

In addition, this unit can play a CD-R or CD-RW that contains audio titles or MP3 files.

### **Notes**

- Depending on the conditions of the recording equipment or the CD-R/RW disc itself, some CD-R/RW discs cannot be played on the unit.
- The unit cannot play the CD-R/RW discs that contain no data, or contain different kinds of formatted data other than MP3 and CD-DA data.
- Do not attach any seal or label to either side (the labeled side or the recorded side) of a disc.
- Do not use irregular shaped CDs (e.g., heart-shaped or octagonal). It may result in malfunctions.

### Notes on DVDs and Video CDs

Some playback operations of DVDs and Video CDs may be intentionally fixed by software manufacturers. As this unit plays DVDs and Video CDs according to disc content designed by the software manufacturer, some playback features of the unit may not be available, or other functions may be added.

Refer also to the instructions supplied with the DVDs and Video CDs. Some DVDs made for business purposes may not be played on the unit.

#### Regional code of the DVD+VCR and DVDs

This DVD+VCR is designed and manufactured for playback of region "2" encoded DVD software. The region code on the labels of some DVD discs indicates which type of player can play those discs. This unit can play only DVD discs labeled "2" or "ALL". If you try to play any other discs, the message "Check Regional Code" will appear on the TV screen. Some DVD discs may not have a region code label even though their playback is prohibited by area limits.

### Note on DTS-encoded CDs

To avoid possible damage to the audio system, turn down the volume before playing back such discs, adjust the volume gradually, and keep the volume level low. To enjoy DTS Digital Surround™ playback, an external 5.1 channel DTS Digital Surround™ decoder system must be connected to the digital output of the unit.

#### **Disc-related terms**

#### Title (DVD only)

The main film content or accompanying feature content or additional feature content, or music album. Each title is assigned a title reference number enabling you to locate it easily.

#### Chapter (DVD only)

Sections of a picture or a musical piece that are smaller than titles.

A title is composed of one or several chapters. Each chapter is assigned a chapter number, enabling you to locate the chapter you want. Depending on the disc, no chapters may be recorded.

#### Track (Video CD and audio CD only)

Sections of a picture or a musical piece on a video CD or an audio CD. Each track is assigned a track number, enabling you to locate the track you want.

#### Scene

On a video CD with PBC (Playback control) functions, moving pictures and still pictures are divided into sections called "Scenes". Each scene is displayed in the menu screen and assigned a scene number, enabling you to locate the scene you want.

A scene is composed of one or several tracks.

#### Types of video CDs

There are two types of video CDs:

#### Video CDs equipped with PBC (Version 2.0)

PBC (Playback control) functions allow you to interact with the system via menus, search functions, or other typical computer-like operations. Moreover, still pictures of high resolution can be played if they are included in the disc.

#### Video CDs not equipped with PBC (Version 1.1)

Operated in the same way as audio CDs, these discs allow playback of video pictures as well as sound, but they are not equipped with PBC.

### Before Use (Cont'd)

#### **Precautions**

#### Handling the unit

#### When shipping the unit

The original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For maximum protection, re-pack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.

#### When setting the unit

The picture and sound of a nearby TV or radio may be distorted during playback. In this case, position the unit away from the TV or radio, or turn off the unit after removing the disc.

Do not install this equipment in a confined space, such as a book case or built in cabinet.

#### To keep the surface clean

Do not use volatile liquids, such as insecticide spray, near the unit. Do not leave rubber of plastic products in contact with the unit for a long period of time. They will leave marks on the surface.

#### Cleaning the unit

#### To clean the cabinet

Use a soft, dry cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, use a soft cloth lightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use strong solvents, such as alcohol, benzine, or thinner, as these might damage the surface of the unit.

#### To obtain a clear picture

The DVD+VCR is a high-tech, precision device. If the optical pick-up lens and disc drive parts are dirty or worn down, the picture quality will be poor.

Regular inspection and maintenance are recommended after every 1,000 hours of use. (This depends on the operating environment.)

### **Notes on Discs**

#### Handling discs

Do not touch the playback side of the disc.

Hold the disc by the edges so that fingerprints will not get on the surface.

Do not stick paper or tape on the disc.






#### Storing discs

After playing, store the disc in its case. Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or sources of heat, or leave it in a parked car exposed to direct sunlight, as there may be a considerable temperature increase inside the car.

#### Cleaning discs

Fingerprints and dust on the disc can cause poor picture quality and sound distortion. Before playing, clean the disc with a clean cloth. Wipe the disc from the center out.



Do not use strong solvents such as alcohol, benzine, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or anti-static spray intended for older vinyl records.

### **Setting the Output Source**

You must select one of your output sources (DVD or VCR) to view on the TV screen.

- If you want to view output source of DVD deck: Press DVD on the remote or DVD/VCR on the front panel until DVD indicator on the front panel lights and output source of DVD deck is viewed on the TV screen.
- If you want to view output source of VCR deck: Press VCR on the remote or DVD/VCR on the front panel until VCR indicator on the front panel lights and output source of VCR deck is viewed on the TV screen.
- To select output source, press the OUTPUT SELECT button on the remote control. Please see below.
   Note the DVD+VCR must be tuned into the TV stations before this feature can operate correctly.

Operates only after Auto Tuning operation.

Cycles through the 3 main output views: DVD, Tuner and VCR.

DVD: To view the current DVD deck status. (disc playback,





### **Remote Control**

#### DVD/VCR select button



This remote control uses the same buttons for VCR and DVD functions (ex. PLAY).

