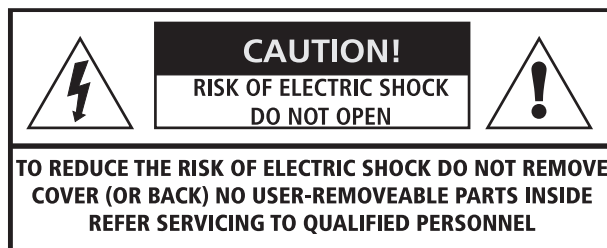

The player will accept the following formats (among others): DVD, DVD+R, DVD+RW, CD-DA, CD, CD-R, CD-RW, Picture CD.

The following formats are not acceptable:

DVD discs with other region codes. Improperly formatted CD-Rs or CD-RWs including discs which are not finalised.

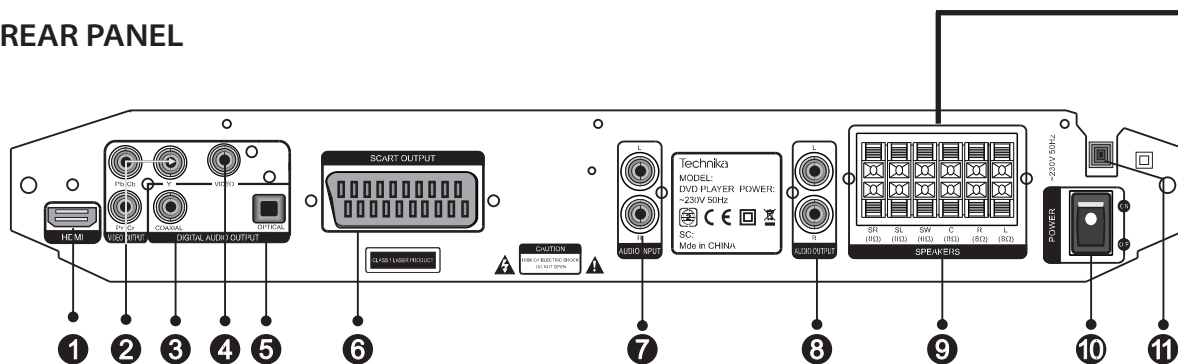

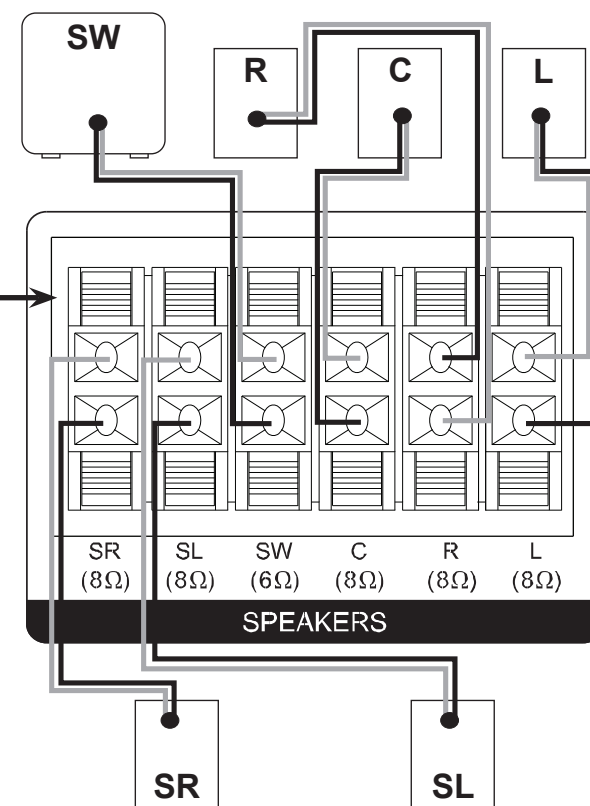
CONNECTING LOUDSPEAKERS

The loudspeaker terminal panel is colour coded for easy channel identification. The colours are:

- | | | | |

| White | Left (front) Channel | Red | Right (front) Channel |
| Green | Centre Channel | Mauve | Subwoofer |
| Blue | Surround Left Channel | Grey | Surround Right Channel |

All the speakers have captive cables with one black core and one with a RED stripe. Connect the **Red** striped cable to the upper loudspeaker (+) (coloured) terminal and the **Black** cable to the lower (-) terminal.

For best results it is essential to have all the speaker cables correctly connected.



To connect loudspeakers: Depress the terminal, insert the bare end of the cable into the terminal. Release the terminal. Make sure the terminal grips the wire and not the plastic insulation and check that there are no stray strands of wire protruding from the terminal.

SYSTEM CONNECTIONS

Please read the connection diagrams carefully before connecting your player.

Switch off all system units before making connections!

You will need to purchase suitable Audio/Video connection cables to connect your player to your TV.

If your TV has an HDMI socket, we suggest that you use this connection for superior picture and sound

REFER TO YOUR TV MANUAL FOR ASSISTANCE IF IN DOUBT.

VIDEO CONNECTIONS

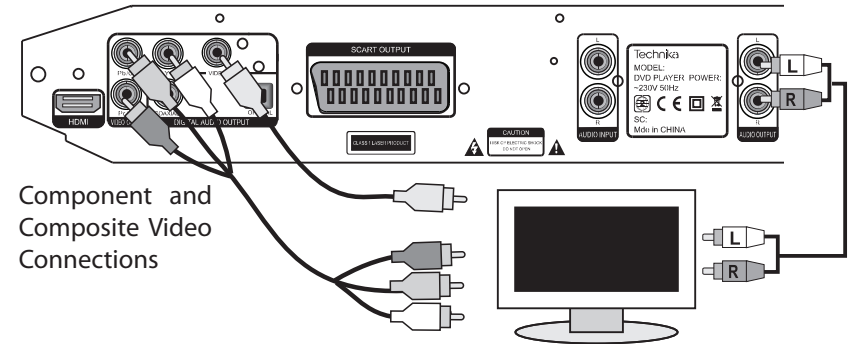
The SCART and Component Video connections are preferable to the Composite connection.

