

# SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

CAUTION: Please read and retain for your safety. This unit has been engineered and manufactured to assure your personal safety. But improper use can result in potential electric shock or line hazards. In order not to deleat the safeguards incorporated in this receiver observe the following basic rules for its installation, use and servicing.

#### Installation







**Do not** allow anything to rest on the power cord. **Do not** locate this television receiver where the cord will be damaged by people walking on it.

**Do not** overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in fire or electric shock.




Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation to ensure reliable operation and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The opening should never be covered with a cloth or other material, and the bottom openings should not be blocked by placing the television receiver on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This television receiver should never be placed near or over a radiator or heater.


This television receiver **should not** be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase unless proper ventilation is provided.



**Do not** place your television receiver on an unstable stand, shelf or table. Serious injury to an individual, and damage to the television may result if it should fall. Your sales person can recommend approved stands or shelf and wall mounting instructions.







If the television is built into a unit, or enclosed, the minimum distances for ventilation must be maintained. Heat build up can reduce the life of your television, and can be dangerous.

## Use








This television receiver should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the television or as indicated in the Operating Instructions. If you are not sure of the type of power supply in your home, consult your sales person or your local power company.



**Never** add accessories that have not been specifically designed for this television.






Do not expose the television receiver to rain or use near water. For example, near a bathtub, kitchen sink, in a wet basement, etc. Before cleaning, unplug the television receiver from the wall socket.



**Never** stand on, lean on or push suddenly the television or its stand. You should pay special attention to children. Serious injury may result if it should fall.



**Do not** apply liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners directly onto the television receiver. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

# INSTALLATION

# Step 1: Battery Installation


- 1. Remove the battery cover by sliding it in direction of the arrow.
- 2. Install two "AA" 1.5 volt batteries so that the "+" and "-" marks on the batteries match the "+" and "-" marks inside the unit.
- 3. Close the battery cover.
- Replace the batteries when the TV set is showing the following symptoms: Operation is unsteady or erratic, sometimes the TV does not work with the transmitter. Discharged batteries may leak and damage the unit. The normal life of batteries should be from nine to ten months.



# **Step 2: Aerial Connection**

Insert an aerial plug tightly into the aerial socket on the back of the TV set.

- For all aerial problems please consult your local dealer.
- The connection to the peripheral AV equipment, refer to section "USING AV EQUIPMENT" on pages 13 & 14.



## **Step 3: AC Cord Connection**


Connect the power cord of the TV set to a wall outlet.


The TV set is prepared for a mains voltage AC220~240V, 50Hz. When the TV set is not to be used for an extended period of time, it is advisable to disconnect the power cord from the power outlet.



#### **WARNING!**

High voltages are used in the operation of this set. Refer service to qualified service personnel.





#### Important:

This equipment is fitted with an approved non rewireable UK mains plug. To change a fuse in this type of plug proceed as follows:

- 1. Remove the fuse cover and fuse.
- Fit a new fuse which should be a BS1362 5Amp A.S.T.A. or BSI approved type.
- 3. Ensure that the fuse cover is correctly refitted.

If the fuse cover is lost or damaged the plug must **NOT** be used but replaced with a serviceable plug. If the fitted plug is not suitable for your socket outlets, it should be cut off and an appropriate plug fitted in its place. If the mains plug contains a fuse, this should have a rating of 5Amp,ensure the fuse cover is correctly fitted. If a plug without a fuse is used, the fuse at the distribution board should not be greater than 5Amp.

**Note:** The severed plug must be destroyed to avoid a possible shock hazard should it be inserted into a 13Amp socket elsewhere.

The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

Blue ----> Neutral Brown ---> Live

- The Blue wire must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter "N" or coloured BLACK.
- The Brown wire must be connected to the terminal with the letter "L" or coloured RED.
- Do not connect either wire to the earth terminal in the plug which is marked with the letter "E" or by the earth symbol or coloured GREEN or GREEN and YELLOW.

Before replacing the plug cover, make certain that the cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the lead - not simply over the wires.


# Step 4: Automatic Channel Set up

This TV set provides a self-automatic tuning and sorting function called "Plug & Play". The first time you switch on this TV set, it will automatically begin to search and store all available channels.