When using a VCR, first press the VCR button. When using a DVD, first press the DVD button.



Connect to a TV with video inputs.

Do not touch the inner pins of the jacks on the rear panel. Electrostatic discharge may cause permanent damage to the DVD+VCR.

### Note Note

The EURO AV2 socket is used for signal input only. DECODER is shown but this DVD+VCR does not have it.

#### **Remote Control Operation Range**

Point the remote control at the remote sensor and press the buttons.

- Distance: About 7m (23ft) from the front of the remote sensor
- Angle: About 30° in each direction of the front of the remote sensor

#### Remote control battery installation



Detach the battery cover on the rear of the remote control, and insert two R03 (size AAA) batteries with • and • aligned correctly.

Do not mix old and new batteries. Never mix different types of batteries (standard, alkaline, etc.).

### **Connections**

### T<sub>Tips</sub>

- Depending on your TV and other equipment you wish to connect, there are various ways you could connect the DVD+VCR.
- Please refer to the manuals of your TV, Stereo System or other devices as necessary to make the best connections.
- For better sound reproduction, connect this DVD+VCR's AUDIO OUT jacks to the audio in jacks of your amplifier, receiver, stereo or audio/video equipment. See "Connecting to Optional Equipment" on page 11.

### **⚠** Caution

- Make sure the DVD+VCR is connected directly to the TV. Set the TV to the correct video input channel.
- Do not connect the DVD+VCR's AUDIO OUT jack to the phono in jack (record deck) of your audio system.

# Connecting to a TV & Satellite

#### Receiver

 Make one of the following connections, depending on the capabilities of your existing equipment.

#### **Basic connection (AV)**

- Connect the EURO AV1 AUDIO/VIDEO on the rear panel of the DVD+VCR to the scart input socket on the TV using a SCART lead (S).
- **2** You can connect such a Satellite, Cable or Digital set top box to the DVD+VCR (**D**).

#### Basic connection (RF)

- Connect the RF aerial cable (A) from your indoor/ outdoor aerial to AERIAL jack on the rear panel of DVD+VCR.
- **2** Connect the supplied RF aerial cable (**R**) from the RF.OUT jack on the rear panel of DVD+VCR to your television's Aerial Input.

#### **DVD** exclusive out connection

- You can only watch the DVD playback.
- Connect the VIDEO OUT jack on the DVD+VCR's DVD EXCLUSIVE OUT to the video in jack on the TV using the supplied video cable (V).
- Connect the Left and Right AUDIO OUT jacks of DVD+VCR's DVD EXCLUSIVE OUT to the audio left/ right in jacks on the TV using the supplied audio cables (A2).

**POWER:** This DVD+VCR operates on a mains supply of 200-240V~, 50Hz.

This appliance is supplied with BS 1363 approved 13 Amp fused mains plug. When replacing the fuse always use a 5 Amp BS 1362 approved type. Never use this plug with the fuse cover omitted. To obtain a replacement fuse cover contact your

supplying dealer.

If the mains sockets in your home differ, or are not suitable for the type of plug supplied, then the plug should be removed and a suitable type fitted.

If the mains plug becomes severed from the mains lead it must be destroyed. A mains plug with bared wires is hazardous if engaged in a mains output line socket.

If a 13 Amp BS 1363 plug is not suitable or any other type of plug used, then this appliance must be protected by a 5 Amp fuse.

#### Should you need to change the plug

The wires in this mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following codes

BLUE ~ Neutral


BROWN ~ Live

As the colours of the wires in the mains lead of this appliance may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug proceed as follows: The wire which is coloured BLUE must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter N or coloured BLUE or BLACK.

The wire which is coloured BROWN must be connected to the terminal which is marked with the letter L or coloured BROWN or RED.

DO NOT connect either wire to the EARTH terminal.

### **Connecting to Optional Equipment**

# Connecting to an amplifier equipped with two channel analog stereo or Dolby Surround

Connect the Left and Right AUDIO OUT jacks on the DVD+VCR to the audio left and right in jacks on your amplifier, receiver or stereo system, using the supplied audio cables (A2).

# Connecting to an amplifier equipped with two channel digital stereo (PCM) or to an Audio/Video receiver equipped with a multi-channel decoder (Dolby Digital™, MPEG 2 or DTS)

- Connect the DVD+VCR's DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack (COAXIAL X) to the corresponding in jack on your amplifier. Use an optional digital (coaxial X) audio cable.
- 2 You will need to activate the DVD+VCR's digital output. (See "Digital Audio Output" on page 19).


#### **Digital Multi-channel sound**

A digital multi-channel connection provides the best sound quality. For this you need a multi-channel Audio/Video receiver that supports one or more of the audio formats supported by your DVD+VCR (MPEG 2, Dolby Digital and DTS). Check the receiver manual and the logos on the front of the receiver.

#### Warning:

Due to the DTS Licensing agreement, the digital output will be in DTS digital out when DTS audio stream is selected.


- If the audio format of the digital output does not match the capabilities of your receiver, the receiver will produce a strong, distorted sound or no sound at all.
- To see the audio format of the current DVD in the On-Screen Display, press AUDIO.

# Accessory Audio/Video (A/V) Connections to DVD+VCR

Connect the **AV INPUT** jacks on the DVD+VCR to the audio/video out jacks on your accessory component, using the optional audio/video cables.

#### Video channel Set

Video channel (RF output channel) is the channel on which your TV receives picture and sound signals from the DVD+VCR through the RF aerial cable.