SCART: Connect the SCART cable from the TV to the player as shown. Scart connections carry Video and Audio signals so remember to turn off the volume on the TV set. You can connect a second cable from the analogue output of the player to a Stereo receiver for improved sound if you prefer.

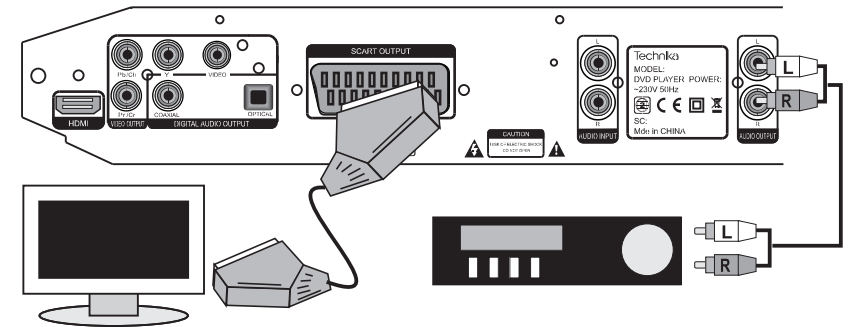
Component Video: You need a special 3 core RCA Video Phono cable. Connect the Cb/Cr/Y inputs on the TV to the corresponding sockets on the player.

Composite Video: Connect a single RCA Video Phono Cable from the Video Out socket of the player to the Video In socket on the TV.

For both component and composite connections you must connect the audio outputs of the player to the TV (or external audio unit).

SCART Connections

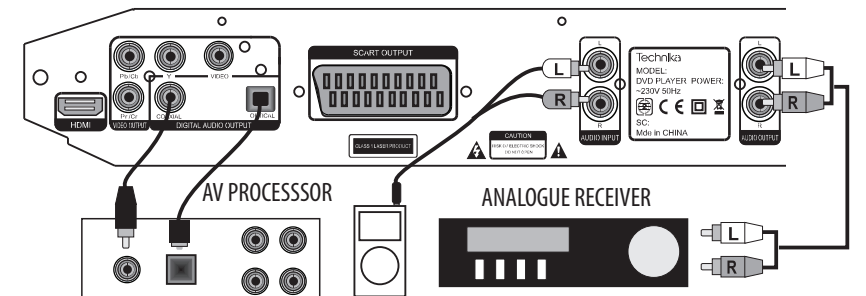
AUDIO INPUTS AND OUTPUTS

The LINE INPUT can be connected to the output of a stereo unit such as a cassette deck, MP3 player etc., with a stereo RCA phono cable.

The AUDIO OUTPUT is a variable line output. As the volume level of this output is controlled by the player, it is not suitable for connection to a recording unit. Connect this output to a power amplifier or a stereo amplifier and do not alter the level of the amplifier once connected.

The DIGITAL AUDIO coaxial or optical sockets can be connected with a digital RCA phono cable to a second AV processor, or a stereo amplifier equipped with a suitable digital coaxial input.

ONLY ONE output can be used at any one time.



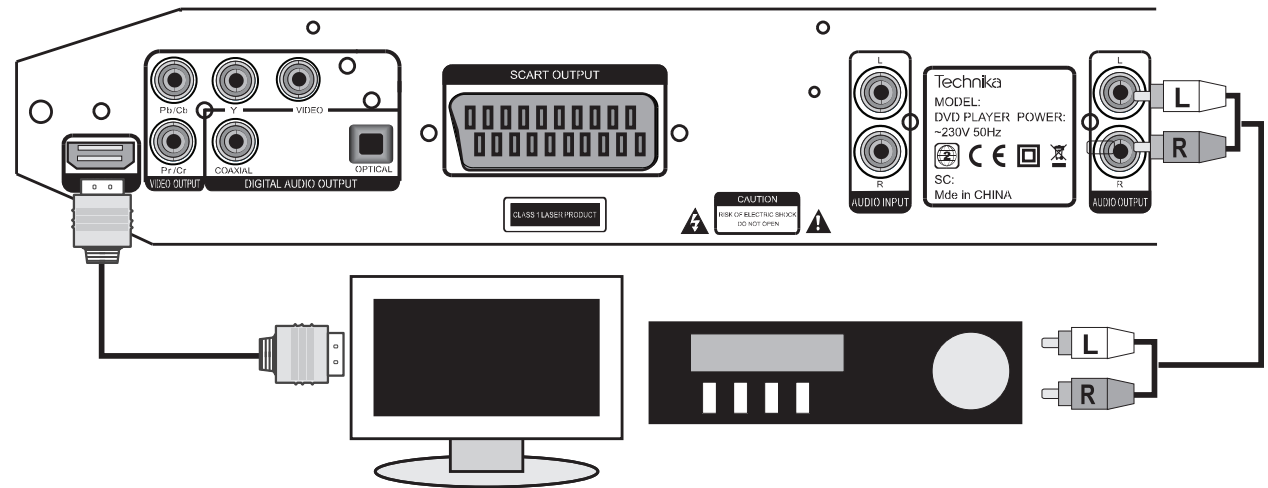
HDMI AUDIO/VIDEO CONNECTIONS

STANDARD HDMI CONNECTIONS

You will need to purchase an HDMI interconnect. Keep the interconnect short for maximum transfer quality. If you need a longer cable purchase an HDMI approved product.

