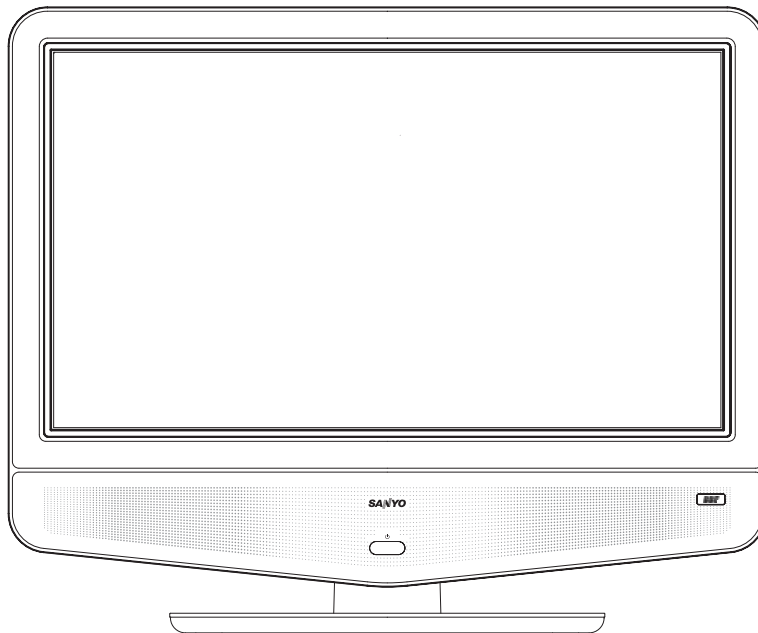

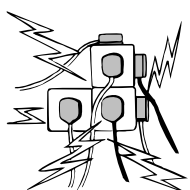

## SAFETY PRECAUTIONS / SERVICING

**CAUTION: Please read and retain for your safety.** This unit has been engineered and manufactured to assure your personal safety, but improper use can result in potential electric shock or fire hazards. In order not to defeat the safeguards incorporated in this receiver observe the following basic rules for its installation, use and servicing.

### Installation



**Do not** allow anything to rest on the power cord. **Do not** locate this television receiver where the cord will be damaged by people walking on it.

**Do not** overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in fire or electric shock.

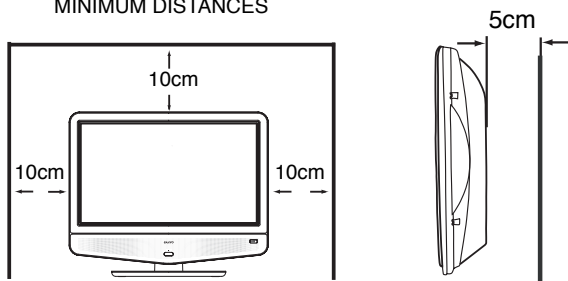
Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation to ensure reliable operation and to protect it from overheating. These openings **must not** be blocked or covered. The opening **should never** be covered with a cloth or other material, and the bottom openings **should not** be blocked by placing the television receiver on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface.

**Do not** place this television near any heat sources such as radiators, heaters, stoves and other heat-generating products (including amplifiers).

**Do not** place the television in direct sunlight.

**Do not** place your television receiver on an unstable stand, shelf or table. Serious injury to an individual, and damage to the television may result if it should fall. Your sales person can recommend approved stands or shelf and wall mounting instructions. A special wall mounting kit is available for this model.

#### MINIMUM DISTANCES



If the television is built into a unit, or enclosed, the minimum distances for ventilation must be maintained. Heat build up can reduce the life of your television, and can be dangerous.

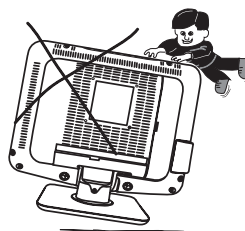
### Use

This television receiver should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the television or as indicated in the Operating Instructions. If you are not sure of the type of power supply in your home, consult your sales person or your local power company.

