Electrical safety

- The set should be connected only to a mains supply which matches that stated on the label on the mains adaptor.
- To prevent overload, do not share the mains supply socket with too many other items of equipment.
- Do not place any connecting cables where they may be stepped on or tripped over.
- Do not place heavy items on the connecting cables.
- When unplugging from the mains supply, pull the plug, not the cable.
- During a thunderstorm, or when the set is not in use for a long period, disconnect the outdoor aerial and the mains adaptor.
- Do not allow water or moisture to enter the set or mains adaptor.
- Do not use the set in wet or moist areas such as bathrooms, steamy kitchens or near swimming pools.
- Pull the mains plug out immediately and seek professional help if:
 - the set doesn't work properly
 - the mains plug or cable is damaged

- liquid is spilt onto the set, or if it is accidentally exposed to water or moisture
- anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots
- Do not remove the cover. There are no userserviceable parts inside. You may invalidate the warranty. This product may be serviced only by qualified personnel.



Physical safety

- To avoid leakage, remove batteries from the remote control when they are exhausted or when not in use for a long period.
- Do not break open the batteries or dispose of them in a fire.
- Do not block the ventilation slots in the back cover. You may place the set in a cabinet, but ensure at least 5cm (2") of clearance all round.
- Do not tap or shake the TV screen.
- Do not drop the remote control.
- To clean, use a soft dry cloth. Do not use solvents or petrol based fluids. For stubborn stains, use a damp cloth with dilute detergent.



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


Insert the batteries

• Insert two AAA size batteries in the remote control, ensuring that the polarity is correct, as shown.



Connect the set

- Connect the aerial plug to the **RF** socket on the back of the set.
- Connect the mains adaptor cable to the DC-12V socket on the back of the set, then connect the mains cable between the adaptor and the mains supply. The indicator on the front of the set will show red.
- To switch on, press the POWER button on the top of the set, or aim the remote control at the indicator on the front of the set, and press the red POWER button. The indicator on the front of the set will show blue.



Tune the TV

The first time you switch on the set, you should see the Installation Guide screen:

- Use the

 and

 buttons on the remote control to select the correct Language.
- Press the ▼ button to highlight Auto Tuning, then press the OK button.



- Press the MENU button on the remote control. The CHANNEL menu is displayed.
- Press the ▼ button to highlight Auto Tuning, then press the OK button.

When you see the Auto Tuning box:


- Use the

 and

 buttons to select the correct Country. (Users in Eire should select 'UK', which uses the same TV bands.)
- Press the ▼ button to highlight Start, then press the OK button. The TV will automatically search for any digital and analog TV and radio stations that are available in your area. This may take several minutes.







If the stations are not in the order you would prefer, or if there are stations you do not want to watch, then see **Using the Channel menu** later in this User Guide, to find out how to edit the programme list.

Quick Start Guide - continued

Watch digital TV

- Press the SOURCE button on the remote control. Press the ▲ and ▼ buttons until DTV is highlighted, then press OK.
- Press the ■/EPG button on the remote control. Use the ▲, ▼ ◀ and ▶ buttons to select a programme from the electronic programme guide, press OK to preview it, then ▲/EXIT to watch it.
 - **OR** press the **PROGRAM**+ and **PROGRAM** buttons on the remote control until you see the programme that you want to watch.



Watch analogue TV

- Press the SOURCE button on the remote control. Press the ▲ and ▼ buttons until ATV is highlighted, then press OK.
- Press the numbered buttons (1), (2) etc on the remote control for the programme that you want to watch.
 - or press the PROGRAM+ and PROGRAM- buttons on the remote control until you see the programme that you want to watch.



• To view the subtitles on analogue TV – if any are available – select teletext page **888** (see **Using Teletext** later in this User Guide).

Watch a DVD

- Gently slide a disc into the slot on the left, making sure that the label is facing away from you.
- Use the ►II/TTX button on the remote control to play and pause viewing, and ▲/EXIT to eject the disc.
- Use the ▲, ▼ ◀ and ▶ and OK buttons to operate any menus recorded on the DVD.

Adjust the sound volume


• Press the **VOL+** and **VOL-** buttons to adjust the volume.

Turn the power off

- Switch the set to standby mode, by pressing the POWER button on the top of the set or the red
 POWER button on the remote control.
- If you will not be using the set for some time, unplug or turn off at the mains supply.



Connecting up



Use the Input Source menu to select which input signal to display:

- Press the **SOURCE** button.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select the input that you want to view
- Press the **OK** button to switch to that input.




CI Slot

 Insert a CAM loaded with a Smart card into the CI Slot, to view encrypted subscription channels. For more information about using the CI slot, see Using the Channel Menu.

Recording Freeview programmes

- Connect the TV aerial to the TV, and the Scart connector to the VCR.
- Set the VCR to record from the Scart socket (see your VCR instructions).
- Use the Electronic Programme Guide to select programmes for recording.





Auto Tuning

- Press **OK** to open the Auto Tuning submenu.