Set the TV to the HDMI input (refer to your TV instructions for guidance). Audio and Video will now appear on the TV.

You can connect the analogue outputs of the DVD player to your stereo equipment if you wish Refer to the previous page for details.

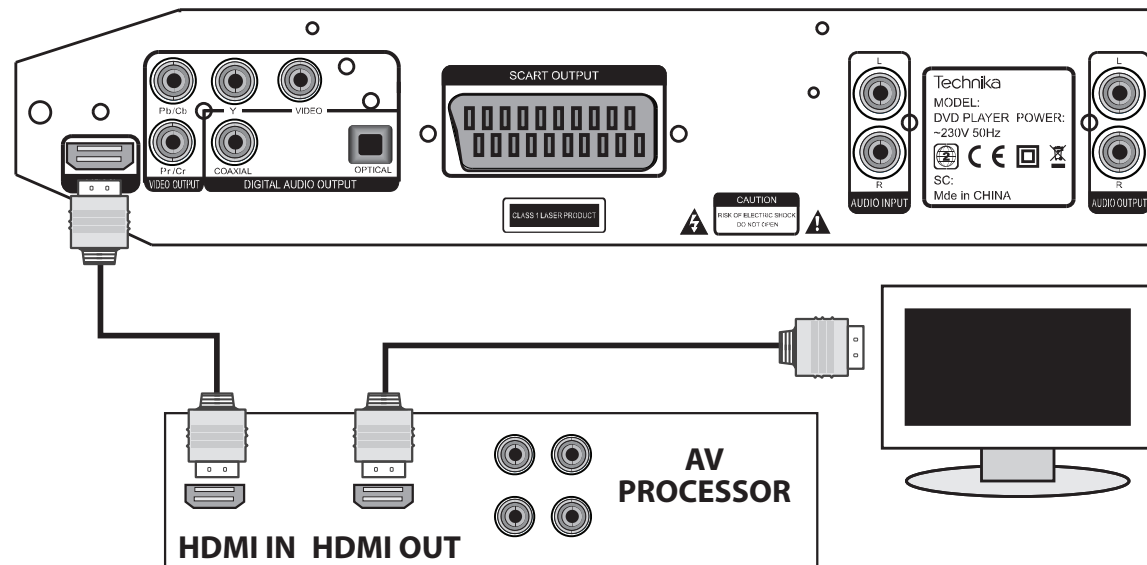


HDMI CONNECTIONS TO AN AV PROCESSOR

If you have an HDMI equipped multichannel AV processor you can enjoy the benefits of digital multichannel sound. You will need to purchase two HDMI interconnects.

Connect the output of the DVD player to an HDMI input of the processor. Connect the HDMI output of the processor to the HDMI input of the TV. If you wish you may be able to disable the sound from the TV (or set the volume to minimum).

Refer to the handbooks of your AV processor and TV for further information.



PRELIMINARIES

Unpack all the system components carefully.

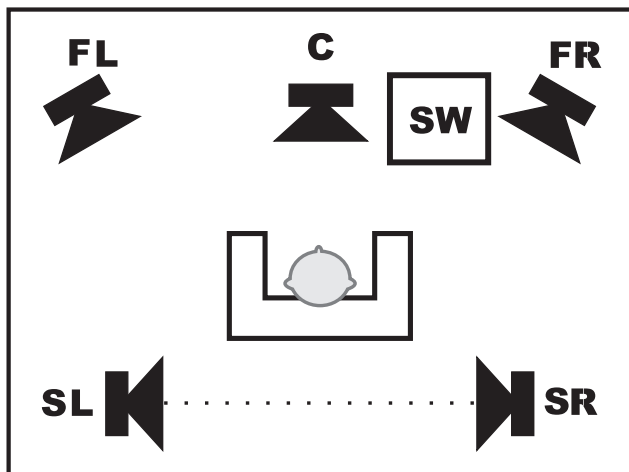
Place the player on a steady level surface where it cannot get knocked off or disturbed. DO NOT place objects or other items of equipment on the player - leave it freestanding.

The player ON/OFF switch must be easily accessible.

Unwrap all the loudspeaker connecting cables.

LOUDSPEAKER PLACEMENT

The illustration shows a typical 5.1 loudspeaker setup.



FL: Front Left Speaker

C: Centre Speaker

FR: Front Right Speaker

SW: Subwoofer

SR: Surround Right Speaker

SL: Surround Left Speaker

The **Front Speakers** should point slightly in toward the listening position.

The **Centre Speaker** should be mounted above or below the monitor screen central to the front speakers and the listening seat.

The **Surround loudspeakers** are less critical but ideally should face inward from a point somewhat behind the

listener's head.

As a general rule the **subwoofer** may be placed almost anywhere, but a position in front of the listener is preferred.

Placing the subwoofer across a corner will increase bass but the sound may be distorted.

Do not place the subwoofer where it is likely to be obscured by furniture or other objects.

The height of the satellites is important - ideally they should be at ear level or slightly above pointing down.

The satellites may be placed on shelves or stands or hung on the wall with suitable mounting hardware.

When you have placed the speakers they may be connected following the diagrams on Page 6. Please pay attention to all the notes below.