#### ■ Let's start!

Press the Mains ON/OFF switch on the front of the TV.


If no picture appears but the power indicator is on, press the  $^{ extstyle 0}$ P▲ P▲ or 0-9 button as the TV set is in the standby mode.




The power indicator illuminates red to show the power is on.

- Please make sure that the aerial cable is connected to the aerial socket of the TV set before switching-on.
- To receive a satellite broadcast, a satellite tuner is required. Before carrying out the automatic setting up procedure, the satellite receiver should be correctly tuned in.
- A self-automatic tuning and sorting system will be started as follows;

The tuning status and welcome messages will appear on the screen.



After completing this procedure, the ending message will appear on the screen.



To make this message disappear, press any of the control buttons.

Now the installation is completed !

#### Channel Sorting

The channels are stored in consecutive programme positions starting at programme position "7". After all receivable channels have been found and stored, the TV set automatically allocates the following major stations in the UK into the programme positions 1 to 6.

> BBC1 BBC2 CH4 **BBC-W** BBC-P SKY CH<sub>5</sub>

CH4: Channel 4 or S4C

SKY: SKY GOLD, SKY SPORTS.etc

BBC-W: BBC World, BBC Worldwide feature 1

BBC-P: BBC Prime

Programme position 1: BBC1 Programme position 2: BBC2 Programme position 3: ITV Programme position 4: CH4 or S4C

Programme position 5: CH5

Programme position 6: SKY, BBC-W or BBC-P

- If any of them are not available in your reception area, some programme positions from 1 to 6 will not have a stored station. The remaining stations will be stored from programme position 7 in sequence as found.
- The "Plug & Play" only appears the first time you switch on.
- If additional channels become available (you move to another city or cable is installed), please follow the description "PRESETTING". (on pages 16 & 17).





# Switching-on/off with mains switch

 To turn the TV set ON, press the Mains ON/OFF switch on the front of the TV.



The power indicator illuminates to show the power is on.

• To turn the TV set OFF, press it again.

If no picture appears but the power indicator is on, press the button, P♠, P▼ or 0-9 button as the TV set is in the Standby mode.

# Switching into/from standby mode

● To turn the TV set into standby mode, press the 🖰 button.

The power indicator illuminates more brightly.

- To turn the TV set ON from standby mode, press any of the following buttons: <sup>(1)</sup>, P♠, P♠ or 0-9 buttons.
- The Mains ON/OFF switch must be in the ON position before using the remote control handset.
- Standby mode is used for switching the TV set off for short periods of time. In standby mode the TV is switched off but is still receiving mains power.




If you find the power indicator flashing, please turn the TV set off completely with the Mains ON/OFF switch and contact our service desk.

This warning is a sign to let you know that the power protection function of this TV set is now operating.

# ■ Auto Shut Off

This TV set will automatically switch into the standby mode, 10 minutes after a signal is no longer received. The time until the set will switch off is displayed on the screen.




- If the aerial is removed the TV set will automatically switch into the standby mode after 10 minutes.
- When the TV set is switched on by using the On-timer function with no signal being received, the auto-shut off function will be ignored.

# **Programme Selection**

#### ■ Up/Down Programme Selection

Press the P▲ button to increase the programme position. Press the P▼ button to decrease the programme position.



#### **■** Direct Programme Selection

For selection of programme position 0 to 9, press the corresponding **numeric button (0-9)** on the remote control. For selection of programme position 10-99, for example 23, first press the **-/-- button** and enter **2** then **3**.

#### **Channel Selection**

#### ■ If you know the channel number of the station

- Press the CS button on the remote control handset. The current channel number, programme position and channel ID if available will be displayed on the screen.
- 2. Enter the channel number using the 0-9 numeric buttons.

For example: To enter channel number 2 enter **0** and **2**.

To enter channel number 35 enter **3** and **5**.

 While the screen display is still on the screen, press the F. OK button on the remote control handset to store into the memory.

The programme and channel number will momentarily flash.


# ■ If you do not know the channel number of the station

- Press the CS button on the remote control handset. The current channel number, programme position and channel ID if available will be displayed on the screen.
- Press the P▲ or P▼ button to start channel searching. When a station is found searching stops automatically.

If this is not the desired station repeat until the desired station is found.