- Press the ▼ button to highlight Start, then press the OK button. The TV will automatically search for any digital and analog TV and radio stations that are available in your area. This may take several minutes.

DTV Manual Tuning

- Press OK to open the DTV Manual Tuning submenu.
- Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select a channel, checking that the signal strength meter shows at least normal signal strength.
- Press **OK** to start a station search.
- When the search is complete, select another channel and repeat, or press **MENU** to return to the Channel menu.

ATV Manual Tuning

- Press **OK** to open the ATV Manual Tuning submenu.
- Use the ▼ and ▲ buttons to highlight Storage to, then use the ◀ and ► buttons to select a station number.
- Highlight Current CH, and use the

 and
 buttons to select a starting point for the station search.
- Highlight Fine Tune, and use the

 and buttons to fine tune the station.
- Highlight **Skip** and set whether or not the station should be skipped.
 - Skip forces a station to be skipped when using CH+ and CH- to select a station.
- When you find a station, press the **RED** button to save the station, then go back to **Storage to** and repeat, or press **MENU** to return to the Channel menu.





Using the Channel Menu continued

Programme Edit

- Press **OK** to open the Programme edit submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select a station.
- Press the **Red** button to **Delete** a station.
 - **Delete** will appear next to the station name.
 - Press Menu if you do NOT want to delete the station.
 - Press **Delete** again to confirm that you DO want to delete the station.
- Press the Green button to Rename a station.

 - Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to adjust the character.
 - Press Menu to accept the new name.
- Press the Yellow button to Move a station.
 - Move will appear next to the station name.
 - Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to move the station to a different position in the list.
 - Press Menu again to confirm the new position.
- Press the Fav button to add a station to your Favourites list.

(see Using the Digital TV Controls.)

- Fav will appear next to the station name.
- Press the Fav button again to remove the station from your Favourites list.
- Press the **Blue** button to **Skip** a station.

Skip forces the station to be skipped when using the **PROGRAM**+ and **PROGRAM**- buttons to select a station.

- **Skip** will appear next to the station name.
- Press the Blue button again to undo the Skip.

CI Information

- Press OK The smart card information will be displayed if the smart card is already in the CAM card and this is, in turn, inserted within the CI slot.
- If the smart card is not inserted, then insert the smart card within the CAM card and the CAM card in the CI slot. The CAM card name information can not be found in the CI setting menu.
- Press **OK** to select the smart card menu.
- Press **MENU** to revert to the previous menu selection, or press EXIT to guit the menu.



CAM card user information


- Note that the CI slot can only be used to insert a CAM card, the Top Up TV program will play through the smart card in the CAM card.
- Note that the CAM card should only be operated within a temperature range of 1 to 55 degrees Celsius and a maximum humidity level of 95% (i.e. no condensation).
- Note that the CAM card should only be stored within a temperature range of -20 to 65 degrees Celsius and a maximum humidity level of 95% (i.e. no condensation).

CAM card installation

- Please confirm that the TV power is switched off.
- Insert the Top UP TV smart card intho the CAM cart as shown in the illustration at the foot of this page.
- Insert the CAM card into TV's CI slot.
- Please confirm that the CAM card has been inserted into the CI slot porperly before switching on the TV.
- You can now check the CAM and smart card information by selecting the CI setting menu. If the information is displayed then the cards have been successfully installed.

If you have problems viewing Top TV channels, reasons could be as below:


- The CAM card may not be suitable for the smart card please contact the supplier of the Top Up card/CAM card.
- You may not have paid for the channel, the payment maybe overdue, or the payment maybe awaiting authorisation please contact the supplier of the Top Up card.
- Either the smart card has not been inserted in the CAM card correctly, or the CAM card has not been inserted in the CI slot correctly please remove and try again.
- Either the CAM card or smart card are faulty or damaged please contact the supplier of the Top Up card/CAM card.
- Either the CI slot is damaged or is faulty contact the After Sales Support Help Line.




2. Insert CAM card containing smart card into TV CI socket.

buttons to select the from Standard, Movie, Personal or Dynamic.
 Depending on what you select here, some of the following settings will not be available.

Contrast, Brightness, Color, Sharpness and Hue

Color Temperature

• Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select from **Standard**, **Warm**, **Personal** or **Cold**.

Red, Green and Blue

Aspect Ratio

- Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select from Auto, Full, 4:3, Zoom1 or Zoom2.
 - Note: this will affect the size and shape of the picture, which may look unnatural if the aspect ratio is set incorrectly.

Noise Reduction

Use the

buttons to select from On or Off.

PC Setting (PC-RGB input only)

- Auto Adjust will automatically adjust the screen resolution to suit the incoming signal.
- Extra options are available to adjust Screen Position, Size, Phase and Colour.

 - This will even out differences between the sound levels from different stations.

• This shows the current date and time, which are automatically derived from the transmission signal.

Off Time

- Press **OK** to open the Off Time submenu.
- Use the ▼ and ▲ buttons to highlight Repeat, then use the ◀ and ► buttons to select from Once, Everyday, Mon~Fri, Mon~Sat, Sat~Sun, Sun or Off.