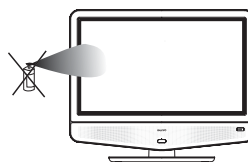
**Never** add accessories that have not been specifically designed for this television.

**Do not** drop or push objects into the television cabinet slots or openings. Some internal parts carry hazardous voltages and contact may result in an electric shock hazard. **Never** spill liquids of any kind on the television receiver. **Do not** place items such as vases containing liquid on top of the TV set.

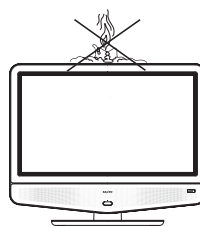
**Do not** expose the television receiver to rain or use near water. For example, near a bathtub, kitchen sink, in a wet basement, etc. **Do not** use immediately after moving the television from a low temperature to a high temperature environment, as this causes condensation, which may result in fire, electric shock, or other hazards. Before cleaning, unplug the television receiver from the wall socket.



**Never** stand on, lean on or push the television or its stand. **Never** allow children to play with the television or its stand. Serious injury may result if it should fall.

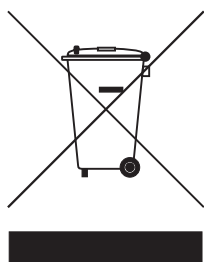


**Do not** apply liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners directly onto the television receiver. Use a soft cloth for cleaning.



**Do not** place candles or hot objects upon the TV, next to it or behind it. Open flames must never be used near the TV set.

## SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

### Important:

This equipment is fitted with an approved non rewireable UK mains plug. To change a fuse in this type of plug proceed as follows:

1. Remove the fuse cover and fuse.
2. Fit a new fuse which should be a BS1362 3Amp A.S.T.A. or BSI approved type.
3. Ensure that the fuse cover is correctly refitted.

If the fuse cover is lost or damaged the plug must **NOT** be used but replaced with a serviceable plug.

If the fitted plug is not suitable for your socket outlets, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted in its place. If the mains plug contains a fuse, this should have a rating of 3 Amp, ensure the fuse cover is correctly fitted. If a plug without a fuse is used, the fuse at the distribution board should not be greater than 5 Amp.

**Note:** The severed plug must be destroyed to avoid a possible shock hazard should it be inserted into a 13Amp socket elsewhere.

The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Blue -----> Neutral  
Brown ----> Live

1. The Blue wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "N" or coloured BLACK.
2. The Brown wire must be connected to the terminal with the letter "L" or coloured RED.
3. **Do not** connect either wire to the earth terminal in the symbol or coloured GREEN or GREEN and YELLOW.

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the wires.

**THIS UNIT IS NOT DISCONNECTED FROM THE MAINS UNLESS THE MAINS LEAD IS UNPLUGGED.**

### Care of your product

#### ● Cleaning your LCD screen.

Your LCD screen is coated in a non reflective film. Damage to this film will result in possible discolouration. Any scratches will not be repairable.

Clean your screen with a soft cloth, only rub lightly, do not use detergents.

**Do not** stick anything to the screen, use solvent or alcohol based cleaners, hit the screen with a hard object or rub the surface hard.

#### ● Placement of your LCD TV.

##### Table top stand

This LCD TV is supplied with a table top stand fitted. The stand can rotate 360° to the left or right. To rotate your TV hold the base and gently push the edge of the TV.

##### Wall mounting bracket

An optional wall bracket is available for your LCD TV. Before you consider wall mounting this TV, check that you have an appropriate wall made from solid materials such as concrete or bricks. You will have to remove the table top stand to use this.

### Servicing

**Your television is fully transistorised and does not contain any user serviceable components.**

**You must not remove the rear cover of the TV by yourself. The apparatus is working with high voltages and could damage objects or even endanger people. Leave all required repair and service jobs to an authorised service technician. He will exclusively use such spare parts that are complying with the same safety standards as applicable to the original parts. The use of original spare parts can prevent fire, shock and other hazards.**

**Unplug the television receiver from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:**

- If the power cord or plug is damaged.
- If liquid has been spilt into the television receiver.
- If television receiver has been exposed to rain or water.
- If the television receiver has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- If the television receiver exhibits a distinct change in performance.
- If the television receiver does not operate normally by following the operating instructions.