NOTES:

If you have a conventional (CRT) TV ensure all speakers are placed so that the magnets can cause colour aberrations in the TV. Flat (LCD) screens are unaffected.

NOTE: When connecting loudspeakers make sure that the cables do not trail across open floor spaces where they could cause danger. Protect them or route them out of harm's way. Ensure that the interconnecting cables can comfortably reach the loudspeaker connecting panel on the player and that the cables are not stretched taut.

IMPORTANT: The setup procedure assumes that the listening seat is midway between the Front loudspeakers. Different distances of the Centre and Surround loudspeakers and the Subwoofers from the listening seat can be compensated for during the adjustment procedure.

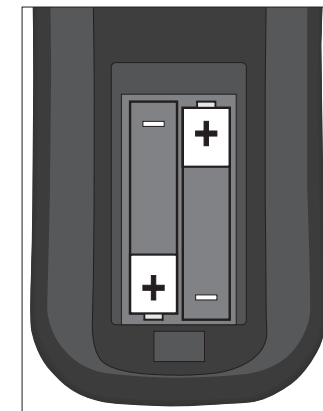
FITTING HANDSET BATTERIES

Invert the handset.

Lift off the battery cover

Place 2 AAA batteries in the battery compartment with their polarities as shown

Replace the battery cover.

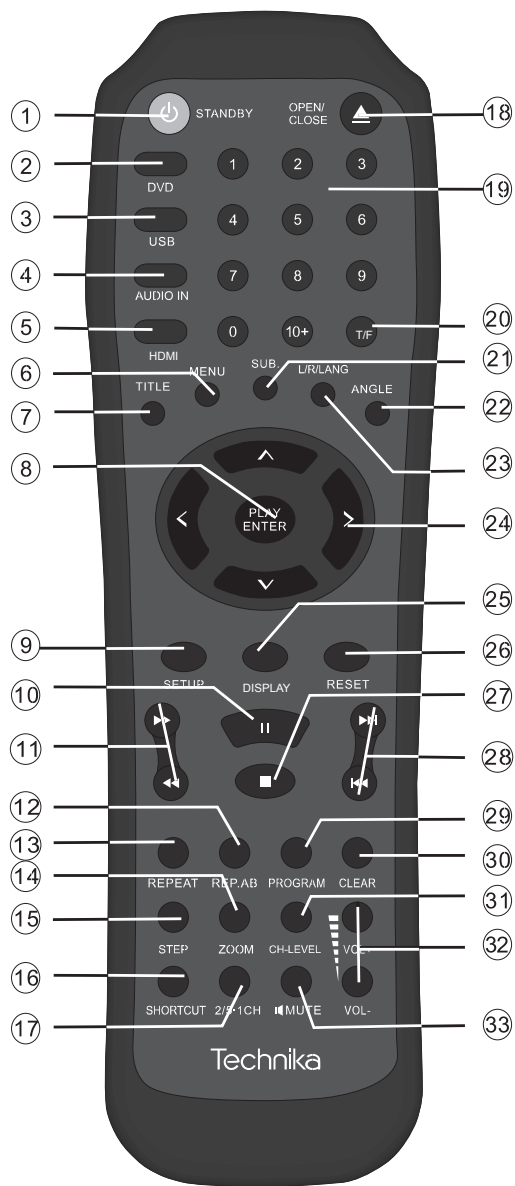


When the handset becomes erratic or ceases to work you should replace the batteries. The Cautions page contains guidance for battery replacement and disposal.

USING THE HANDSET

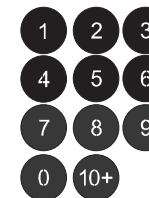
Point the handset directly at the remote sensor of the player. The handset must be no more than 8 metres from the player and at an angle of no more than 30° for reliable operation. If operation is erratic in bright sunlight, relocate the player to a shady location.

REMOTE HANDSET

To select a number between 0 and 9 just enter the number.

To select numbers from 10-19 (e.g. 12) press the 10+ key and then the number (2). To select a number between 20 and 29 press the 10+ key twice followed by the number, and so on.

PLAY/ENTER

Press to enter a selected item in the menu or to confirm and execute a selection.

GETTING STARTED

Make sure all system units are switched OFF.

Connect the player to your TV (and other units if required) following the instructions on the previous pages. Use only one video connection method.

Switch on the TV .

SWITCHING ON THE PLAYER

Plug the mains plug into the mains outlet

Switch on the power. The Standby light will go RED as the player enters Standby.

Press the **STANDBY** key on the player or the handset.

The player is now operational.

SETTING UP YOUR SYSTEM

After the player is switched on it is important that you adjust the system to suit your circumstances. In particular please pay attention to the loudspeaker setup.

THE PLAYER MENU STRUCTURE

The player setup menu is organised into five **main pages**. Each main page is composed of **sub-pages** and each sub-page may have one or more **menu items**.

ACCESSING THE SETUP MENU

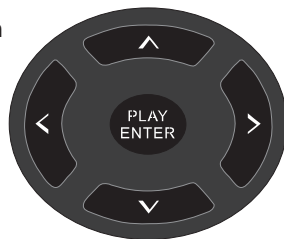
- Press the DVD key on the handset.
- Make sure there is no disc in the drawer.

This procedure will ensure that all parameters of the SETUP menu can be accessed. You can access SETUP during play but some menu screens will be unavailable.

NOTE: You can access the Setup menu when in USB mode. In AUDIO IN mode the Setup menu is inaccessible.