If you have used a **SCART** lead you will not have to tune your TV, simply select the **AV** channel. The **AV** channel is already pre-tuned for optimum video playback on your TV.

Perform the following steps only if interference appears in the TV picture after you have moved to a different area or a new station has started broadcasting in your area, or if you change the connection from RF connection to AV connection. or vise versa.

- Turn on DVD+VCR and TV.
- 2 Set the vacant position 22 on your TV.
- Press 0/1 on the remote control to enter the standby mode (the clock indicator will be dimmed).
- Press and hold CHANNEL + or on the DVD+VCR for more than 4 secs.

RF 22 will appear in the DVD+VCR display.

The following picture will be displayed on the TV screen.



Press CHANNEL + or - on the DVD+VCR to set the video channel to a vacant position between 22 and 68 which is not occupied by any local station in your area.

### Note

The RF channel will not change until step 6 has been executed.

Fress o/ito store the new RF channel into the DVD+VCR.

Press ⊕/Ito bring the DVD+VCR from standby to on and follow your TV manufacturers tuning instruction manual to tune a new channel to the DVD+VCR.


#### Using your DVD+VCR for the very first time

For the following steps we assume that you have just connected your DVD+VCR for the very first time. To make tuning TV stations an easy task your DVD+VCR incorporates the **Automatic Channel Memory System (ACMS)**. This system will automatically tune and store TV channels in VIDEO Plus+ System order to your DVD+VCR.


While this is happening the clock (date & time) in the DVD+VCR will be set automatically.

- Make sure that you have correctly installed your DVD+VCR.
- Press ७/। to turn on your DVD+VCR.

If the initial Menu Screen doesn't appear on screen, make sure that you have tuned your TV to a video channel. Or if this is correct it may mean that your DVD+VCR is already tuned.



Press OK to start the automatic tuning process.



After storing all available TV stations your DVD+VCR will sort them into VIDEO Plus+ System order.


#### How to use the main menu

This DVD+VCR can easily be programmed by using the menus displayed on screen.

The menus are controlled from the Remote Control Handset.

**1** Switch on your TV set and DVD+VCR by pressing ७/।.

**Press i.**The main menu will appear on the TV screen.



• REC

Timer recording setting (see p. 24-25).

• PR SET

Manual tuning setting (see p. 14).

ACMS

ACMS (Automatic Channel Memory System) (see right column).

• TIME DATE

Date & clock setting (see p. 16).

SYSTEM

To set the Colour TV System (see p. 16).

ABC OSD

To change the language setting for OSD. You can select the language from English, Russian, German, French and Polish.

• Dr.

To check a problem with your DVD+VCR (see p. 31).

F.OSD ON/OFF

To display the operational mode of your DVD+VCR (see p. 31).

To select the aspect ratio of your TV (see p. 32).

### Tuning in TV Stations Automatically

Should you wish to perform the **Automatic Channel Memory System (ACMS)** again please follow the guidance given on this page. You may tune up to 88 TV stations into your DVD+VCR.


After automatic tuning has taken place please check that TV stations have been placed in Video Plus+ system order otherwise you will be unable to successfully use this excellent feature.

¶ Press ७/1 to turn on your DVD+VCR.

Press i.

The main menu will appear on the TV screen.

Press ✓ or ► to select ACMS and press OK.




Press OK again to start the automatic tuning process.



After storing all available TV stations your DVD+VCR will sort them into VIDEO Plus+ System order.

While automatic tuning is taking place the time and date will set automatically. If - - : - - appears in the DVD+VCR display it means that the broadcast signal is weak and the clock was not set. Please turn to **CLOCK SET** section of this book on page 16.




Press i to remove the menus from the TV screen.

### Tuning in TV Stations Manually


In certain areas of the country broadcast signals may be too weak for your DVD+VCR's automatic tuning process to find or assign TV stations correctly. This is important because you will only be able to successfully record TV programmes using VIDEO Plus+System if your DVD+VCR has stored them in a set order. You must tune in these weaker broadcast stations manually in order for your DVD+VCR to store them. Remember for VIDEO Plus+ System to work correctly TV stations must be stored in VIDEO Plus+System order.


**1 Press i.** The main menu will appear on the TV screen.

Press ✓ or ► to select PR SET and press OK.




Press i and press ▲ or ▼ to select the programme number that you want to tune (for example, PR 06). Press OK.






Enter the channel number of station that you want to tune with the numerical buttons.



Searching will stop when it locates a station.

If the station transmits PDC, the station name will be added automatically.

Control the fine tuning of the station by pressing  $lack \bullet$  or  $lack {lack}lack$ .




Press ► to select STATION and press OK.

The TV station name list will appear.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select a station name from the list and press OK to select it.


If your station name isn't on the list do not press **OK**, but go to stage **7**.




You can change a TV station name manually rather than using the "standard" names.

Press ▶ and press ▲ or ▼ to select letters and numbers for the new station name.

Press ◀ or ▶ to move back and forth between characters. Press OK.



Press i, confirm the station placement.



Press i to remove the menus from the TV screen.

Your new TV station has now been tuned into your DVD+VCR.

Press ◀ or ▶ to select PR SET and press OK.





Press ▲ or ▼ to select the programme number you want to delete (for example, PR 03).



Press ◀.

After a short while, the selected station will be deleted.

If you wish to delete other TV stations repeat stages 1 - 3.

#### How to select Stored TV stations:

Stored TV stations can be selected in either of two ways.

Press ▲ or ▼ to select different stations that are tuned into your DVD+VCR.