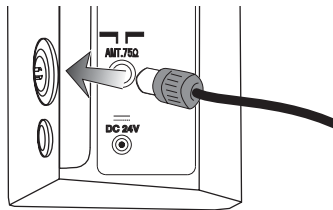


Adjust only those controls that are covered in the operating instructions as improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage. This will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the television receiver to normal operation.

# INSTALLATION

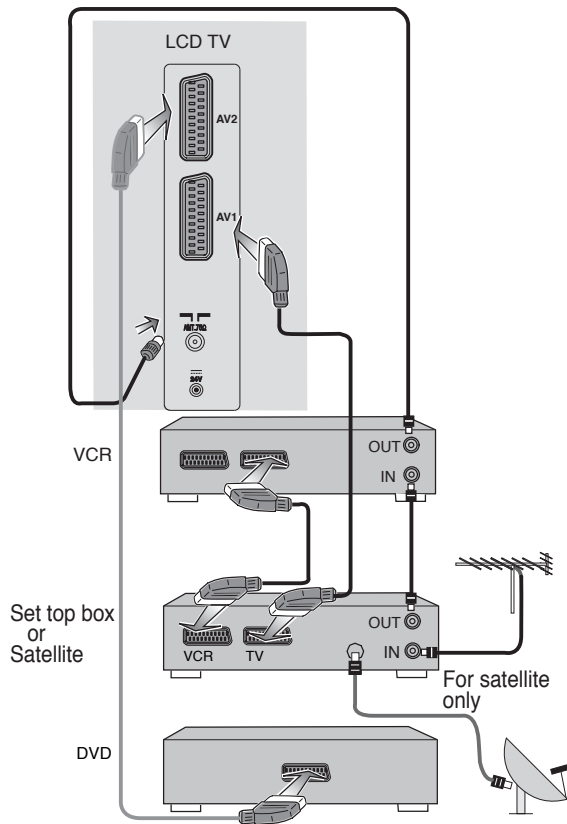
## Step : 1 Connections (Essential)

1. Connect your aerial cable socket to the back of the TV set. Fit the aerial cable as shown or as shown below when AV equipment is connected.

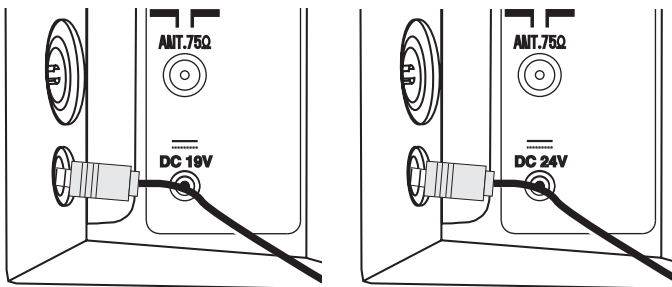


### ● Connecting DVD / VCR player/ Satellite receiver or Set top box.

We recommend that you connect all other equipment before Plug and Play. The following examples are our recommended standard connection. For further information please consult your local dealer.



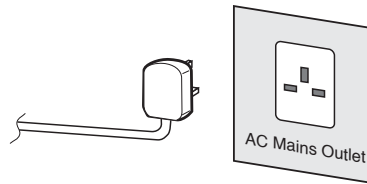
2. Connect the DC power supply adaptor to the LCD TV set. (supplied with the set).