NAVIGATING THE SETUP PAGES

- Press the SETUP key to enter the Setup menu.
- Press ► or ◀ to take you to the next menu or return you to the previous one.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to take you up or down in the same menu list.
- Press PLAY/ENTER to confirm your selection.
- Press ◀ to exit the menu
- Press the SETUP key to exit the Setup menu.



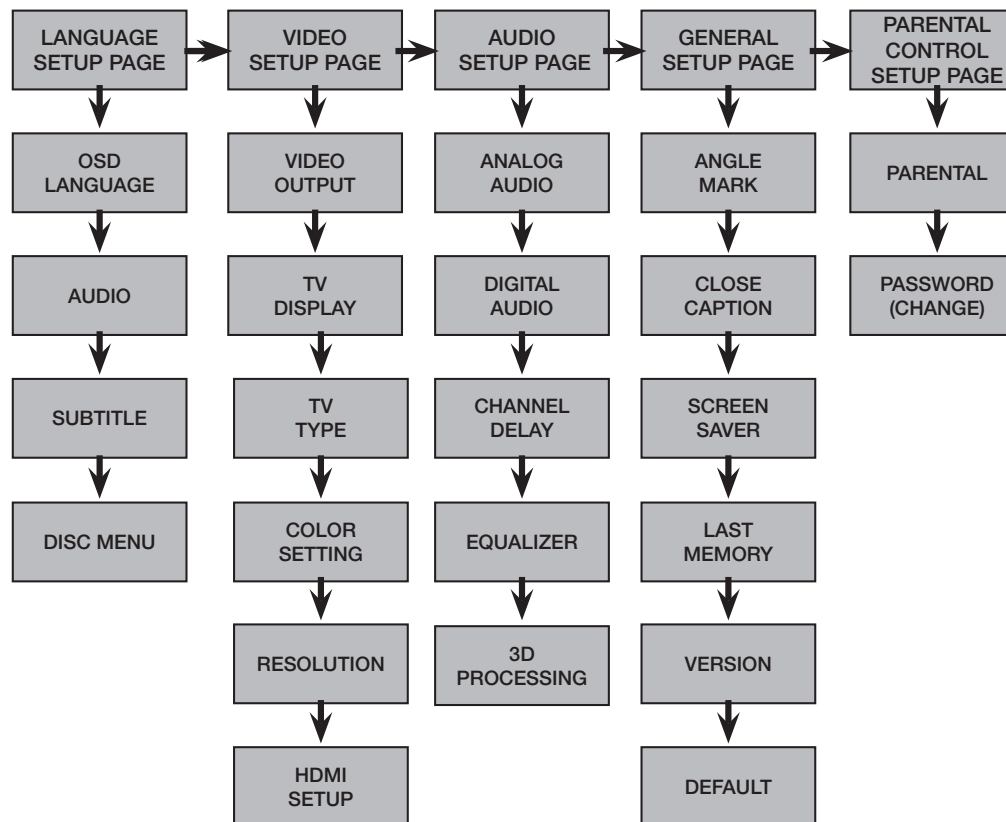
HOW THE MENU PAGES WORK

The selected menu and the choice within the menu are highlighted GREEN.

The current setting is highlighted BROWN.

To change a setting, move up or down the list until you reach the setting you want - the GREEN highlight will move to reflect your choice.

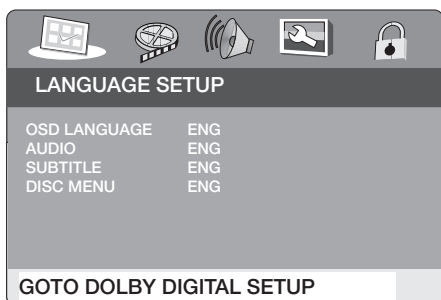

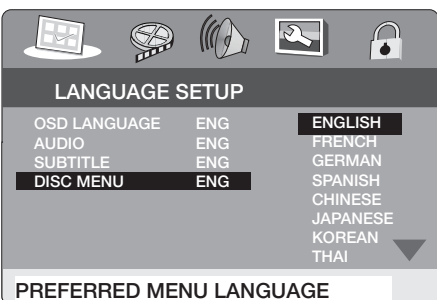
Normally **ENGLISH**. If there is a non English speaker in your house you may want to set the subtitles to that language. You may select **OFF** if you prefer not to see subtitles.

4:3 LETTERBOX: spreads the image full height but cuts the sides off on a standard TV.

Gamma correction improves colour resolution especially with fine colour differences but the effects are small and on many monitors will be barely noticeable.

LUMA DELAY

This is a phenomenon where the intensity appears at the right of the colour, marginally blurring the image.

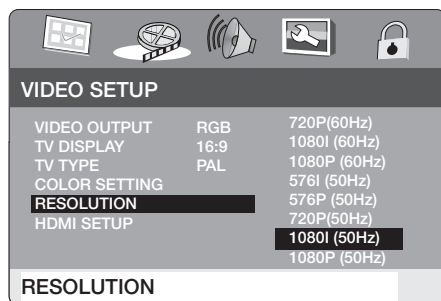

RESOLUTION

The resolution settings adjust the HDMI resolution settings and should be treated with care!! Read this section in conjunction with your TV or monitor handbook.

When the player is first connected to a monitor via the HDMI connection the two units “handshake” and establish the correct resolution. If you set this resolution higher than what the screen will handle you may lose the picture.

CALIBRATING SYSTEM VOLUME

Opening the Disc drawer automatically selects Disc Play Mode.

The disc will now load. Some formats take more time to load than others as the player has to download the Table of Contents (TOC).