You may also directly select stations using the **numerical buttons** on the remote control.

### Setting the clock Manually

The clock in your DVD+VCR controls time, day and date settings for your DVD+VCR.

For VIDEO Plus+ system to work correctly the correct time and date must be set. The clock is set automatically during ACMS (Automatic Channel Memory System) when your DVD+VCR detects a channel that broadcasts a Teletext signal.

If the broadcast signal is weak the clock will not be set and will require setting manually.

Press i. Press ◀

Press ◀ or ▶ to select TIME DATE and press OK.

The auto adjust mode can be set to "OFF" by pressing ▲ or ▼ if you want to set the time manually.






### To set the colour system

Your DVD+VCR is equipped with dual colour standard, you can play back a tape in PAL and MESECAM. During playback your DVD+VCR detects the colour system automatically.

If there is any colour problem please select the colour system manually.

Press i.

The main menu will appear on the TV screen.



Press ◀ or ▶ to select the SYSTEM.
Press OK.



Press ▲ or ▼ to select according to the COLOUR system used.



#### AUTO:

Allows PAL or MESECAM signals to be distinguished automatically.

#### PAL:

Use when receiving PAL signals or use when playing back a tape recorded in PAL system.

#### MESECAM:

Use when receiving MESECAM signals or use when playing back a tape recorded in MESECAM system

Press i to remove the menus from the TV screen.

### **General Explanation**

This manual gives the basic instructions for operating the DVD+VCR. Some DVDs require specific operation or allow only limited operation during playback. When this occurs, the symbol ⊘ appears on the TV screen, indicating that the operation is not permitted by the DVD+VCR or is not available on the disc.

### **On-Screen Display**

The general playback status can be displayed on the TV screen. Some items can be changed on the menu.

### On-screen display operation

Press DISPLAY during playback.

Press ▲/▼ to select an item.

The selected item will be highlighted.

Press ◆► to change the setting of an item.

The numerical buttons can be also be used for setting numbers (e.g., title number). For some functions, press SELECT/OK to execute the setting.

- **4:3 Panscan:** Select when a standard 4:3 TV is connected. Displays pictures cropped to fill your TV screen. Both sides of the picture are cut off.
- 16:9 Wide: Select when a 16:9 wide TV is connected.

#### Sound


#### **Digital Audio Output**

Each DVD disc has a variety of audio output options. Set the DVD+VCR's Digital Audio Output according to the type of audio system you use.

**DOLBY DIGITAL/PCM:** Select "DOLBY DIGITAL/PCM" if you connected the DVD+VCR's DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack to a Dolby Digital decoder (or an amplifier or other equipment with a Dolby Digital decoder).

**Stream/PCM:** Select "Stream/PCM" if you connected the DVD+VCR's DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack to an amplifier or other equipment with a DTS decoder, Dolby Digital decoder or MPEG decoder.

**PCM:** Select when connected to a 2-channel digital stereo amplifier. The DVD+VCR output sounds in the PCM 2ch format when you play a DVD video disc recorded with a Dolby Digital, MPEG1, or MPEG2 recording system.



### Sample Frequency

To change the Sample Frequency setting, first select the desired Digital Audio Output as indicated as above. If your receiver or amplifier is NOT capable of handling 96KHz signals, select 48KHz. When this choice is made, this unit will automatically convert any 96KHz signals to 48KHz so your system can decode them. If your receiver or amplifier is capable of handling 96KHz signals, select 96KHz. When this choice is made, this unit will pass each type of signal through without any further processing.

#### **Others**

The DRC, Vocal and PBC settings can be changed.

 Press ▲/▼ to select the desired item and press SELECT/OK. The setting of the selected item is changed between On and Off.



#### **Dynamic Range Control (DRC)**

With the DVD format, you can hear a programme's soundtrack in the most accurate and realistic presentation possible, thanks to digital audio technology. However, you may wish to compress the dynamic range of the audio output (the difference between the loudest sounds and the quietest ones). Then, you may listen to a movie at a lower volume without losing clarity of sound. Set DRC to On for this effect.

#### Vocal

Set Vocal to On only when a multi-channel karaoke DVD is playing. The karaoke channels on the disc will mix into a normal stereo sound.

#### **PBC**

CDs.

Set Playback Control (PBC) to On or Off.

On: Video CDs with PBC are played according to the PBC. Off: Video CDs with PBC are played the same way as Audio

### **Before Operation (Continued) - DVD part**

#### **Parental Control**

#### Rating DVD

Movies on DVDs may contain scenes not suitable for children. Therefore, discs may contain Parental Control information that applies to the complete disc or to certain scenes on the disc. These scenes are rated from 1 to 8, and alternatively, more suitable scenes are available for selection on some discs. Ratings are country-dependent. The Parental Control feature allows you to prevent discs from being played by your children or to have certain discs played with alternative scenes.



- ¶ Select "Rating" on the Setup menu using ▲/▼.
- While "Rating" is selected, press ▶.
- When you have not entered a password yet.

  Enter a 4-digit password using the numerical buttons to create a personal 4-digit security password, then press SELECT/OK. Enter the 4-digit password again and press SELECT/OK to verify.

When you have already entered a password; Enter a 4-digit password using the numbered buttons to confirm the personal 4-digit security password, then press SELECT/OK.

If you make a mistake before pressing SELECT/OK, press CLEAR and enter 4-digit security password again.

Select a rating from 1 to 8 using ▲/▼. One (1) has the least playback restrictions. Eight (8) has the most playback restrictions.