3. Connect the power cord of the LCD TV adaptor to a wall outlet.



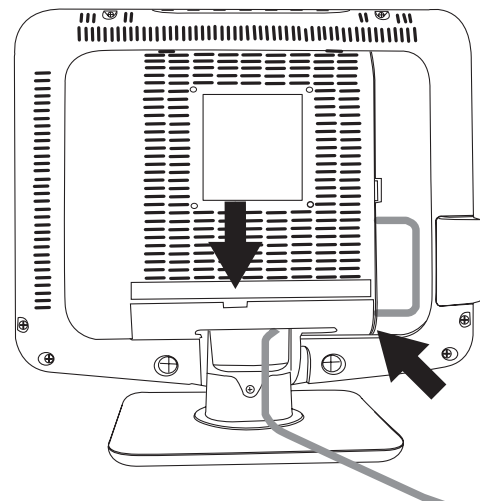
The TV set adaptor is prepared for a mains voltage AC220~240V, 50Hz. To completely switch off the mains, or when the TV set is not to be used for an extended period of time, it is advisable to disconnect the adaptor power cord from the power outlet.

For all aerial problems please consult your local dealer.



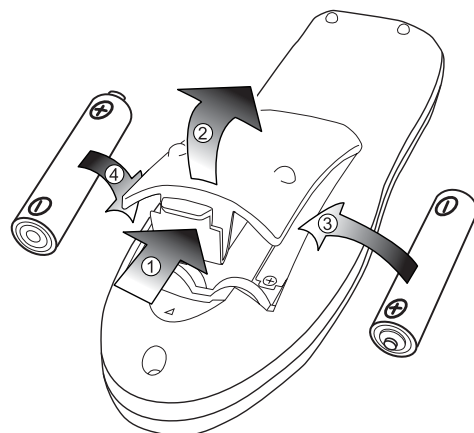
**WARNING!** High voltages are used in the operation of this set. Refer service to qualified service personnel.

Push the catch downwards to open the door. Place leads behind the door to keep them tidy, and push the door closed.



## Step : 2 Remote control battery installation

Install two "AA" 1.5 volt batteries so that the "+" and "-" marks on the batteries match the "+" and "-" marks inside the unit into the remote control handset.

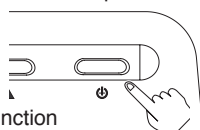


# INSTALLATION

## Step : 3 Switching on / Plug & Play

The LCD TV will have a red Standby light to show there is power.

Press the standby button on the top of the LCD to start Plug and Play.



This TV set provides a self - automatic tuning function called Plug and Play which automatically searches and stores all of the available TV stations in your reception area.

### Auto sort

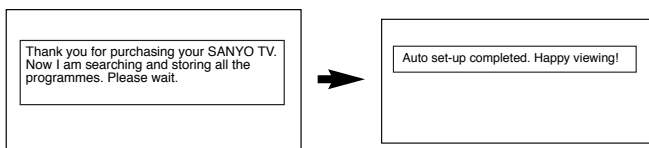

Press the **P▲** or **P▼** to highlight **OSD language**. Select your language by pressing the **▲-** or **▲+** button (English).

Press **P▼** to select **Country** identification and by pressing the **▲-** or **▲+** buttons select **UK** or **IRE** (for Ireland).

When you are happy with your selection press **P▼** to select **Start**. Press the **F/OK** button to select **OK**. This will automatically start Plug and Play.

A welcome message will appear while Plug and Play is in operation and then after all channels have been tuned a second screen appears to tell you the operation has been completed.



To remove the completed message press the **MENU** button.

## Now the installation is complete!

After Plug & Play the TV set automatically allocates the following major stations in the UK.

- Position 1 : BBC1
- Position 2 : BBC2
- Position 3 : ITV
- Position 4 : CH4 or S4C
- Position 5 : CH5
- Position 6 : SKY, BBC-World or BBC-Prime

After Plug & Play the TV set automatically allocates the following major stations in Ireland.