While the screen display is still on the screen, press the F. DK
 button on the remote control handset to store into the memory.

The programme and channel number will momentarily flash.



# **Sound & Picture Settings**

#### ■ Sound volume control

To adjust the sound volume, press the + / - button.




#### ■ Sound Attenuation

This function has two sound mute stages. Press the **★ button** once, the sound from the speakers will be reduced, press it again and it will be muted completely.

Press the **Kbutton** again to switch the sound back on.

When the + / - button is pressed, the sound attenuation is cancelled.



#### ■ Control selection and adjustment

For picture setting adjustment, press the F. OK button repeatedly to select your desired control and then press the + or - button.

#### Picture Controls

**CONTRAST**: To adjust the picture contrast.

BRIGHTNESS: To adjust the picture brightness.

**COLOUR:** To adjust the picture colour.

TINT: To adjust the colour phase (appears when receiving a NTSC


signal only).

SHARPNESS: To adjust the picture sharpness.

TEXT BRIGHTNESS: To select the teletext brightness level of the

teletext mode.

**FINE TUNING**: To make fine adjustments to tuning. (appears in TV mode only)




#### Sound Controls

**BASS**: To adjust low frequency sounds. **TREBLE**: To adjust high frequency sounds.

BALANCE : To equalise the output from the left and right speakers.


# ■ Picture adjustment using the menu function

 Press the MENU button to display the main menu. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the PICTURE menu.




2. Press the F - OK button

 Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the desired control from the menu eg. BRIGHTNESS.



4. When pressing the ◀ or ▶ button once, the screen display will change for selected control mode, press and hold button to change desired picture control level. The mode returns to control selecting mode in 2 seconds if no key is pressed.



Repeat steps 3-4 for setting the proper picture levels.


To return to the TV mode, press the MENU button.

#### ■ Sound adjustment using the menu function

 Press the MENU button to display the main menu. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the SOUND menu.



- Press the F. /OK button on the remote control handset or the OK button on the TV front panel.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the desired control from the menu eg. BASS.



To return to the TV mode, press the MENU button.

# Picture mode selection and personal preference setting

This TV provides three predefined picture modes and one adjustable personal picture preference mode. You can choose your preferred picture mode by pressing the →•← button repeatedly.


PERSONAL: Personal preference mode.

STANDARD: Normal viewing mode.

ECO: Low contrast, brightness and colour picture setting (Suitable for dimly lit rooms and gives a cinema-like effect when the lights are switched off, or Economical mode).


**DYNAMIC** 

: High contrast, brightness and colour picture setting (Suitable for brightly lit rooms).



# ■ To store your personal preference into "PERSONAL" mode

 Press the MENU button to display the main menu. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the PICTURE menu and press the F. OK button.



 Adjust picture controls to your preferred control level by using the A,▼ or ◄, ► buttons.

 Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the PERSONAL menu and press the F / OK button. The control window will momentary blink to show the memorisation.



To return to the TV mode, press the MENU button.


The fine tuning control level will not be memorised into the "PERSONAL" mode.

#### **■** Child Lock

This TV has a child lock function which inhibits the use of the buttons on the front of the TV set. With this you can prevent small children unexpectedly pressing buttons.

#### SETTING

- Press the MENU button to display the main menu. Use the ▲ or
   button to highlight the SETTING menu.
- 2. Press the F. OK button.
- Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the CHILD LOCK menu. Select "ON" or "OFF" by pressing the ◄ or ▶ button.



To return to the TV mode, press the MENU button.


To cancel the child lock mode, follow the above procedure and you should select "OFF" in step 3 or switching off the TV set with the Mains ON/OFF ① switch.

#### ■ Programme Information Display

Press the button once, the programme information such as current programme number, stereo status, remaining timer if set and colour system.

#### **■** Previous Programme Selection

Press the P≠P button and the TV set will alternately select the current programme position and the previous programme position viewed.



#### ■ Time Display

In the TV mode, if the receiving programme has a teletext service when the  $\Theta$  **button** is pressed, the present time will be displayed on the screen for 5 seconds.

# **SCREEN OPTIONS**

# WSS (Wide-Screen-Signaling)

This function is to be automatically set to the optimum screen mode for the wide screen television according to the aspect ratio bits of the picture format (16:9, 14:9, 4:3, etc.) on the teletext broadcast. To use this function, the picture mode should be selected to the "AUTO" mode and the picture format information is available on the teletext service.