**Unlock:** If you select Unlock, Parental Control is not active. The disc will play in full.

Ratings 1 to 8: Some discs contain scenes not suitable for children. If you set a rating for the DVD+VCR, all disc scenes with the same rating or lower will be played. Higher rated scenes will not be played unless an alternative scene is available on the disc. The alternative must have the same rating or a lower one. If no suitable alternative is found, playback will stop. You must enter the 4-digit password or change the rating level in order to play the disc.

Press SELECT/OK to confirm your rating selection, then press SETUP to exit the menu.

#### Country Code DVD

Enter the code of a country/area whose standards were used to rate the DVD video disc, referring to the list (See "Country Code List", page 38).



- Select Country Code using ▲/▼ on the setup menu.
- While Country Code is selected, press ▶.
- Follow step 3 of "Rating" on left.
- Select the first character using ▲/▼.
- 5 Shift the cursor using ◆▶ and select the second character using ▲▼.
- Press SELECT/OK to confirm your country code selection, then press SETUP to exit the menu.

### Note

Confirmation of the 4-digit password is necessary when the code is changed (see "Changing the 4-digit code" below ).

#### Changing the 4-digit code

- 1 Follow Steps 1-2 as shown above to the left (Rating).
- 2 Enter the old code, then press SELECT/OK.
- 3 Select Change using the ▲/▼ buttons then press SELECT/OK.
- 4 Enter the new 4-digit code, then press SELECT/OK.
- 5 Enter exactly the same code a second time and verify by pressing SELECT/OK.
- 6 Press SETUP to exit the menu.

#### If you forget your 4-digit code

If you forget your password, to clear the current password, follow the procedure below.

- **1** Press SETUP to display the setup menu.
- 2 Use the Number buttons to enter the 6-digit number "210499".
  - The 4-digit password is cleared.
- 3 Enter a new code as shown above to the left (Rating).

### Playing a tape

You will only be able to load and eject video cassettes when your DVD+VCR is plugged into the mains. Your DVD+VCR may also play back recordings from NTSC tapes (on PAL TV).

#### Getting a better picture

When a cassette is inserted and playback started, the automatic tracking function works to get the best possible picture automatically. If the quality of the recording is poor, repeatedly press either **CH/TRK** ( $\triangle/\nabla$ ) on the remote control or **CHANNEL** (+/-) on the front panel to manually adjust the tracking until any distortions have been removed. Press numbered button  $\mathbf{0}$  on the remote control to switch automatic tracking back on again.

Make sure that you have correctly connected your DVD+VCR as described earlier in this book.

Turn on your TV.

Press **b/lto turn on your DVD+VCR.** 

Insert the video cassette into your DVD+VCR. The video cassette should have the window side facing up and the arrow facing away from you.

Press PLAY (►) to start playing your tape. If you load a video cassette which has had its record protection tab removed, playback of the cassette will start automatically.

#### **AUTO TRACKING**

Your DVD+VCR will automatically adjust the tracking to give the best picture quality.

Press PAUSE/STEP (II) to still a picture.

Press PAUSE/STEP (III) repeatedly to advance the tape frame by frame.

If you hold down **FORWARD**, the picture will be slowed down at about 1/19 times the normal playback.

Tapes can be paused for up to 5 minutes. After 5 minutes your DVD+VCR will stop the tape to prevent damage to the tape or your DVD+VCR . Still picture quality can be improved slightly by pressing **CH/TRK** ( $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ ) on the remote control.

■ Press PLAY (▷) to continue playing your tape.

#### Picture search:

During playback press either **FORWARD** or **BACK-WARD**. This will enable you to rapidly wind the tape (7 times normal playback) while seeing where you are on the tape.

#### Logic search:

During fast forward or rewind press and hold **FOR-WARD** or **BACKWARD**. The picture will be played back at 7 times normal playback speed.

# During playback or still picture press ◀ or ▶. You can reach the following playback speeds.

(-7xplay, -3xplay, -play, still, 1/19 slow, play, 2xplay, 7xplay)

To switch off the slow motion and shuttle, press the desired function.

During slow motion and shuttle, the noise bars may appear on the picture according to the status of tape.

If distortions can be seen in the picture, reduce them with CH/TRK ( $\triangle/\nabla$ ) on the remote control.

# Press STOP (■) to end playback. Press EJECT.

If the end of the tape is reached, your DVD+VCR will stop playback automatically, rewind, stop, eject the tape.

#### CM (Commercial Message) CUT:

When playing back tapes, this feature lets you skip through commercial breaks by fast-forwarding, and then resume normal playback.

While tape is playing press **CM-CUT** on the remote control to skip commercial (or other programme material).

Repeatedly press **CM-CUT** to skip:

The tape will fast forward picture search through 30 seconds of recording.



#### **DPC (Digital Picture Control):**

This feature automatically improves playback picture quality by adjusting your DVD+VCR to the condition of the tape.

¶ Press i.

Press ◀ or ► to select DPC and press OK.



Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to select: OFF, SOFT or SHARP.

Please note you may set DPC only when playing a tape.

Press i to remove the menus from the TV screen.

The DVD+VCR allows you to make recordings using a variety of simple methods:

**Quick Set Recording (QSR)**: Start recording immediately for a set period of time or until the video cassette runs out.

**VIDEO Plus+ System Recording** greatly simplifies entering the date, channel, start and end times of a Timer Recording.

**Timer Recording:** You may record at a later time (up to 1 month from the present). Up to 7 of these automatic recordings may be set.