- Position 1 : RTE1
- Position 2 : RTE2
- Position 3 : TV3
- Position 4 : TG4
- Position 5 : BBC1
- Position 6 : BBC2
- Position 7 : ITV
- Position 8 : CH4

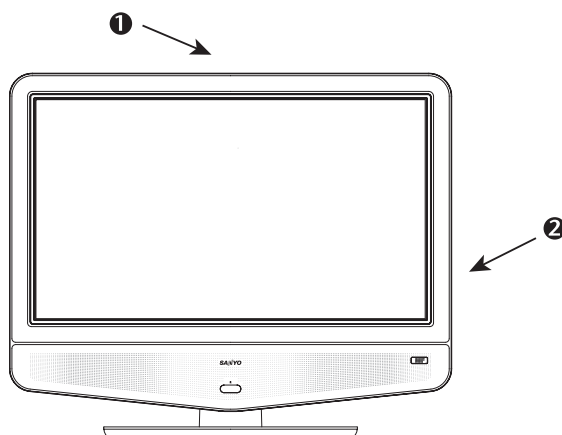
If any other channels are available in your reception area, the remaining stations will be stored from programme position 7 for UK and 9 for IRELAND in sequence as found.

If you move to another city or cable is installed, please follow the description "**Preset**". (on page 8).

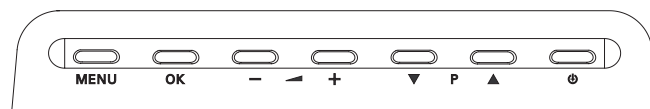
This procedure should only appear the first time you switch on your LCD.

## Terminals



### 1. On the top of LCD TV



Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to increase or decrease the programme position.

Press the **▲+** or **▲-** button to increase or decrease the sound volume.

Press the **⏻** button to switch the set into and out of Standby.

Press the **MENU** button to enter and exit sub menus.

Press the **OK** button to save a setting in a menu.

### 2. Left side terminals

To select the AV3 mode press the **TV/□** button repeatedly.

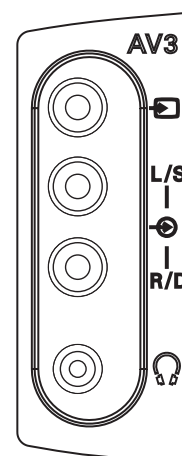
When the headphones are inserted the sound from the TV speakers is muted.

# REMOTE CONTROL

## TV/AV switch

To switch from TV, AV1, AV2 or AV3 mode press repeatedly.

## Screen mode selector

To select the screen mode, Auto, Natural, Full Cinema 1, Cinema 2, Subtitle or Normal. Refer to page 11.

## Stereo/Bilingual selector

To switch the sound mode as follows; **STEREO(NICAM)** or **MONO** in the stereo programmes. **A** or **B** in the bilingual programmes. If the **STEREO** sound reception is poor in quality, you can switch to **MONO** sound reception by pressing **A•B** button.

## Direct programme selector

For direct access to programmes using **(0-9) numeric buttons** in analogue and digital. For selection of programme position 10 - 99, for example 23, first press **-/-** button and press **2** and **3** numeric buttons.

## MENU

To enter and exit sub menus. Also see page 7.

## Volume up/down

To adjust the sound level.

## Picture mode selection

Press the **→←** button repeatedly to select the following picture modes.

**Personal** - Personal preference mode.

**Dynamic** - Suitable for brightly lit rooms.

**Standard** - Normal viewing mode.

**Eco** - Suitable for dimly lit rooms and gives a cinema - like effect.

## Surround mode selector

To select the surround mode, **ACTIVE**, or **OFF**.

## F/OK

To save the setting in the menu.

## Standby

To switch the TV on and off. Also see page 10.

## Programme information call

To display the programme information. You can also select colour systems in AV mode as follows **AUTO -> PAL -> NTSC->**

## CS button

Press button to scan through all available channels and back to the original channel.

## Programme swap

To switch between current and previous programme position watched.

## Programme up and down

To select the next programme number or previous programme number.

