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Result: The tuner scans the frequency range until the first channel or the channel that you selected is received on your screen.

10 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Store**.

Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Select **YES** by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.

Press the **ENTER** button.



Editing the Channels









You can exclude any channels of your choice from the channels you have scanned. When you scan through the stored channels, those you have chosen to skip are not displayed.

All channels that you do not specifically choose to skip are displayed during scanning.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

<u>Result</u>: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select Add/Delete. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The state of the current channel is displayed.

Fress the o or ✓ button to select the channel that you wish to Add or Delete.

Result:

If the channel that you wish to edit is not in the memory, Add is selected and displayed.

Otherwise, if the channel that you wish to edit is in the

memory, Delete is selected and displayed.

- 6 Press the ENTER button to Add or Delete the channel.
- 7 To return to the previous menu, select **Return** by pressing the
 ◀ or ▶ button and then press the **ENTER** ❖ button.
- 8 Repeat Step 5 for each channel to be added or erased.

Sorting the Stored Channels

You can exchange the numbers of two channels, in order to:

- Modify the numeric order in which the channels have been automatically stored.
- Assign easily remembered numbers to the channels that you watch most often.
- 1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the Channel group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select **Sort**.

Press the **ENTER** 🕒 button.

Result: The current **Prog. No, Channel**and **Name** are displayed.

Select the channel number that you wish to change by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly.
 Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The selected **Channel number** and **Name** are moved to the right side.








Giving Channels Names









If channel name information is broadcast when you store the channels either manually or automatically, the names are assigned to the channels directly. You can however change these names or assign new names as required.

1 Press the **MENU** button.

Result: The main menu is displayed.

2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.

Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.

- 3 Press the ENTER → button.
- 4 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Name. Press the ENTER ⊕ button.

Result: The current **Prog. No, Channel**and **Name** are displayed.

5 If necessary, select the channel to be assigned to a new Name by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button.
Press the ENTER → button.

Result: The selection bar is displayed around the name box.

Fine Tuning Channel Reception

If the reception is clear, you do not have to fine-tune the channel, as this is done automatically during the search and store operation. If however the signal is weak or distorted, you may have to fine-tune the channel manually.

- 1 Press the **MENU** button.
 - Result: The main menu is displayed.
- 2 Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the **Channel**.
 - Result: The options available in the **Channel** group are displayed.
- 3 Press the ENTER → button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the Fine Tune. Press the ENTER button.
- Fress the o or ➤ button to select the channel that you wish to Fine Tune.
- Press ◀ or ▶ button until you reach the setting to obtain a sharp and clear picture and good sound quality.
 To store the setting, press the ENTER ⊕ button.
- To reset the fine tuning, select Reset by pressing the ▲ or ▼ button and then press the ENTER ⊕ button.
 To return to the previous menu, select Return by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button and press the ENTER ⊕ button.








Maintenance of Your Television

To avoid risk of electric shock, do not disassemble the TV cabinet. Users must not service the TV.


User maintenance is restricted to cleaning, as explained below:

Unplug the television from the power outlet before cleaning.

- ♦ When you clean the TFT-LCD and the external panel, please apply the recommended small amount of cleaner, using a soft, dry cloth to polish it. Do not force your television screen, scrubbing it only softly. The use of excessive force can result in stains on the screen.
- Never use flammable cleaning material to clean your television or any other electrical apparatus.

How to connect the cables and stand base








Connect the cables as shown in the picture.








Attach the stand to the TV set as shown in the picture.

Note: The curved side of the stand base should be placed at the back of the TV set as shown in the above figure.





Do NOT lift the TV set by the stand.

The stand is not screwed to the TV set and lifting the set by the stand may cause injury.



After it has been set up properly, your remote control can operate in four different modes: TV, VCR, Cable, or DVD. Pressing the corresponding button on the remote control allows you to switch between these modes, and control whichever piece of equipment you choose.

Note

The remote control might not be compatible with all DVD Players, VCRs and Cable boxes.

Setting Up the Remote to Operate Your VCR.

- **1** Turn off your VCR.
- 2 Press the SELECT button and make sure that the VCR LED is illuminated.
- **3** Press the **SET** button on your TV's remote control.
- Using the number buttons on your remote control, enter three digits of the VCR code listed on page 65 of this manual for your brand of VCR. Make sure you enter three digits of the code, even if the first digit is a "0".
 (If more than one code is listed, try the first one.)
- Press the Power button on the remote control. Your VCR should turn on if your remote is set up correctly.

If your VCR does not turn on after set up, repeat steps 2, 3, and 4, but try one of the other codes listed for your brand of VCR. If no other codes are listed, try each VCR code, 000 through 088.

Note on Using Remote Control Modes: VCR When your remote control is in "VCR" mode, the volume buttons still control your TV's volume.

Setting Up the Remote to Operate Your Cable Box.

- 1 Turn off your cable box.
- 2 Press the SELECT button and make sure that the Cable LED is illuminated.
- 3 Press the **SET** button on your TV's remote control.
- Using the number buttons on your remote control, enter three digits of the cable box code listed on page 65 of this manual for your brand of cable box. Make sure you enter three digits of the code, even if the first digit is a "0".
 If there is more than one code listed, try the first one.
- Press the Power button on the remote control. Your cable box should turn on if your remote is set up correctly.

If your cable box does not turn on after set up, repeat steps 2, 3, and 4, but try one of the other codes listed for your brand of cable box. If no other codes are listed, try each code, 000 through 077.

Note on Using Remote Control Modes: Cable Box When your remote control is in "Cable Box" mode, the volume buttons still control your TV's volume.





Setting Up the Remote to Operate Your DVD.

- 1 Turn off your DVD.
- 2 Press the SELECT button and make sure that the DVD LED is illuminated.
- 3 Press the **SET** button on your TV's remote control.
- 4 Using the number buttons on your remote control, enter three digits of the DVD code listed on page 65 of this manual for your brand of DVD. Make sure you enter three digits of the code, even if the first digit is a "0".
 If there is more than one code listed, try the first one.
- Press the Power button on the remote control. Your DVD should turn on if your remote is set up correctly.

If your DVD does not turn on after set up, repeat steps 2, 3, and 4, but try one of the other codes listed for your brand of DVD.

If no other codes are list-ed, try each code, 000 through 009.

Note on Using Remote Control Modes: DVD When your remote control is in "DVD" mode, the volume buttons still control your TV's volume.