The DVD+VCR incorporates Long Play (LP) which enables you to record up to twice the amount of time on a video cassette. For example an E-180 will record up to 180 minutes using Standard Play (SP); using LP you will be able to record up to 360 minutes. Please note there will be a slight loss in picture and sound quality when using LP.

### **Quick Set Recording (QSR)**

Make sure that you have correctly connected your DVD+VCR as described earlier in this book.

Press 6/1 to turn on your DVD+VCR.

Insert a video cassette with protection tab into your DVD+VCR.

The video cassette should have the window side facing up and the arrow facing away from you.

Press CH/TRK (▲/▼) to select the programme number you wish to record.

You may also directly select programme numbers using the **numerical buttons** on the remote control.

If you wish to record directly from either of the SCART sockets or AV INPUT sockets, repeatedly press AV until the socket you wish to record from is displayed.

**AV 1** for recording from EURO AV1 socket on the rear of your DVD+VCR.

**AV 2** for recording from EURO AV2 socket on the rear of your DVD+VCR.

**AV 3** for recording from AV INPUT sockets on the front of your DVD+VCR.

# Press SP/LP if you wish to record in Long Play or Standard Play.

SP will produce improved picture and sound quality, however LP will provide twice as much recording time as SP.

### Press REC (●) to start recording.

RECORD will appear on the TV screen.

Press **REC** several times. Each successive press will increase the record time by 30 minutes until you reach a maximum of 9 hours.

# Press PAUSE/STEP (II) to avoid recording unwanted scenes.

Press PAUSE/STEP (III) to continue recording. Tapes can be paused for up to 5 minutes; RECP will be displayed when a tape is paused. After 5 minutes your DVD+VCR will stop recording to prevent damaging the tape or your DVD+VCR.

# Press STOP (■) to end recording. Press EJECT (♠).

EJECT will appear on the TV screen for a few seconds.

### **Notes**

- If you do not wish to record on a tape (this can happen quite easily by accident!) remove the protection tab on the back edge of the video cassette.
- It is possible to record on a video cassette with the record protection tab removed by covering the hole with self adhesive tape.
- Remember you can record one programme while watching another by starting your instant recording, pressing TV/VCR to select TV mode and then selecting a different channel on your TV.
- If you press PAUSE/STEP (III) during QSR, the DVD+VCR will enter the record pause mode and QSR is cancelled.

### VIDEO Plus+® System recording

VIDEO Plus+ System greatly simplifies entering the date, channel, start and end times of a Timer recording by simply entering a PlusCode programming number. The PlusCode programming number is published in most TV guide magazines; they can vary from one to nine numbers in length.

PLEASE NOTE! VIDEO Plus+ System can only work successfully if TV channels have been tuned and stored in the order described on page 12 of this instruction manual.

Make sure that TV channels have been tuned and stored.

Insert a video cassette with protection tab into your DVD+VCR.

The video cassette should have the window side facing up and the arrow facing away from you.

Press VIDEO Plus+.



Press ▲ or ▼ to select the recording type.

**ONCE**: To record once.

**WEEKLY**: To record at the same time every week. **DAILY**: To record every day (except Saturday and Sunday) at the same time.



Press the numerical buttons to enter the PlusCode programming number of the TV programme that you wish to record.


If you make a mistake press ◀ then enter the revised number.



Fress OK.


The recording details of your programme will be displayed.

If PLEASE CHECK is displayed it means that you have entered the wrong PlusCode programming number, entered the PlusCode programming number incorrectly or the PlusCode programming number has been printed incorrectly in the TV guide. If "- -" is displayed in "PR", you have to enter the programme number of the station you want to record from.



- If you want to record from either of the SCART sockets or AV INPUT on the front, repeatedly press AV for the correct display (AV1, AV2 or AV3).
- Press ► and press ▲ or ▼ to switch PDC on or off.


If you are recording from stations that do not broadcast PDC switch PDC off! (\* symbol will disappear on the TV screen). Remember only certain stations transmit PDC.



Press ► to select the recording speed and press ▲ or ▼ if you wish to record in SP, IP or LP.

SP will produce improved picture and sound quality, however LP will provide twice as much recording time as SP.

Check that the timer event details are correct. Press i to save your settings.



If **PLEASE CHECK** is displayed, you have entered incorrect information and will need to re-enter the data.

Press i to remove the menus.
If you want to make other VIDEO Plus+ system recordings repeat stages 2 - 8.

Press <sup>⊙</sup>/ I to switch your unit Standby.

TIMER will appear in the DVD+VCR's display while your DVD+VCR waits to make the recording.

If you want to watch a DVD during timer recording, press TV/VCR on the remote control to select VCR mode.

#### **Intelligent LP Recording**

When you set the tape speed to "IP", the DVD+VCR automatically switches to LP mode to allow complete recording if there is not enough tape to record the entire programme while timer- recording in SP mode.

It is not possible to set the tape speed to "IP" with "VPS/PDC" set to "ON".

### Timer recording using On Screen

### **Display**

If you choose not to use **VIDEO Plus+ System Recording**, you can set timer recordings manually.
You may set up to seven timer record events within one month of the current date.

PLEASE NOTE! before setting the timer make sure that you have set the DVD+VCR clock correctly and you know which channels you have tuned to TV stations on your DVD+VCR.

In a stage 4, if you want to record from either of the SCART sockets or AV INPUT on the front, press AV.

Insert a video cassette with protection tab into your DVD+VCR.

The video cassette should have the window side facing up and the arrow facing away from you.

Press i.







· IP (Intelligent LP recording) on page 23.