## Sound mute

To switch the sound from the speakers. The sound changes as follows;  
**Normal volume -> Mute**

## Bass selection

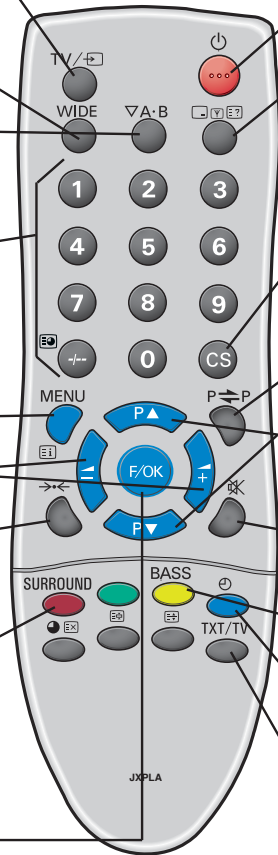
To get an emphasised bass sound **ON** or **OFF**.

## Time display

In the TV mode, if the teletext is available the teletext clock will be displayed on the screen. To remove the clock press the button again.

## Teletext/TV selector

To access this feature press the **TXT/TV** button the picture changes from **TV - TXT - MIX** and back to **TV**.





**Sound preset:** Rotates between Personal, Music, Talk and Normal settings.





**BBE:** To make the sound more natural, clearer and well defined.

Press the **MENU** button repeatedly to exit.

Select Brightness, Contrast, Colour etc. using the **P▲** and **P▼** buttons and adjust using the **▲+** and **▲-** buttons to obtain the best picture settings for your environment.

**Tint :** Colour phase if NTSC equipment is detected.

**Picture preset:** Rotates between your **Personal** settings, **Standard**, **Eco** and **Dynamic**.

**Dyn. Skin tone:** Makes the skin tone more realistic.

**Text brightness :** Brightness of Teletext screen Minimum / Middle / Maximum.

Press the **MENU** button repeatedly to exit.

## Setting menu

### ■ Child lock


You can prevent small children from operating the TV with the front buttons of the TV set.

1. Press the **MENU** button and select **Setting** using the **P▲** or **P▼** buttons, press the **▲+** button to enter.

2. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **Child lock**, select **On / Off** by pressing the **▲+** or **▲-** button.

Press the **MENU** button repeatedly to exit.

 The child lock mode will be reset to "Off" when the LCD TV set is disconnected completely from the adaptor power cord.

### ■ OSD language

1. Press the **MENU** button and select **Setting** using the **P▲** or **P▼** button, press the **▲+** button to enter.

2. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **OSD language**, select English by pressing the **▲+** or **▲-** button.

Press the **MENU** button repeatedly to exit.

### ■ Setting of AV2 input mode

If you use a VCR which has S-VHS, you should connect it to AV2 and change the AV2 menu to S-Video.

1. Press the **MENU button** and select **Setting** using the **P▲** or **P▼** button, press the **▶+ button** to enter.
2. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **AV2**, select **S-Video / Video** by pressing the **▶+** or **◀-** button.

Press the **MENU button** repeatedly to exit.

### ■ Off-timer setting

The Off timer will switch the TV set into the standby mode when the selected time has elapsed.

1. Press the **MENU button** and select **Setting** using the **P▲** or **P▼** button, press the **▶+ button** to enter.
2. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **Timer**, press the **▶+** button to enter.
3. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **Off timer**. Press the **▶+** or **◀-** button to select the time.

The time changes in 5 minute steps. The maximum time is 2:00hrs.

Once set the time will show on the screen with the remaining time for a few seconds.

Press the **MENU button** repeatedly to exit.

*☞ If the TV set is switched off by disconnecting the adaptor power cord, or by pressing the **⏻** button on the remote control, or during Auto sort, the timer settings will be cancelled.*

### ■ Alarm timer setting

This function can be set so that an alarm goes off. This only happens when the TV is switched on.

1. Press the **MENU button** and select **Setting** using the **P▲** or **P▼** button, press the **▶+ button** to enter.
2. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **Timer**, press the **▶+ button** to enter.
3. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select **Alarm timer**.
4. Press the **▶+** or **◀-** button to select the time.

The display changes in 1 minute steps and the maximum time period is 3:00 hours.