- Highlight Close and press OK to close the Off Time submenu.

On Time

- Press **OK** to open the On Time submenu.
- Use the ▼ and ▲ buttons to highlight Activate, then use the ◀ and ► buttons to select from Once, Everyday, Mon~Fri, Mon~Sat, Sat~Sun, Sun or Off.

- Highlight Mode and use the

- Highlight Close and press OK to close the On Time submenu.

Sleep Timer

- Use the

 and buttons to select from Off, 10, 20, 30, 60, 90, 120, 180, or 240mins.
 - The set will automatically switch off after the time you have selected.




Using the Lock Menu



• On entry to the Lock menu, you are prompted to enter the current password, using the number buttons.

The default password is 0 0 0 0.

You are advised to change this to a 4-digit number known only to yourself.



Change Password

- Press **OK** to open the **Set Password** submenu.
- Use the number buttons to enter a new 4-digit number.
- Enter the number a second time to confirm.

Block Program

- Press **OK** to open the **Block Program** submenu.
- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select a station to block.
- Press the GREEN button to block the station.
 - Press the GREEN button again to unblock the station.
- When you have blocked all the stations you want to block, press MENU to return to the Lock menu.

Parental Guidance

• Use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to select from Off, 4, 5, 6, ...etc... 16, 17, or 18.

Restore settings

Press the button to reset all the menu settings to their factory setting.

When the message 'Are you sure?' appears, use the ◀ and ▶ buttons to highlight Yes or No, then press OK.







Playing DVDs

 Gently slide a disc (12cm only - NOT 8cm) into the slot on the left, making sure that the label is facing away from you.

You can also play Audio CDs and view photographs in JPEG format on CD ROMs (see **Playing other Discs**, later in this User Guide).



Using the Basic DVD Controls

SOURCE

OTO/ASPECT

▲ EJECT:

Press once to eject the disc

PLAY/PAUSE:

Press once to pause.

The picture will remain, frozen, on screen.

Press again to resume playing from the same position

STOP:

- Press once to stop.
 - Press PLAY to resume playing from the same position.
- Press twice to stop completely.
 - Press PLAY to start playing from the opening menu recorded on the DVD.

SKIP TRACK:

Press once to skip to the previous or next track

NAVIGATION BUTTONS:

Use the ▲, ▼, ◀ and ▶ buttons to navigate any on-screen menus recorded on the DVD, and the **OK** button to make selections.

SETUP:

Display the DVD Setup menus (see **Using the DVD menus**)

SLOW PLAY:



Playing Audio CDs

- Gently slide a disc (12cm only NOT 8cm) into the slot on the left, making sure that the label is facing **away** from you.
- Use the same buttons as for playing DVDs:
 - PLAY/PAUSE
 - STOP
 - SKIP TRACK
 - . FAST PLAY
 - ▲ EJECT
- The information bar at the top of the screen will show information about the CD:



- Press the INFO button to select from Elapsed Time or Remaining Time.
- Use the REPEAT button to select from Repeat One, Repeat All, Play Single or Play Folder.

Playing Picture and MP3 CDs

- Gently slide a disc (12cm only NOT 8cm) into the slot on the left, making sure that the label is facing **away** from you.
- The display will show lists of the folders, pictures and MP3 audio tracks on the disk.



- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to move up and down the list.
- When a folder is highlighted, press the ▶ button button to open the folder.
- When a file name is highlighted, the picture will be displayed on the left, or the MP3 audio track will play.



 - Audio compression reduces the range of loudness in the sound:
 - FULL will reduce sound peaks the most.
 - 1/8 will reduce sound peaks the least.

TV TYPE

Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from PAL, AUTO or NTSC.

AUDIO

- Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from a list of available languages for the soundtrack.
 - If you choose a language that has not been supplied on the DVD, then the default language, English, will be used.

SUBTITLE

Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from a list of available languages for subtitles.

DISC MENU

Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from a list of available languages for menus.

PARENTAL

Use the ▲ and ▼ buttons to select from KIDSAFE, G, PG, PG 13, PGR, R, NC17 or ADULT.

PASSWORD

- Use the numbered buttons to enter or change the password.
 - If the password is not correct, then the lock will remain closed.
 - If the password is correct, then the lock will open.

DEFAULT

- NOTE: If you select this option, you will lose all the settings you have made.
- Press the **OK** buttons to restore all settings to their factory default.

Warranty

Three (3) Years Warranty

WHO IS COVERED?

A proof of purchase is required to receive warranty service. A sales receipt or other document showing original date of purchase is considered proof of purchase.

Warranty repair is three (3) years warranty coverage:

* Parts and labour are included under warranty repair.

WHAT IS NOT COVERED?

NOTE: If you don't have proof of purchase, then your unit will be considered out-of-warranty. Out-of-warranty repairs will be charged at a flat labour rate, including any necessary parts.

WHAT IS EXCLUDED?

Your warranty does not cover:

- * Labour charges for installation or setup of the product, adjustment of customer controls on the product, and installation or repair of antenna systems outside of the product.