Check that the timer event details are correct. Press  ${\bf i}$  to save your settings.



If **PLEASE CHECK** is displayed, you have entered incorrectly and will need to re-enter the data.

#### Press i to remove the menus.

If you want to make other timer recordings repeat stages 2 - 8.

Press ७/I to switch your DVD+VCR Standby.


TIMER will appear in the DVD+VCR's display while your DVD+VCR waits to make the recording.

#### If Timer record events Overlap...

Do not overlap programmes, since overlapping portions of the conflicting programmes will not be recorded. Earlier recording times have priority over later recording times as shown in the diagram.

#### Example:

Programme 1 will be recorded in its entirety, but only the last 30 minutes of Programme 2 will be recorded.



If two programmed timer recordings overlap at midnight 00:00 a.m., programme 2 will not be recorded.

#### Change (Deleting) the Timer Programme

If at a later date you wish to **delete** or **change** any of the settings in timer event memory you may do so without having to enter all the timer event information again. Simply display the timer event screen. Press  $\blacktriangle$  or  $\blacktriangledown$  to select the event that you wish to **delete** or **change**.

Press ◀ to delete the event...or

Press **OK** to change; then press **◄** or **▶** to select; Station, Date, Start and End times, PDC and LP. Press **▲** or **▼** to enter the correct information.

#### The Programme Delivery Control (PDC)

The Programme Delivery Control (PDC) adjusts the start and end times of a timer record event. This can be particularly useful with sports events which may run over into extra time. The PDC signal is transmitted by the broadcaster and this controls your video recorder's timer.

Currently only a limited number of TV companies transmit PDC signals.

Please make sure that when recording from channels that do not broadcast PDC that you turn PDC OFF.

### Playback Setup (DVD) (VCD2.0) (VCD1.1)

- Turn on the TV and select the video input source connected to the DVD+VCR.

When a title on a disc has more than one chapter or a disc has more than one track, you can move to another chapter/track as follows:





You may easily display the current time or tape counter and amount of tape left, day, month, year, day of week, programme channel, tape speed and operational mode of your DVD+VCR on the TV screen.

If a recording is taking place these On Screen Displays will not be recorded onto the tape.

### Press CLK/CNT to display.



Press CLK/CNT repeatedly to display the tape counter.

During playback or recording, the amount of tape left is displayed with the tape counter.

After 3 seconds the display will clear from the TV screen, leaving only the clock or tape counter and amount of tape left on the TV screen. Press CLK/CNT again to remove all displays from the TV screen.

The amount of tape left will only be accurate on E-180 and E-240 tapes.

The amount of tape left indicator may not be accurate, since it depends on the type and condition tape used. Also, the amount of tape left indicator is not displayed just after a cassette has been inserted, or after playback or recording has begun.

### **Tape Counter Memory Stop**

The **Digital Tape Counter** can be displayed on your TV screen instead of the time by pressing **CLK/CNT** on the remote control.

The Digital Tape Counter indicates the relative positions of recordings on the tape.

- Press CLK/CNT repeatedly until the counter is displayed on the TV screen.
- Press CLEAR to set the counter to 0:00:00.

  Press PLAY (▷) or start recording.

  The tape counter will display the actual play time in hours, minutes and seconds.
- Press STOP when playback or recording is complete.
- Press BACKWARD.

  The tape will rewind and automatically stop when the counter returns to 0:00:00.

### **Child Lock**

The control buttons on the front of the DVD+VCR can be switched off so that your DVD+VCR can only be operated using the remote control.

### Press LOCK.

will appear in the display window.

None of the buttons on the front of your DVD+VCR will work.

If any buttons on the front of your DVD+VCR are pressed **on** will flicker in the display for a few seconds.

Press LOCK again to switch off the child lock.

### Hi-Fi Stereo Sound System

Your DVD+VCR will record and play back Hi-Fi stereo sound. In addition it has a NICAM digital stereo sound decoder. This allows you to record and play back the sound in several different ways. Video cassettes recorded on your DVD+VCR will have a normal mono audio track and two VHS Hi-Fi stereo audio tracks. These stereo tracks allow you to make audio recordings in Hi-Fi stereo or bilingual mode from a TV broadcast, stereo audio system, video disc or another Hi-Fi VCR.

Your DVD+VCR's NICAM digital sound decoder allows you to enjoy broadcasts with NICAM sound, as well as standard stereo NICAM, bilingual and mono sound.

The particular type of sound received or that recorded will be briefly displayed on the TV screen for a couple of seconds:

#### **STEREO**

Sound is automatically recorded on the Hi-Fi stereo and mono tracks of the video tape.

#### **BIL NICAM**

Both audio channels will be recorded on the Hi-Fi stereo tracks. The primary language channel (left) will be recorded on the mono track of the video tape.

MONO

The sound is recorded on the Hi-Fi tracks and the mono track of the video tape without any separation.



**2** Press AUDIO repeatedly until the desired audio mode appears.

The choice is **STEREO**, **LEFT** (left channel), **RIGHT** (right channel) and **MONO**.

In **BIL NICAM** playback the primary language is output on the left channel and the secondary language is output simultaneously from the right channel when audio output is set to **STEREO**. The primary language will be output from both channels when the audio setting is **MONO**. Please note that when adjusting the tracking control Hi-Fi stereo sound may revert to **MONO**.

Press i to return to a TV picture.


### Note

If the quality of stereo sound being received is poor, the broadcast is automatically received in monaural with better quality.