**When the time period is up, the time up signal will appear on the screen and the alarm will sound for approximately 10 seconds.**

**To cancel the alarm timer, press any button and the display will disappear.**

*☞ If the TV set is disconnected with the adaptor power cord, or switched off the Standby button on the remote control or a power failure occurs the timer settings will be cancelled.*



# MENU OPERATION

## Preset menu

The preset menu can be used to tune new channels, to reorder channels and their programme positions, and to make fine adjustments to the tuning.

The preset menu is used for the following.

**Program sort** : To rearrange channel positions after Auto sort.

**Auto sort**: To automatically search, sort and store all channels.

**Frequency** : To manually search and add channels. To fine tune existing channels.

### ■ Program sort

1. Press the **MENU button** and select **Preset** using the **P▲** or **P▼** button, press the **▲+ button** to enter.
2. Select **Program sort** using the **P▲** or **P▼** button. Using **▲+**, **▲-** buttons and **P▲** or **P▼** buttons. Select which channel you want to move eg. Programme position 4. (highlighted yellow). Press (Green) Move button, the programme position number turns green. Screen shows Move to ..... at the bottom of the screen.

3. Select programme position to move to eg. 2 . Press **Green Move** button again to move.
4. To delete a channel. Select the Programme position. ie.17. Press **Red** button. (highlights number red). Press **Red** button again to delete. Programme position 17 is now deleted.

Press the **Menu button** repeatedly to exit.

### ■ Auto sort

1. Press the **MENU button** and select **Preset**, press the **▲+ button** to enter.
2. Select **Country** by pressing the **P▲** or **P▼** buttons. Select (UK / IRE) by pressing the **▲+** or **▲-** buttons.
3. Select **Sound system** by pressing the **P▲** or **P▼** buttons. Select **S-3** by pressing the **▲+** or **▲-** buttons.

**System S-3 MUST be selected for correct sound in the UK and Ireland.**

4. Select **Auto sort** by pressing **P▲** or **P▼** buttons. Press the **F/OK button** to start automatically tuning, sorting and storing all available channels.

After completion Auto sort changes from Busy to OK?

4. Press the **MENU button** repeatedly to exit.

**Note** : Auto sort can be cancelled at any time by pressing any button except for the **F/OK** button.

: You can change the order of the station selection, by using the Program sort function.

### ■ Tuning - Frequency (Manual)

1. Press the **MENU button** and select **Preset**.
  2. Select **Programme position** using the **P▲** or **P▼** buttons and select the programme position where you wish to preset a channel using the **0-9**, **-/-**, buttons or **▲+**, **▲-** buttons.
  3. Select **Programme name** using the **P▲** or **P▼** buttons. Press the **▲+ button**, the first character space turns red. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** buttons until the number or first letter you require appears (0-9, A-Z, a-z, ?, !, -, +). Press the **▲+ button** to select the second character.
- You can assign 7 characters of information. When finished press the **▲+** button repeatedly until no character is highlighted.
4. Select **Frequency** by using the **P▲** or **P▼** button. (Refer to the channel table on page 9.)

You can either...

- a) Enter the frequency using the 0-9 buttons referring to the channel table.
- b) Press and hold the **▲+** or **▲-** buttons until the frequency starts scanning (about 5 seconds), scanning will stop when a channel is found.
- c) Keep pressing to de-tune the frequency.

Repeat above until the correct channel is found.

5. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select Memory. Press the **F/OK** button to store the new frequency.
6. Repeat for other programme positions if required.

### ■ Skip

**Skip ON** : In normal operation when the **P▲** or **P▼** button is pressed this position will be skipped.

**Skip OFF** : Position is not skipped when **P▲** or **P▼** button is pressed.

1. Press the **MENU button** select **Preset - Program. pos.**
2. Select a program position that you wish to Skip.
3. Select **Skip** by pressing the **P▼** button. Using the **▲+** or **▲-** buttons select On or Off.
4. Press the **P▲** or **P▼** button to select Memory. Press the **F/OK** button to memorise.

Press the **Menu button** repeatedly to exit.

☞ You can still view a programme position that has been skipped by using the 0-9 numeric buttons to select the programme position directly.

☞ To memorise any setting, using the **P▲** or **P▼** button select Memory and press the **F/OK** button.