DVD discs will display the **ROOT** or **TITLE** menu. In a few cases where there is only one title the disc may play. The **ROOT** menu is the basic menu of a DVD disc. This menu loads when you first insert a disc. To access this menu at other times, press the **MENU** key.

To access the **TITLE** menu, press the **TITLE** key. The **TITLE** menu shows the titles on the DVD disc. On many DVDs the **ROOT** and **TITLE** menus are the same. Each **TITLE** is divided into **CHAPTERS**. So you can play all, or any part of the disc you choose.

BASIC OPERATION

1) To play a DVD disc from the beginning

6) To Pause/Restart a disc during Play:

Press **||** to pause. Press **||** or **PLAY/ENTER** to resume.

7) Frame Advance

Repeatedly press **STEP**.

The film advances on frame at a time.

Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume normal play.

8) Zoom:

Press **ZOOM** repeatedly

The picture size changes 2X →3X→4X→1/2X →1/3X →1/4X →1X

When Zoom is greater than 1: use the **▲◀▶▼** keys to shift the zoom point.

9) To alter the volume:

Use the **VOL+/-** keys on the handset to alter volume from 0 (min) up to 50 (max).

10) To mute/unmute the volume:

Press the **MUTE** key on the handset.

11) Stopping the Disc

The **STOP ■** button has two modes.

When a disc is paused the laser is active. If the disc is paused for too long the surface may burn. A special stop mode is available which stops the laser and the disc but memorises the position. When **PLAY/ENTER** is next pressed the disc picks up where it left off.

Press **STOP ■** on the handset or the player.

Press **PLAY/ENTER** to play from the point at which **STOP** was pressed.

Press **STOP ■** twice.

The message 'Press **PLAY** Key to Continue' disappears and the disc is now stopped.

Press **PLAY/ENTER** to play the disc.

NOTE: If there is no activity i.e the disc is stopped or no disc is loaded, after a few minutes the screen saver will appear.

- Choose AUDIO with the ▲▼ keys. Press PLAY/ENTER to select.



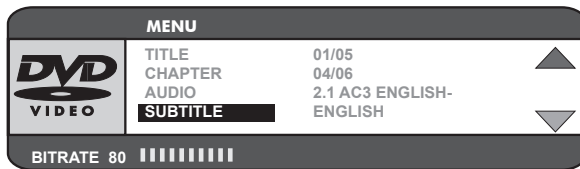
- Use the ▲▼ keys to select the parameter. Press PLAY/ENTER. The previous screen will display with the new setting



- Press T/F to exit the menu and return to full screen view. If you press T/F before you press ENTER the setup will not change.

SUBTITLE MENU (Subtitles must be enabled in the Setup menu)

- Navigate to SUBTITLE with the ▲▼ keys. Press PLAY/ENTER.



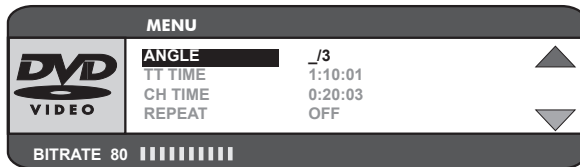
- Use the ▲▼ keys to select the parameter. Press ENTER.



- Press T/F to exit the menu and return to full screen view.

ANGLE MENU

Navigate to ANGLE with the ▲▼ keys. Press PLAY/ENTER.



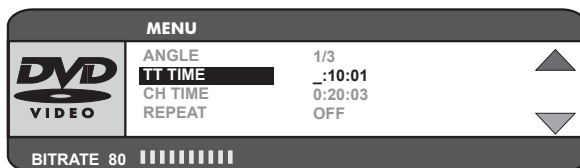
- Enter the angle number with the keypad. Press T/F to exit.

DIRECT SELECTION WITHIN A TRACK OR CHAPTER

The MENU screen displays the time of the title and chapter currently playing. The current title length is 1:10:01 and the chapter length is 0:20:03. If you choose a different Title/Chapter these times will change.

You can play a title or a chapter within the title from any point.

- Select the title or chapter you require (see previous instructions)
- Select TT TIME or CH TIME with the ▲▼ keys. Press PLAY/ENTER.



- Enter the time in H:MM:SS.

- To cancel an entry: Press the ◀ key

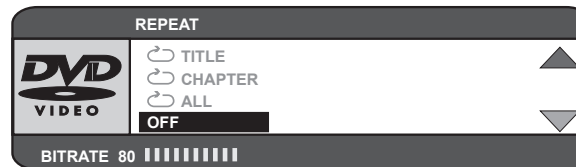
The display reverts to total time but the disc plays from the selected time.

REPEAT

- Navigate to REPEAT with the ▲▼ keys.

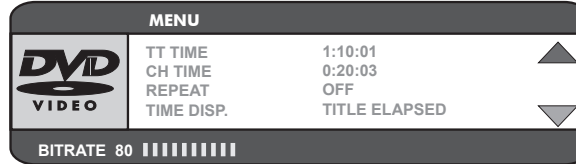

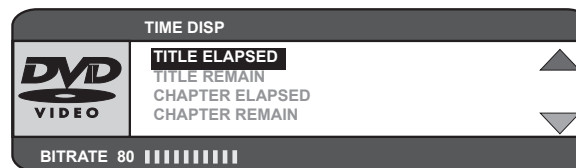

- Press T/F to exit.

LAST MEMORY

To enable Last Memory:

- At the point you wish to stop, press STOP ■.
- You will see the message "Press Play Key To Continue"

Do not press STOP ■ a second time, or switch the player off or load a different disc otherwise the player will lose its settings!