Still, if the quality of the sound is poor, set NIC in the main menu to OFF (see p. 13). NICAM broadcasts will be detected.

### Widescreen Compatibility 16:9

Your DVD+VCR can record and play back widescreen aspect ratio programmes (16:9). To record a wide screen format programme successfully the correct type of widescreen signal must be broadcast by the TV station



- Press i and press ◀ or ► to select 16:9/4:3.
  Press OK.
- Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly to select : AUTO, 4:3 or 16:9.

#### AUTO:

Automatically plays back Widescreen programmes as Widescreen and Normal programmes as normal.

#### 4:3:

Only for playing back and recording Normal format recordings (4:3).

#### 16:9:

Only for playing back and recording Widescreen format recordings (16:9).

Press i to remove the menus.

### Note

To enjoy Widescreen playback you must connect your DVD+VCR to the TV using a SCART lead.

### **Additional Operation - DVD part**

### Video Mode Setting DVD VCD2.0 VCD1.1

- With certain discs, the playback picture may be flickering or Dot Crawl is shown on straight lines. That means Vertical interpolation or De-interlace is not perfectly matched with the disc. In this case, the picture quality may be improved by changing the video mode.
- To change the video mode, press and hold DISPLAY about 3 seconds during disc playback. The new video mode number selected is displayed on the TV screen. Check whether the video quality has improved. If not, repeat the above procedure until picture quality is improved.
- Video mode change sequence:
   MODE1 → MODE2 → MODE3 → MODE4 →
   MODE5 → MODE1
- If you turn off the the power, the video mode will be back to initial state (MODE1).

### **Notes on MP3 Discs**

#### About MP3

- An MP3 file is audio data compressed by using MPEG1, the audio layer-3 file-coding scheme. We call files that have the ".mp3" file extension "MP3 files".
- The player can not read an MP3 file that has a file extension other than ".mp3".
- The player can not read a fake MP3 file that has a file extension ".mp3".

# MP3 Disc compatibility with this player is limited as follows:

- 1. Sampling Frequency / only at 44.1kHz
- 2. Bit rate/ within 32 320kbps
- 3. CD-R physical format should be "ISO 9660"
- 4. If you record MP3 files using the software which cannot create a FILE SYSTEM, for example "Direct-CD" etc., it is impossible to playback MP3 files. We therefore recommend that you use "Easy-CD Creator", which creates an ISO9660 file system.
- A single session disc requires MP3 files in the first track. If there is no MP3 file in the 1st track, it cannot playback MP3 files. If you wish to playback MP3 files, format all the data in the disc or use a new one.
- File names should be named using 8 letters or less and must incorporate the ".mp3" extension e.g. "\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*.MP3".
- 7. Do not use special characters such as "\_?!><+\*}(`[@]:;\/.," etc.
- 8. Total number of files on the disc should be less than 200
- 9. Use 74-minute CD-R discs (650M), do not use 80-minute CD-R (700M) software.

This DVD player requires discs/recordings to meet certain technical standards in order to achieve optimal playback quality. Pre-recorded DVDs are automatically set to these standards. There are many different types of recordable disc formats (including CD-R containing MP3 files).

Customers should also note that permission is required in order to download MP3 files and music from the Internet. Our company has no right to grant such permission. Permission should always be sought from the copyright owner.

### **Special Recording**

### Copying from DVD To VCR

This unit allows you to copy the contents of a DVD to a VHS tape.

### **Note**

If the DVD you are attempting to copy is copy protected, you will not be able to copy the disc. It is not permitted to copy Macrovision encoded DVDs. "COPY PROTECTED DISC" appears on the TV screen.

- Insert Disc.
  - Insert the disc you wish to copy in the DVD deck and close the disc tray.
- Insert VHS Tape.
  Insert a blank VHS video tape into the VCR deck.
- Press PLAY (>) on the DVD deck.
  The DVD will go into play mode
  - If the DVD disc menu appears, you may need to press the PLAY () manually to begin copying.
- Press REC (●) on the VCR deck.
  The DVD+VCR will go into Record mode.
- Stop the Copy Process.

When the DVD is finished playing, press the VCR on the remote control and then press STOP (■) to end the copy.

You must stop the Copy process manually when the DVD movie ends, or the unit may replay and record over and over again.

### Recording from another video

### recorder

With the DVD+VCR you can make recordings from an external source, such as copying from another VCR or a camcorder.

### Note

In the following description, this DVD+VCR will be one used for recording and other VCR will be used for playback.

- VCR should be connected to the one of the SCART sockets on the rear panel of your DVD+VCR or the AV INPUT sockets on the front panel of your DVD+VCR.
- Press AV until the socket you wish to record from is displayed.

**AV1** Sound and Picture recording using the lower EURO AV1 socket on the back of your DVD+VCR. **AV2** Sound and Picture recording using the upper EURO AV2 socket on the back of your DVD+VCR. **AV3** Sound and Picture recording from **AV INPUT** sockets on the front of your DVD+VCR.

- Insert the recorded tape into VCR and a blank tape into DVD+VCR.
- To start recording, press REC (●) on DVD+VCR and press PLAY on VCR.
- When you want to finish copying, press the STOP (■) on both appliances.

#### **Video Head Cleaning**

Whenever a video cassette is inserted into or ejected from your DVD+VCR the video head is automatically cleaned. This should mean that additional head cleaning should not be necessary. However dirt accumulating on the head after a long period of time can cause the playback picture to become blurred or broken up. High quality video cassette tapes will not normally deposit dirt onto the video head, but old or damaged tapes might.