# OPERATION

## Selecting of picture size

### ■ Screen options

Today there are various transmission formats with different size ratios, eg. 4:3, 14:9, 16:9 and video formats such as letterbox.

### ■ Auto

It automatically switches to the optimum screen mode according to the WSS signal provided in the receiving signal source. If the signal does not have it, the TV keeps current screen mode.

☞ This setting may cause the picture to change when a different format is received eg. when an advert is received.

☞ WSS (Wide screen signalling)

Some broadcasters transmit this signal and some VCR tapes have it included. The signal identifies the picture format ratio (16:9, 14:9, 4:3 etc.).

## TELETEXT / OTHER FEATURES

### Direct access to a page

All the numeric buttons can be used to select a page number directly. If you need page 301, press 3 then 0 and then 1.

### Sub page access

Some text pages are made up of several sub pages which rotate automatically. If you wish to view P4 of 8 press the sub page button. "----" will appear. Enter 0004 and it will appear.

### Index page selector

This selects one of the teletext index pages.

### Cursors

Press the button to select the next page or previous page number.

### Cancel

To view the TV picture in the teletext mode while waiting for sub page to change or page to update. Press again to return to teletext.

### Hold

This stops the sub pages from changing. The word "HOLD" will appear instead of the page number.

### Standby / Power on-off

To switch the TV ON and OFF.

### Reveal switch

This reveals hidden items on the teletext page eg: a hidden answer to a quiz question.

### Page up and down

Press the button to select the next page or previous page number.

### Direct access to subject headings

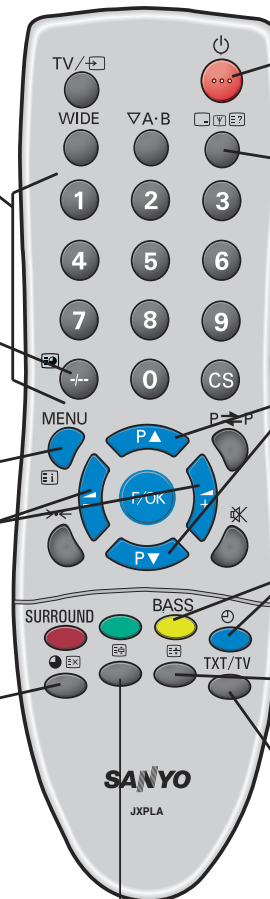
Coloured boxes are displayed at the bottom of the screen. The 4 coloured buttons give access to the corresponding subjects or pages.

### Size switch

This will make either the top half or the bottom half of the page expand to fill the whole screen.

### Teletext / TV

To access this feature press the TXT/TV button the picture changes from TV - TXT - MIX and back to TV.



## Other features

### ■ Switching into /from standby mode

The Standby mode is used for switching the TV set off for short periods of time. In standby mode the TV is switched off but is still receiving mains power.

- To turn the TV set into standby mode, press the **⏻** button. *The red power indicator illuminates more brightly.*
- To turn the TV set ON from standby mode, press any of the following buttons: **⏻**, **P▲**, **P▼** or **0-9** buttons.

If you find the power indicator flashing, please turn the TV set off with the Standby switch and disconnect the power cord from the power outlet and contact our Service desk.

This warning is a sign to let you know that the power protection function of this TV set is now operating.

### ■ Auto shut off

This TV set will automatically switch into the standby mode, 10 minutes after a signal is no longer received. The time until the set will switch off is displayed on the screen.

The following faults are not caused by the receiver:

#### "GHOSTS"

Reflections of signals from mountains or high buildings will cause multiple images, called "Ghosts". These abnormal conditions can be reduced to minimum by repositioning aerial or by installing new one suited for your area.

#### "INTERFERENCE"

Interference may be caused by electrical appliances, car ignition systems, etc. This should normally be a temporary condition, but should this interference persist, contact your dealer.

#### ■ Plug and Play.

If you do not fit an aerial into this TV set the Plug and Play feature may start up each time you switch on your LCD TV.