- Open the disc tray
- Remove the disc.
- Re-load the disc.

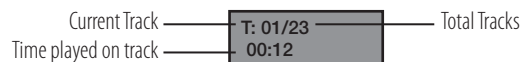
The disc will load and play from the point where you stopped. The words "Last Memory" will briefly appear on the screen "Last Memory" must be enabled in the System Menu - See P16

CHANGING THE AUDIO OUTPUT MODE

Press 2/5.1 to toggle between 5.1 and Stereo output.. In Stereo mode the centre and surround channels are disabled.

PLAYING AN AUDIO CD

Load an Audio CD into the player. The player reads the disc. Most CDs will start automatically - a very few won't. The player will display



1) To play a disc from the beginning when it is stopped:

Press **PLAY/ENTER**.

2) To change tracks when a disc is playing

- Press **NEXT** ►► to go forward one track at a time.
- Press **PREVIOUS** ◄◄ to go back one track at a time.

When you reach the final track:

- Press **PREVIOUS** ◄◄ to go back through the tracks.

3) Fast Forward / Reverse Playback

- Press ►► or ◄◄ repeatedly:

Speed increases/decreases 2X→4X→8X→16X→32X→Normal

- Pressing **PLAY/ENTER** will also restore normal play.

4) Pausing a disc

- Press **II**. The disc will pause
- Press **PLAY/ENTER** or **II** to resume normal play

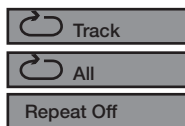
5) Stopping and Re-starting a Disc

- Press **STOP** ■
- Press **PLAY/ENTER** to resume play from the stopping point.

To completely stop a disc: Press Press **STOP** ■ twice.

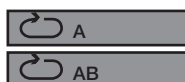
6) Repeat

- Press **REPEAT** once to repeat the track.
- Press **REPEAT** again to repeat all tracks.
- Press **REPEAT** again to cancel repeat.



7) A-B Repeat

- Press **A-B** to select the start point (A)
- Press **A-B** to select the end point (B)
- Press **A-B** to return to normal play



8) Display Indications

- Press the **DISPLAY** key once.

The time remaining on the track displays:



- Press the **DISPLAY** key again

The time elapsed on the disc displays:



- Press the **DISPLAY** key again

The time remaining on the disc displays:



- Press the **DISPLAY** key once more.

The display reverts to show the time elapsed on the track.



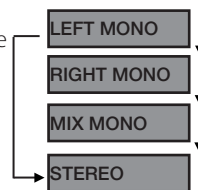
Note: When you stop a disc with the **STOP** key the currently selected display mode is retained in the player. If you now restart the disc this display mode will be re-instated. Opening and closing the disc drawer resets the display mode.

9) Program Play

You can program up to 20 tracks to play in any order. The procedure is the same as for a DVD. (see Page 19)

10) Mono/Stereo options

- Press **L/R/LANG** continuously to toggle the Sound mode as shown.



PLAYING A JPG DISC

Load a JPG disc into the player. The first picture will display after a brief period and then all the pictures will display in sequence as a slide show.

During the Slide Show

- Press **II** to pause and re-start the slide show
- Press ►◄ to rotate the picture 90° to the left or to the right. Each press rotates the picture 90°. While a picture is being rotated the slide show will pause. To resume the slide show, return the picture to its normal orientation

SELECTING PICTURES

- Press **STOP** ■ to stop the disc. The Picture List will display.



A JPG disc may contain pictures or may have one or more folders with pictures in the folders. The player ignores all folder structures. The contents of all the folders appear in one file list for easy viewing.

Use the ▲▼ keys to highlight a picture. Press **PLAY/ENTER**. The pictures display as a slide show starting with the selected picture.

OR Enter a number via the number keypad. All pictures will play as a slide show from that point.

REPEAT PLAY: Press **REPEAT** key to select the repeat options.

SINGLE: The player displays one image and then stops.

REPEAT ONE. The player repeats one image continuously.

REPEAT FOLDER: All images on the disc repeat continuously.

CANCEL REPEAT: All images play once and then the player stops.

Repeat status (except cancel) indicates at the top left of the screen.

Pressing **STOP** ■ will stop the disc but will not cancel repeat status.

Opening and closing the disc drawer resets the repeat status to the default (Cancel Repeat).

PLAYING MPEG-4, JPG, MP3 & WMA FILES

The MPEG-4 standard covers many proprietary formats. Some will play on this player, others will be recognised by the player but will not play (some AVI files with unsupported codecs). Some files such as WMV (Windows) and MOV (Apple Quicktime) files are not recognised. WMA (Windows Media Audio) files are playable.

A mixed media disc may contain several file types or may have several files in one or more folders with pictures in the folders. The player ignores all folder structures. The contents of all the folders appear in one file list for easy viewing.

- Load an Mpeg-4 /WMA/JPEG (mixed media) disc.

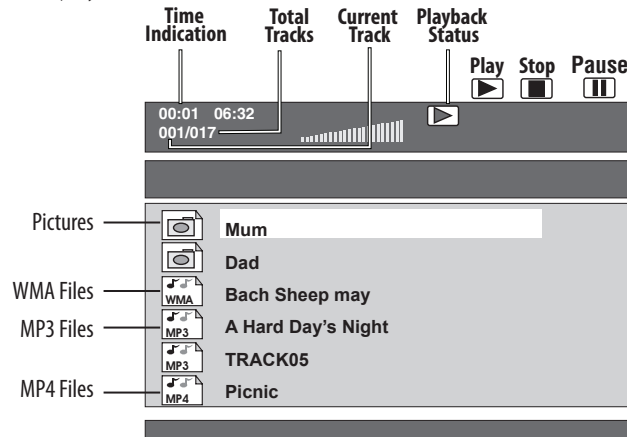
If there are picture images on the disc:

The player will immediately begin playing all files which contain pictures as a slideshow. The disc will then stop (depending on the Repeat mode selected).