#### **Selection of Picture Sizes**

The size of the picture image can be selected in many modes, the resultant picture will depend upon the transmission format. Currently pictures are transmitted in a variety of aspect ratios, eg. 4:3, 16:9, 14:9 or video formats such as letterbox.

To select the picture modes press the WIDE button, each time

To select the picture modes press the **WIDE button**, each time it is pressed the mode changes as follows.

#### **■** AUTO

4:3: This will automatically switch to the NATURAL WIDE mode.

**14:9:** This will automatically switch to the NATURAL WIDE mode.

**16:9:** This will automatically switch to the NATURAL WIDE mode.

**LETTERBOX:** Automatically detects the black bands at the top and bottom of the screen and switches to ZOOM 16:9 mode.

#### **■ NATURAL WIDE**

**4:3:** Stretches the picture horizontally and fills the screen, the picture is more stretched at the sides.

14:9: Height is expanded to fill screen.

**16:9:** Fills the whole screen with the correctly proportioned picture.

**LETTERBOX:** The black bars top and bottom remain and the height is compressed to fit into the picture area.

#### **■ ZOOM (14:9)**

4:3: The correct picture width is maintained but the top and bottom of the picture are cropped.

14:9: Zooms in slightly cropping the top and bottom.

16:9: Zooms in slightly cropping the top and bottom.

**LETTERBOX:** The black bars top and bottom are smaller and the pictures height is compressed slightly.

#### **■ TITLE IN (14:9)**

4:3: Zoom as zoom 14:9 but the bottom half of the picture is compressed to show more image to include sub titles.

**14:9:** The bottom half of the picture is compressed to show sub titles.

**16:9:** The bottom half of the picture is compressed to show sub titles.

**LETTERBOX:** The bottom half of the picture is compressed to show more image to include sub titles. A small black bar becomes visible.

#### **■ ZOOM (16:9)**

**4:3:** The correct picture width is maintained but the top and bottom of the picture are cropped more than in zoom 14:9.

**14:9:** Zooms in slightly cropping the top and bottom more than in zoom 14:9.

**16:9:** Zooms in slightly cropping the top and bottom more than in zoom 14:9.

**LETTERBOX:** Fills the screen with the correct proportions with no black bars.

#### **■ TITLE IN (16:9)**

As Zoom 14:9 TITLE-IN but the picture is compressed more at the bottom.

#### **■ FULL**

4:3: The whole screen is filled stretching the width.

14:9: The whole screen is filled with the height slightly expanded at the edges.

**16:9:** The whole screen is filled with the correct aspect ratio. **LETTERBOX:** A black bar is present top and bottom with the picture compressed to fit the height.

#### **■ NORMAL**

**4:3:** The correct ratio is maintained giving black bars left and right.

**14:9:** Black bars left and right the height is stretched to fill the height.

16:9: Black bars left and right the height is stretched to fill the height.

LETTERBOX: Black bars left and right and top and bottom.


# **Selection of Surround Mode**

Press the **SURROUND button** repeatedly, the surround mode changes as follows;

VIRTUAL DOLBY SURROUND -> ACTIVE 3D SURROUND -> SURROUND OFF ->

# ■ VIRTUAL DOLBY SURROUND

This mode is recommended to watch a movie or programme which is encoded with Dolby Surround. It is marked with **Dolby Surround.** You can obtain the Dolby Surround effect through the left and right front speakers.



## What is Virtual Dolby Surround?

Home theatre surround systems normally use five speakers: three across the front (L, C, R) and two surround speakers on the sides. A virtual surround system attempts to create the same surround effect produced by a multichannel system using the left and right speakers.

#### **■ ACTIVE 3D SURROUND**

This mode is recommended when you wish to add the surround sound to a programme not encoded with Dolby Surround or movie. This TV provides an active 3D surround processor which can create a 3 dimensional sound effect when receiving a standard stereo signal, bilingual signal or monaural signal.

You can choose the following 3D surround modes by pressing the ◀ or ▶ button while the active 3D surround display is still on the screen.

ACTIVE: Normal 3D surround sound, set to give the optimum 3D

surround effect.