If there are no picture images on the disc:

The player will immediately begin playing all files which contain music. After all the music files have played the disc will stop. (depending on the Repeat mode selected)

When the disc has stopped or **STOP** ■ is pressed the main menu will display:



To play a file:

- Press ▲▼ to select a track.
- Press PLAY/ENTER to start play.

If you have selected a music track: the track will play. All the other **music** tracks will then play after which the disc will stop. (This depends on the repeat mode)

If you have selected a jpg: Starting with the image selected all

the pictures play after which the disc stops. (This depends on the repeat mode)

REPEAT PLAY: Press REPEAT key to: select the repeat options

SINGLE: REPEAT ONE. REPEAT FOLDER: CANCEL REPEAT: Repeat status (except cancel) indicates at the top left of the screen.. (See Col. 1 for an explanation of repeat)

Press **STOP** ■ will stop the disc but will not cancel repeat status.

Opening and closing the disc drawer resets the repeat status to the default (Cancel Repeat).

Program play is unavailable for JPG or MP3 playback.

PLAYING MUSIC WHILE VIEWING IMAGES

The player can display images and play WMA files on the same disc. Load a mixed media disc.

- Press **STOP** ■ The main screen appears.
- Press ▲▼ to select a music track. The track can be in a folder or on the disc itself.
- Press **PLAY/ENTER**. The track will start playing.
- **Select a RepeatMode.** This affects the music and the slideshow. For example if you set "Folder Repeat" all the music in the selected music folder and all the images in the selected image folder will repeat continuously.
- Now navigate to the image you want to view.
- Press **PLAY/ENTER**. The slideshow will start with your music in the background.
- During the slideshow the rotate functions work.
- Pressing **II** will pause and play the slideshow but leave the music unaffected.

NOTE ON PLAYING JPG FILES

There is little point attempting to view JPG files larger than 1920 x 1080 pixels as the increased resolution will not be used and the loading times will slow down. Although the player will play quite large file sizes the loading times for such large files will be very slow.

PLAYING A USB DEVICE

You can play either a conventional USB flash drive or a memory card connected to a USB adaptor

- Connect a USB device to the USB input on the player.
- Press the USB key on the handset to activate the USB input.

In all other aspects, playing a USB device is identical to playing a mixed media disc and the same facilities are available.

Notes:

1. If you are using a USB extension cable keep it short - the cable should have a max. length of 500mm.
2. Depending on the amount of data and the speed of the media disc, it may take some time for the player to read the contents of the media device. In some cases, the reading time may be as long as 60 seconds. This is not a malfunction.
3. Even when they are in a supported format, some files may not play or display.

PLAYING AN AUXILIARY INPUT

- Press **AUDIO IN** to select the auxiliary audio input.
- If you are using an MP3 or personal player do not turn the volume up too high or you may cause distortion. Turn the level no more than two-thirds of the way up and control the volume from the Home Theatre System.

TROUBLESHOOTING

If your DVD player is not working properly use this guide before contacting Tesco. Before investigating a connection problem, always switch off the player and any connected units.

SYMPTOM	CORRECTIVE ACTION
No power	Is the mains connected?.
No Sound	Is the volume control turned up? Is the MUTE off?
No sound or picture	Check the system connections Cycle the video mode to restore the picture
Indistinct sound	One or more speakers is incorrectly connected. Connect all the speakers correctly.
Interference or scrolling	Copy protection on the disc. Avoid connecting to a recorder
Disc will not play Disc skips Disc Distorts	The DVD+-RW you played should be finalized. Ensure the disc is correctly inserted. Ensure the disc is free from scratches & marks. Insert a playable disc. (Check disc type and system). Is the disc Region 2? Cancel or change the parental lock level
No forward or reverse scan	Some discs prohibit rapid scanning or title and chapter skip. You can't advance through the opening credits and warning information at the beginning of movies.
Handset erratic or inoperative	Point the handset at the player not the screen! Flat handset battery. Handset too far from player or obstructed.
No surround or centre channels	Enable 5.1 operation/
FM is noisy	Retune the radio. Switch radio to mono.

AFTER USING YOUR PLAYER

- Remove any disc from the tray.
- Set the player to Standby.

CARE AND CLEANING

Occasionally wipe the player and the loudspeaker cabinets with a lint free duster. Never use liquids or solvents.

Loudspeaker grilles should be brushed by hand with a soft brush. Never use a vacuum cleaner to remove dust from loudspeaker grilles.

Use a proprietary disc cleaner to clean the disc compartment. If your discs skip or don't play properly, this is more likely to be caused by damage or dirt on the disc rather than any fault of the unit.

CARE OF DISCS

DVD discs are fragile. Treat them with care. Always store them upright in their packing; away from direct sunlight, heat and damp.

When handling discs, hold the disc's outer edge and/or the centre spindle hole. Do not touch the disc surface. Never bend or flex a disc.

Clean the disc surface with a soft, dry cloth. Wipe the disc surface gently, radially, from centre toward the outer edge. Never apply solvents to the surface of a disc.