MONO: This mode is specially prepared for Nicam-mono broadcasting. Select this mode, when you can not get the 3D surround effects even if the status is Nicam stereo. You

may feel 3D surround effect.

#### **■ SURROUND OFF**

This mode reproduces only the left and right front sound signals. The rear and centre speakers are not active.

#### What is Active 3D surround?

In traditional stereo sound, left and right channels combine to create a stereo image. Better speakers can create a larger perceived sound stage, so sound seems to emanate from a few feet behind the monitor. Sound can have a much wider presence with Active 3D surround technologies. Music and sound effects appear to come from points in the room far from the speakers. Objects (such as jets) seem to move towards and then past the listener, whilst the important channel sound still appears to come from the centre of the screen.






■ Guidance for the best enjoyment of active 3D surround and Virtual Dolby Surround

#### Optimum positioning

- Sit at a distance of approximately 2 to 4 meters from the TV set.
- Listen facing the centre of the TV set.
- Remove any obstructions between you and the TV set.






## BBE™ ON/OFF

 Press the MENU button to display the main menu. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the SOUND menu.



- 2. Press the F. /OK button on the remote control handset.
- 3. Use the ▲ or ▼ button to highlight the BBE menu.



4. Press the ◀ or ▶ button to switch the mode ON or OFF.

To return to the TV mode, press the MENU button.

You can choose your preferred bass mode by pressing the **BASS** button repeatedly.



# **Stereo Bilingual Reception**


#### ■ Nicam sound reception

If the TV receives nicam programs, it automatically switches to nicam sound reception. The word "NICAM" appears on the screen briefly.



#### ■ Bilingual reception

If the TV receives bilingual programs, the TV initially selects language A and displays "A" on the screen briefly. If you want to switch to language B or Mono, press the **VA-B button**.



If the nicam sound reception is poor in quality, you can switch to "MONO" sound reception by pressing the ∇A-B button.

## **USING AV EQUIPMENT**

You can connect a VCR, S-VHS VCR, Satellite Tuner, PAY TV Decoder or Camcorder, to this TV via the SCART terminals and the front AV terminals

#### ■ Selection of AV mode


Most AV equipment will automatically switch to the AV mode (because of the pin 8 function signal) by pressing the PLAY button on your AV equipment. If not, press the TV/€ button to select the desired AV mode manually.

#### ■ Setting of AV2 input mode



#### Picture & Sound in teletext mode

Picture and Text brightness controls in the teletext mode.

You can not adjust the picture or teletext brightness in the teletext mode. You must first switch back to the TV mode and then adjust the picture control or set the teletext brightness level.

#### How to set the teletext brightness level

 Press the F / OK button repeatedly in the TV mode until the word "TEXT BRIGHTNESS" appears on the screen.





Some teletext pages are made up of several sub pages. These sub pages are automatically changed. Sub page is shown as P4/8 (sub page 4 of 8 pages) the location on the text page depends on the text service.



#### **■** Double Letter Height

Either the top half or the bottom half of the page can be expanded to fill the whole screen by pressing the 🖹 button.

#### **■** Displaying Concealed Information

Press the **button** to reveal hidden items on the text page.

Some pages such as quiz pages have the answers hidden. The button may have to be held to keep the answer on the screen, or pressed again to remove the answers.

Sometimes the page access can take some time. While waiting you can view the TV picture by pressing the  $\bullet \boxtimes$  button.

- When the page is found, the page number will appear over the TV picture.

# SERVICING & HELPFUL HINTS

# Servicing

Your television is fully transistorised and does not contain any user serviceable components.

Removal of the cabinet cover may expose you to dangerous voltages. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

Unplug the television receiver from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- If the power cord or plug is damaged.
- If liquid has been spilt into the television receiver.
- If television receiver has been exposed to rain or water.
- If the television receiver has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- If the television receiver exhibits a distinct change in performance.
- If the television receiver does not operate normally by following the operating instructions.

Adjust only those controls that are covered in the operating instructions as improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage. This will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the television receiver to normal operation.

When replacement parts are required, have the service technician verify that the replacements he uses have the same safety characteristics as the original parts. Use of manufacturers specified replacements can prevent fire, shock or other hazards.
